IDAHO'S BEANS

Approximately 100 Carloads
 Leave Here With Harvest
 Season's Crop Only About 20
 Per Cent Completed.

With only about 20 per cent of the Twin Falls county's bean crop harvested, according to estimates made here Friday about 100 carloads of the crop are expected to be shipped to markets throughout eastern, southern and middle western states.

Accumulations of beans in local warehouses generally are not as great as the corresponding time of year because of the weather of the past year. This year, however, the crop is expected to be better than last year's and the harvest is well under way and units which have been sold under contract for \$1.25 per bushel are accumulating in great quantities on local warehouse floors.

Yields of beans on the larger fields of Twin Falls county are reported to range around 200 bushels per acre, while some small fields are said to have yielded as high as 300 bushels per acre.

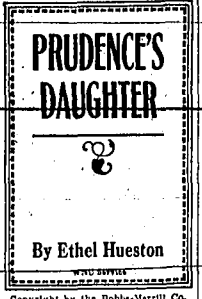

GENERAL WANTS CHINA TO FIGHT

Nation Should Take the Field Against Britain, "Christian" Commander Says.

KAIJANG, Province of Chihli, Oct. 2 (AP)—The Chinese take this as a signal Great Britain will not use force in her power in defense of her rights, Marshal Feng Yu Hsiang, the "Christian general," told a correspondent of the Associated Press, who called on him at his headquarters here. Even with the knowledge that opposition to British aid by force of arms would result in defeat, Marshal Feng declared it his belief that it was his duty and that of every Chinese man to make any sacrifice necessary in the name of his country, on an invitation to the world of Chinese Christians.

Condensed Conference

The "Christian general" said he could see no good that could accrue to China from the forthcoming customs conference. "I stand for tariff autonomy," he said, "and nothing less, in my opinion will satisfy the present day aspirations of the Chinese people." He added that he took no stock in the powers' reply to China's request for revision of the so-called unequal treaties, and that he considered the reply a subterfuge behind which the interested nations might hide in an effort to perpetuate the existing system.

"We talk about China's ability to protect foreigners when foreigners are slugging down unarmed and innocent Chinese in China," he exclaimed. "When have the Chinese ever persecuted such an atrocity against foreigners?"

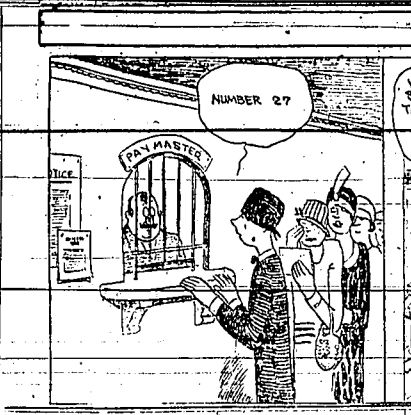
