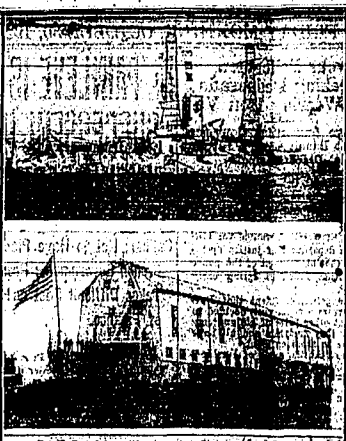

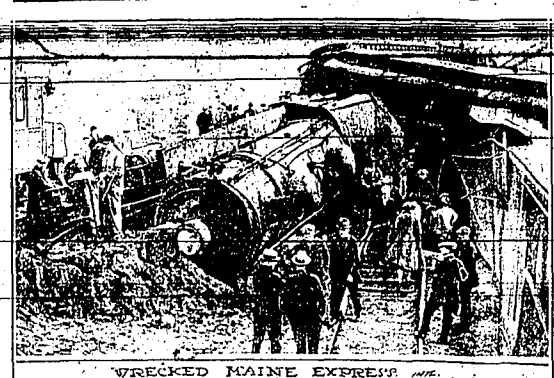

INDIANA MURDER TRIAL UNDER WAY

Dying Statement of Girl Three Are Accused of Murdering Admitted in Evidence.

NOTESVILLE, Ind., Oct. 29. (AP)—About the entire substance of the dying declaration alleged to have been made by Magie Oberholzer was admitted in evidence at the trial of Dr. C. C. Stephenson, Earl Klueck and Earl Gage for first degree murder in connection with her death.

Recalled to the jury of Miss Oberholzer's story of her alleged abduction and the attack by the defendants and her subsequent effort to escape came from Dr. J. R. Kingdon's attending physician, over the contents of defense counsel.

Defense objections, which were made known throughout the day, reached a climax during the testimony of Magie Oberholzer, the girl's father, finally Judge W. M. Sparks overruled a ruling on the validity of some of the testimony and permitted defense counsel to present arguments to prove error in regard to the state of mind of the defendant.

The admissibility of testimony by Oberholzer, and Dr. Kingdon's testimony, the defense, and, especially, particularly in Oberholzer's testimony that his daughter said after she had been returned to her home and knew he would be doing.
