### MITCHELL PLANS NEW DEFENSE IN COURT MARTIAL

#### Counsel Considers Move to Summon President Coolidge As Witness in Air Controversy at Washington.

(By the Associated Press.)

COLUMBIA, Oct. 31.—The court martial trial of Colonel Mitchell will have a new twist, according to the defense counsel. It is reported that Colonel Mitchell has engaged a prominent lawyer to represent him and that the lawyer has advised his client that it is his duty to subpoena President Coolidge as a witness in the trial.

The defense counsel, who is known only as 'C', is reported to be in Washington, D.C., and is in communication with Mitchell's lawyer.

### Mexican Shooting at Paul Over Woman End in Death of One

#### Jack Raynes in Jail and John Payne in Hospital at Burley With No Chance to Recover.

BURLEY, Oct. 31.—John Hayes, 30, Mexican resident of this county for several years, who was the first to shoot at Paul Over, a woman, at Paul, Idaho, on Friday night, ended in the death of one of the victims.

Paul Over, a woman, was shot through the right side of the chest and died at the Paul hospital on Saturday morning.

Jack Raynes, who was with Over at the time of the shooting, was arrested and taken to the Burley jail.

John Payne, who was also present, was shot through the chest and is in the hospital at Burley, where he is in a critical condition.

The French artillery fired a total of 10,000 shells into the city, destroying a large portion of the old city.

The produce men argue that the increase would be a hardship on them, especially since the cost of production has fallen.

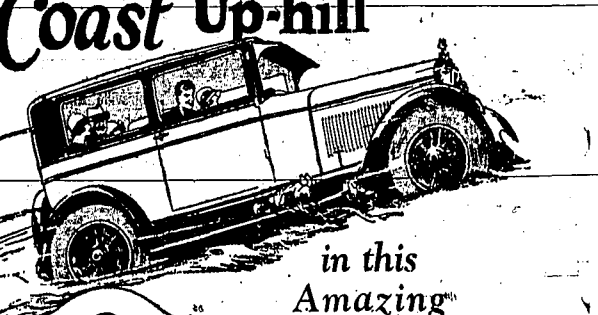

YALE DEFEATS ARMY ELEVEN, SCORE 28 TO 7

Undeclared Soldiers Forced to Bow to University in Tough Game Played at New Haven Saturday.

(By the Associated Press.) NEW HAVEN, Conn., Oct. 31.—Yale overcame the most formidable opponent it has ever met in its history today, 28 to 7. An undeclared soldier and erratic behavior of the Army broke controlled largely to the downfall of the future lieutenant.

Four times Yale elated engraved their impact on the territory behind the Army goal posts while only once was the Yale able to generate enough kick to plant the ball behind the Yale goal. 
**DISMISSED TO TAKE COSTS MAY 250 DAYS IN JAIL**

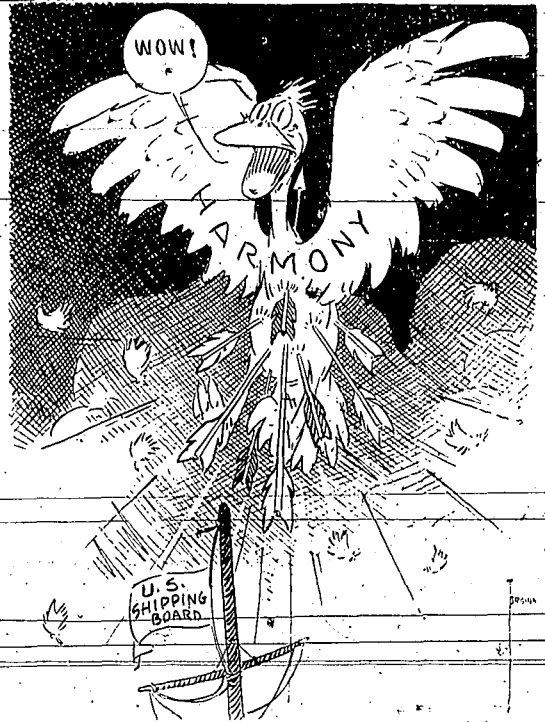
