

GOVERNOR WILL TAKE STEPS TO MODIFY DRY ACT

Successful Candidates for Chief Executive of New Jersey Would Repeal Part of Dry Law Now in Force.

(See Associated Press)
NEWARK, N. J., Nov. 4. (AP)—Successful in his bid to become the chief executive of New Jersey as an avowed "wet," A. Harry Moore, democrat, of Jersey City, is going to try to have congress modify the Volstead act.

Moore yesterday defeated State Senator Arthur Whitney, republican, who stood for enforcement of the Volstead act and the state enforcement act.

Moore, with virtually complete returns tabulated, had a total of 42,152. The next was Moore 41,629; Whitney 40,677.

When the returns were in Moore said:

"I propose immediately after my inauguration to initiate a bill to urge congress to modify the Volstead act so as to permit the manufacture and sale of beer and lagers."

Six Months Coming.

The campaign extended over six months. The wet and dry issue underlay the election of the National League under Stephen Whittemore.

Moore's election in a state which last year gave President Coolidge a plurality of 40,000 was seen as a triumph for the drys by Mayor Frank Hague, head of the Hudson neutrals democratic organization and a vice-chairman of the national democratic committee. Hague, Hudson county Commissioner Moore, and the enormous plurality of 4,600 votes that gave him the election.

The new senator, a plucky young man of 31, whom Moore, who won the republican nomination as an anti-bonus candidate against a candidate favored by Senator Edgar, and son of a Hudson neutrals Coolidgean, after being nominated.

CREDIT

A Twin Falls institution which is going for tourists filling a long felt want in this and adjoining communities is the Twin Falls Retail Credit Men's Association.

By means of this organization it is proposed to serve notice upon all and sundry that goods should not be purchased on credit unless the purchaser expects to pay for them. Its activities should not be regarded as reflecting upon the business and

integrity of anyone, yet there is no gainsaying the fact that in every community there are to be found people who trade upon the credulity of merchants and business men and obtain credit favors to which they are not entitled. There is no getting away from the fact that these credit losses constitute a charge against the cost of doing business, and this cost must eventually be recovered in the price charged to those who pay their bills. But debts are a part of the overhead expense of doing business and must be so reckoned. A Credit Association which can eliminate a part of these losses is performing a service in the benefits of which all share, and this is one of the reasons why such an institution should have general endorsement and support.

Another very good reason for it is in tends the value of credit to the thoughts persons who are in the habit of incurring debt without due and proper attention to the matter of debt settlement and still others who would be benefited if, that, happily small, composed of the members of the younger generation who are given to writing receipts without reference to existing balances and who sometimes go over farther in the matter of cheque passing. The lesson which the Credit Association teaches to those in vulnerable and many times results in an early and complete information of money habits.

Man is a whole is not dishonest, but often he is careless. The Credit Association would try to teach him that credit is something which never thrives if abused, but properly cared for constitutes an asset of which every person has a right to be proud. If the local Credit Association can put over this lesson alone it will have made a notable contribution.

THE LEAGUE'S CLUB

It seemed intolerable that war should break out in the Balkans again right on the heels of the League conference which promised so much for European peace.

Having an instrument at hand through which to act, the powers proceeded to use it with surprising celerity and force.

The League of Nations Council had authority from the Covenant to declare that the belligerents, in making unlawful war on each other, were in effect making war upon the other League members, and to order hostilities stopped, on penalty of trade and financial layouts and possible military action if they refused to obey.

It was hardly expected that the League would dare to make use of its full powers. Therefore, it had usually been build about sparring the hot boys of the family of nations. But this time the provocation was greater than usual, and the League, inspired by Lascaris, was more conscious of its power. So a bold ultimatum went to Greece and Bulgaria. And immediately, to the surprise of a large part of the world, both shied, Bulgaria had been willing to arbitrate. It was a victory over Greek militarism particularly.

Would the League really have punished them even to the extent of military operations, if they had disregarded its orders? It is well, everything considered, that the test was not made.

Failure to be congratulated on the apparent success of this one and the present is has established. And the world should be grateful. For the present success of the League is a good example not of the triumphs we

fore, but of the triumph of world opinion—which the League officials represented—to make nations keep the peace when they are already at each other's throats.

When the League swings a big

necking of world opinion, and with such barking, the League becomes more effective for good than outside observers have dared hope.

MEXICAN RUBBER

The Firestone Tire and Rubber Company, which recently arranged to spend a hundred million dollars in planting one million acres of Liberia rubber in Mexico, announces the issue of thirty five thousand notes of rubber land in Mexico, in the province of Tabasco. It has a large

force of men now at work there.

This is a hopeful and constructive contribution to the solution of the rubber problem. The British rubber monopoly still reigns, producing in the East Indies and holding prices to a high level. America is the largest user of rubber in the world. Without competition in this industry, the American motor industry would soon be crippled. It might cost a small fortune to equip the family car with tires.

There are many places in the world capable of producing rubber. It is mainly a question of opening new fields and organizing independent production on a big scale. American business men deserve credit for their prompt handling of the situation. More of them would do well to follow Mr. Firestone's example. And the longer the time between rubber supplies, the better. It is desirable to raise as much rubber as possible in Mexico, and the two countries could profitably cooperate in this matter.

MANY PROBLEMS FACE LEAGUE IN ALCOHOL FIGHT

General Counsel for Anti-Saloon Organization Submits Report at Biennial Session Under Way in Washington.

(By the Associated Press.)
WASHINGTON, Nov. 4.—Persevering problems and challenging opposition together with "confident, inspiring achievement" have marked the record of the legal and legislative work in the fight against alcohol during the past two years, Wayne B. Wheeler, general counsel of the anti-saloon League of America, declared in a report he submitted Thursday at the biennial session of that organization in Chicago.

"The wet has blazed back after leap in the prohibition law," reported Mr. Wheeler, "but we helped to stop them. We have given our aid to the adoption of new laws, the securing of court decisions and the support of administrative action in doing these things. It has been a small fight, but the fight has been less significant than the fact that we have moved up hill steadily."

Constructive Gain.

"No similar policy of government has ever shown a more continuous constructive gain. The active opposition to the law is significantly less now than it was when it first became law. Instead, it is a relentless defense of the freedom and the opposition of the majority that is testifying to the increased effectiveness of enforcement. It is the empty beer can and the dry deerant that sounds so loudly when it is hit."

We are winning all along the line. If we are winning, we must not leave no gaps which the whipped enemy can break through to attack us. In this, we will find the task and reward in the knowledge that the concentrated labors of 30 and many with victory."

Recounting the things that have won the battle, Mr. Wheeler said: "The longer that whatever additional legislation is necessary to make eighteenth amendment effective will be proposed with confidence that a majority of congress will adopt it."

Legislation Outlined.
Legislation to be urged by the congressional committee in listed as follows:

To place enforcement agents and officers under the civil service commission; to prohibit commercial advertising of beer; to prohibit the commercialized illegal liquor traffic.

For the deportation of aliens convicted of violating the prohibition or naturalization laws.

Mr. Wheeler served notice that the activity of the dry forces will not end with the seeking of legislation. There is the concentration against dry law officials. These have proposed to ignore public sentiment within communities in favor of local enforcement, leaving to the federal government the supervision of and controlling the import of alcohol and liquors, enforcing restrictions and revenue laws, diversion of alcohol and the like.

Desiring that every right of the dry forces be given, Mr. Wheeler warns that national and state organizations are mobilizing against the prohibition amendment. He adds that the League will still insist on strict vigilance, will keep positions such as repeat of the enforcement act and opposition to enactment of enforcement codes in such states as Maryland and New York.
