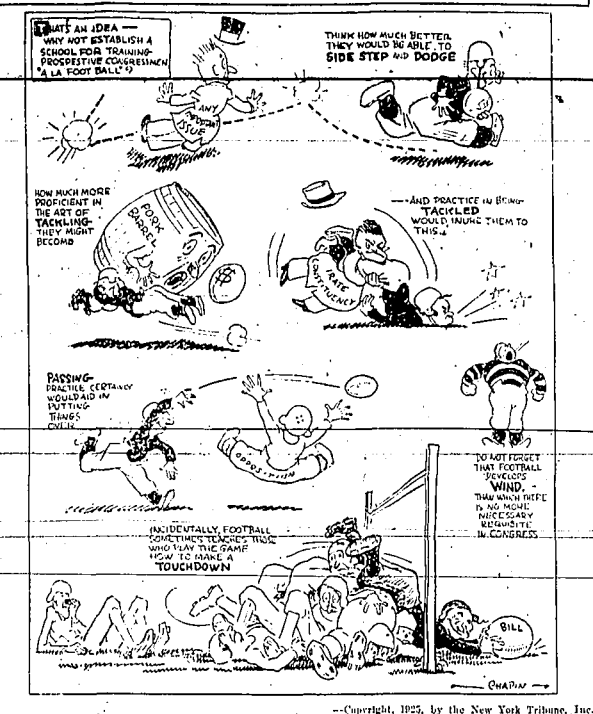

Breadstuff Advances on Chicago Market During Session Influenced by Liverpool.
