# POVERTY ROW IN MOVIES SHOWS A PROFIT, CLAIM

### More Than 50 Small Independent Companies at Hollywood; Many of Them Are Doing a Good Business.

(By the Associated Press)

HOLLYWOOD, Dec. 2.—More than 50 small independent movie companies are doing business in the city, it is claimed. Many of them are doing a good business.

Because in this section, where studios are quartered in cramped store rooms and small barn-like frame buildings, the producer of a picture must be known as "Poverty Row." But that classification frequently is a misnomer.

"Poverty Row" also is a two-way stepping stone for stars and directors. Here many of the great pictures of today started their careers. Here too, are employed many of the finest men who are at the head of popularity.

Whether past or present, the graduates of "Poverty Row" were included in a program of money, economy, and the keynote of production, for seldom does the cost of a feature picture, five reels in length, exceed \$75,000. The profits are unusually large, sometimes amounting to as much as 70 percent.

A relatively good \$7,000 picture may net as much as \$25,000, or if it is exceptionally good, it may command up to \$30,000.

Many of these companies fail, but there are always others to step into their shoes.

Because of the high cost of interior settings, the photoplays are mostly Westerns, filled with action and breathtaking thrills, taken with speed and scenery as their background. Very few of the productions are of subtle presentation.

Often players of good names, glad to pick up a few hundred dollars for a day's work between engagements at larger studios or on a day off, are obtained by the studios to work for one day, thus getting less money than the cost of a relatively small expense.

The scenes in which these players appear are all shot in one day.

Small casts are employed. The director often is versatile, writing, producing and directing a story. He often is the business man in the picture, and sometimes, if necessary, stars in the picture.

# FORMER KAISER MAY COME BACK

### German Finance Ministry Planning to Introduce Bill Giving Hohenzollern Estates.

BERLIN, Dec. 2 (AP)—Should William Hohenzollern return to Germany as a private citizen, he probably will find a beautiful castle set aside for him at Homburg-Van-der-Heide, near Frankfurt. This is one of the interesting provisions of the bill which the Prussian finance ministry has framed for introduction in the diet for final settlement of the Hohenzollern family's claims.

This bill, which the Hohenzollerns already have agreed to accept, provides for a cash payment of 30,000,000 marks (about \$7,500,000) and the restoration of three palaces and other property of the ex-royal family.

Under the Prussian government's bill, the crown prince Frederick William, will retain only his estate at Potsdam, in Berlin, with the valuable lands attached. But for him, his wife, children and grandchildren, the state proposes to set aside 1,000,000 marks near Potsdam. The state would retain the title to both Homburg and Cecilienhof.

### SOUTH DAKOTA G. O. P. OPPOSES WIDENING OF THE STATE INDUSTRIES

PERRIS, S. D., Dec. 2 (AP)—Republicans of South Dakota, meeting in state convention here today, opposed any extension of the state's participation in private industry.

Formulating the party's platform, the convention adopted a resolution opposing further widening of the state ownership of the public utilities. It also urged that the business interests engaged in should be handled efficiently and honestly.

Other resolutions adopted included endorsement of a world court of international justice, with United States participating under the League of Nations and approval of President Coolidge's administration.

The convention unanimously endorsed the administration of Governor Carl Anderson and supported him in asserting his candidacy as the permanent chairman of the convention in opposition to a man who had been defeated by Senator Lewis Norbeck.
