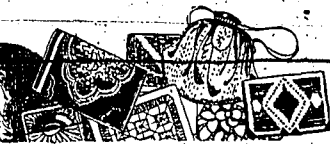

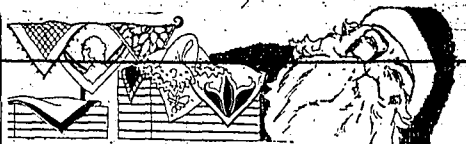

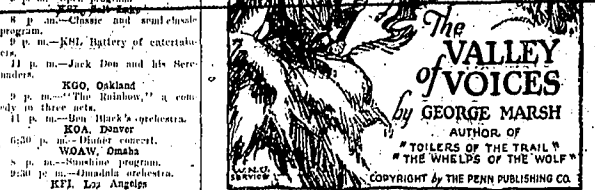

IRISH MEASURE GETS APPROVAL

House of Commons Passes Boundary Agreement in All Stages Without Division.

LONDON, Dec. 9.—Without waste of time and treating the bill as a practically "agreed" measure, the house of commons tonight unanimously passed the Irish bill giving effect to the new Irish boundary agreement in all stages without division.

There was little debate. After the prime minister Stanley Baldwin, explained the financial and political aspects of the agreement in an oratorical speech, J. J. Thomas, for the opposition, and H. A. L. Fisher, for the government, endorsed the premier's sentiments, while David D. Keir, in behalf of Ulster, Johns in the general discussion and expressed the conviction that the differences between the north and south had been irrevocably settled.

Shows Difference

In moving the second reading of the bill, Mr. Baldwin pointed out that the expressions of consent and good will embodied in the agreement would have been endangered had it not been for the agreement.

He admitted it was almost hopeless to look for an acceptable award from any boundary commission, but the boundary commission's work had been provisional, because without it, the agreement could not have been reached.

The prime minister justified the government's yielding article five, which made the free state responsible for part payment of the British national debt, on the ground that it was to England's interest to encourage prosperous Ireland to buy her manufactures and to prevent impoverished Irish agriculture from swelling the lists of England's unemployed.

In conclusion the premier emphasized that this was the first time in history that Ireland had agreed on the boundary, and it was agreed for the future.

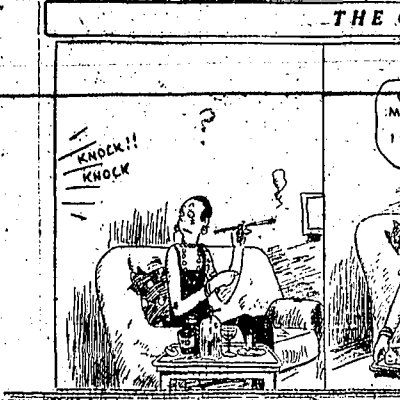
