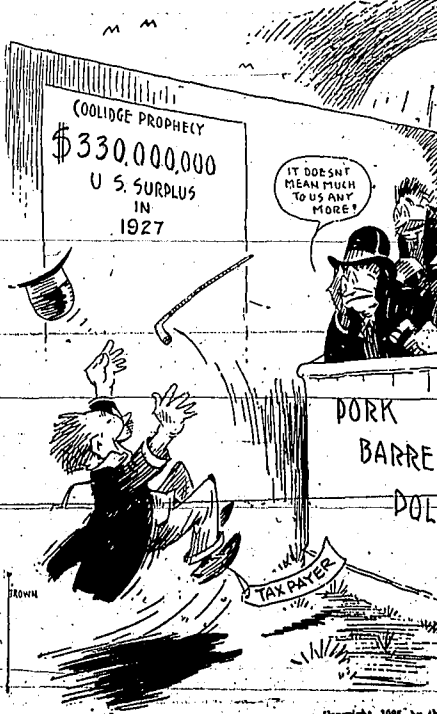

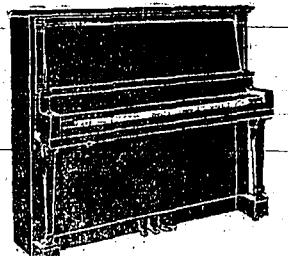

GREAT BRITAIN DOES NOT WANT NEAR EAST WAR

Trouble Over Decision of League in Awarding Mosul to British Will Cause No Trouble, Opinion of Official.

(By the Associated Press.)
 GENEVA, Dec. 16.—Neither the league of nations nor Great Britain experts were in the Near East because of the decision of the league council in the Mosul conflict, Colonel L. C. M. Amery, the British cabinet secretary, said tonight in commenting on the council's findings, which gives Mosul virtually in its entirety to Great Britain in the form of a mandate.

This decision was announced today in the assembly hall, packed with people, at the last of the fifty-two sessions of the council. It was marked by three notable declarations. The first, read by the Italian minister of foreign affairs, in the name of every member of the council, was deemed significant because it admitted that a state of tension had been created between Great Britain and Turkey over the publication of Mosul.

Sigheer Sebaha, an agent recommended that the two nations reach an amicable arrangement of the difficulty so as to nullify that peace which is essential to the aims of the league of nations.

The second was voiced by Sir Auston Chamberlain, British secretary for foreign affairs, who declared that the British government does not wish to adopt a rigid and uncompromising attitude. Great Britain desires to live on terms of peace and amity with Turkey and will gladly lend itself to conversations to determine whether it would be possible to improve relations between the two countries, he added.

The third declaration came from a deputation from three Turkish states who declined an invitation to attend the meetings. It was a vigorous protest against the council's action as well as a warning that Turkey absolutely refuses to abandon its sovereignty over Mosul until you give your consent that our rights in totality in Mosul remain intact.

Await Acceptance.
 The council's decision is contingent on Great Britain's acceptance of a twenty-five year mandate over Iraq, which included Mosul, within six months. This Great Britain has promised to do.

One point in the decision is the recognition that Great Britain accorded Mosul's desired local administrative rights. This Kurdish problem in Mosul is regarded as important. The Turkish spokesmen did highlight the council's decision is final. Do not forget that half the Kurds in Mosul favor England, the other half are strongly for Turkey. The Mosul report was adopted unanimously by the council, which based its decision on the report of the special Mosul commission and other information of a political and legal nature.

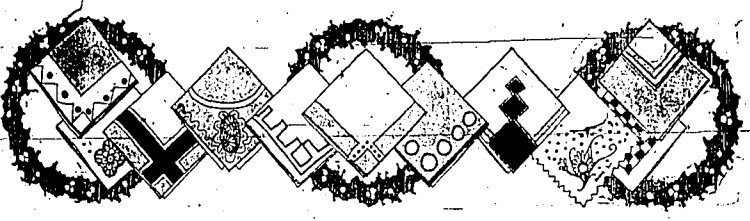

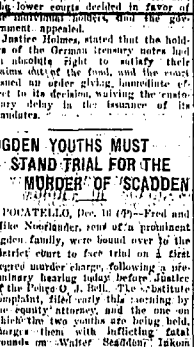

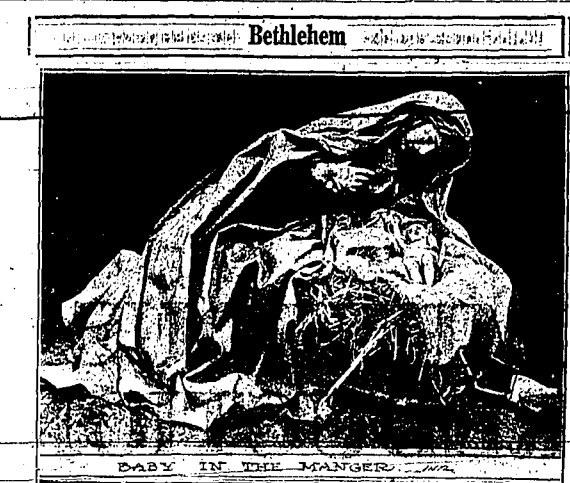

MACNIDER TELLS DEFENSE PLANS

Bitter Lesson Learned During War, Declares Assistant Secretary; Should Take Heed.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Dec. 16 (AP)—Industrial mobilization plans are "our present major effort" as a result of the "bitter lesson learned in the great war," Assistant Secretary Harold MacNider of the War Department, tonight declared at the Engineers club.

"We ought never everything in the national household in our soldier's wild fever," he said, adding that "even floundering to arm ourselves for doubting the barrier of our soldier's arm."

"The mobilization plans are more than a safety measure," Mr. MacNider said, they constitute a frank declaration that we must have peace.

"No man who ever served in battle wants to see war again," said the assistant secretary. "He is the real, the honest patriot. But he does not believe that, because the home town has just had the worst fire in his life, it is a good time to tear up his insurance policy and loot the weary fire department out of the country."

"What we all want is not a great army, but an expert militia; not a great mobilization of men or arms but just thought out, comprehensive and expert structure of emergency insurance plans."
