PLANT CHARGED IN ACCOUNTING SUIT

Utah Fuel Company Capital Stock Sold as Part of Plan to Freeze 'Out' Stockholders.

NEW YORK, Dec. 21. (AP)—Sale of the capital stock of the Utah Fuel Company, under the plan of the Denver and Rio Grande railroad, under a default judgment against the road in 1919, was a part of a plan to freeze out stockholders and turn the fuel concern over to the Missouri Pacific railroad for a "new lease."

The change was made by Gustavus Roberts, counsel for minority stockholders of the fuel concern, and the Denver and Rio Grande railroad, against the former directors of the road. His lawyer made his assertion after Otto H. Kahn of the banking firm of Kahn, Koch and Company, had testified that the stock of the Utah Fuel Company was a vital factor in the plan sent out in 1924 and that he had been working for the financial reorganization of the railroads.

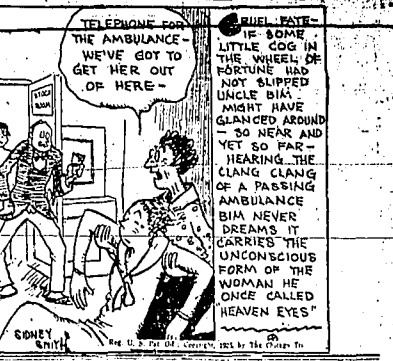
