## TWO HELD AT CALDWELL ON POSSESSION CHARGES

**CALDWELL**, Dec. 22.—Henry C. Penney, captured last week after a midnight chase by Sheriff O. V. Mason, was held yesterday without bond on a charge of possession of intoxicating liquor and paid \$250 and costs. He also paid costs on a transportation charge, the latter being imposed by the state on account of the sheriff.

H. O. Brown, who eluded Mason after an exciting chase, was brought to Caldwell Monday evening and arrested by the sheriff's deputies. He was held on \$300 bond. It is understood that he will plead guilty to a lesser charge, however, and has also asked the state to abate the transportation charge in view of the sheriff's own trouble.

## ALABAMA FAVORED IN GAME WITH WASHINGTON

**LOS ANGELES**, Dec. 22. (UPI)—Football wagers here are beginning to hint that Alabama inferiority may wash away the Hawks' Washington clout of the season, but it is too early to know.

The Hawks' back wall, Shubert, at half and Barnes and Gillis at half and quarter, are the best backs in football, which some of the observers regard with a shiver of the head when they commence to figure the Husky chances.

## RING BATTLES PLANNED

**NEW YORK**, Dec. 22 (UPI)—Fighters from all regions gathered here today to engage in inter-sectional ring battles at Madison Square Garden over night. Heavy weight, light heavyweight and flyweight, respectively, were the three divisions.

The fighters, who are mostly Wild Indians from Los Angeles, are on the card, which has been arranged to aid in the creation of fan interest in the Indians' home state. "All right," said Pauline, "you will be delighted—delight."

Sidell Friedman of Chicago will open with Harmon of New York in the semifinal.



## STUDENTS LEARNING TO FLY AT UNIVERSITY NIGHT SCHOOL

**MOSCOW**, Dec. 22 (UPI)—Russian priests are holding their long hair after the fashion of the American Indians, some of them are also dressing like Indians.

This is done for reasons of hygiene and convenience, but more particularly to render them attractive on the lecture hall stage.

For among orthodox priests a priest is looked upon with disdain. Formerly members of the Russian orthodox church were compelled to shave their heads, which were covered over their shoulders, giving them a patriarchal appearance. Many of them cultivated bushy beards, which rendered them unattractive to their flock.

Ever since the Soviet government separated the church from the state, large numbers of priests and bishops have been dressing like Americans in a greater school, studies through the winter.
