TWO CITIES OF EAST LEAD IN CHARITY CAUSE

Minneapolis and Cincinnati Subscribe Greatest Sums for Community Chest Work During the Year.

(By the Associated Press) KANSAS CITY, Dec. 25.—Of American cities which are giving increasing amounts to community chest work, the milk of human kindness gets to prevail not only in Minneapolis and Cincinnati, although there is a chance for divergence of opinion, as various thousands may be applied.

Minneapolis subscribed most per capita in 1925 to 150 community chest organizations from which the total voluntary gifts per capita to its community chest, \$10.12, has had the largest check pledge—\$1,285, 000—and Philadelphia, with pledges of \$5,200,175, ranked second.

Minneapolis subscribed \$2.31 per capita in the 1925 drive, based on the city population.

Minneapolis was devoured from public revenues and private sources a far greater sum from every citizen than any other city. It was only slightly behind with \$18,520, and Kansas City, Mo., third with \$12,500,000, and New York, N. Y., fourth with \$11,250,000.

Minneapolis, N. Y., followed Cincinnati in donations to the community chest budget, giving at the rate of \$1 per person. Cleveland was third, giving \$1.45, and San Francisco fourth with \$1.34.

The popularity of the community chest plan, which concentrates charitable campaigns into one grand campaign and gets it over, was illustrated by the increase in number of cities which have adopted it. In twelve months ending May 31, 1925, the association was 20 cities and the plan had been held there.

The amount raised by 200 community chest and welfare federations (the latter has only a slightly different meaning from the former) in the same period was reported at \$53,500,000.

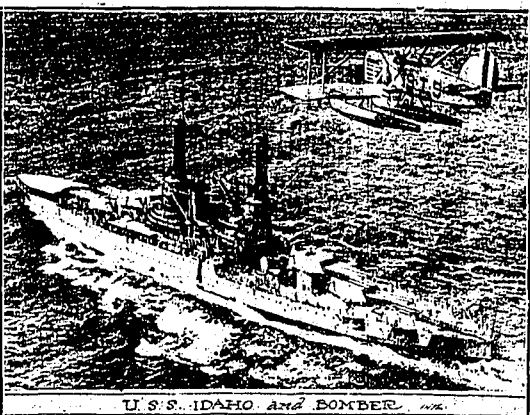
Behind the amount raised by the 20 new chests, there was an increase of \$1,100,000 in the amount raised by 100 over the amount raised in 1924, said the association. Eighty-one cities asked for more in 1924, 30 for less and 18 for the same.

The community chest, for the most part, are for approved charities with out reference to race or religion. Educational organizations is approached a share of the proceeds from an annual campaign for popular subscription.

She said she thought resident Doumergue also must be handsome in his solitary grandeur. "A wife is really what I need," she concluded, "as we might make an ideal pair."

FLAMES SHOOT OUT OF POOL

Much Attention Attracted by Mysterious Water Formation Near Seattle.

SEATTLE, Dec. 25.—(AP)—Flames which shoot high in the air from a pool of cold, salty water, in Great River canyon, 30 miles southeast of Seattle are attracting much attention.

Water in the pool, which is about 10 feet in diameter, sometimes sinks almost out of sight. Then it rises, troubled with the gas passing through it. If a lighted match is thrown in while it is turbulent, fire rises.

All times the eruptions are particularly violent, throwing out rocks and sending flames 100 feet high. At rare intervals the geyser fails to work at all. These variations have not been explained.

A short distance from the geyser, flames play for two weeks at a time over rocks which bulge up between rocks in a stream. Although the water in the geyser pool is salty, and contains many minerals, it is within ten feet of a perfectly fresh brook. Salt and iron water springs are found near by.

This phenomenon is near the bank of Green river, from which Tacoma gets its water supply. Although eruptions of "water that burns" had been reported by Indians and hunters, the place was inaccessible until a road was built in last year.

WAY TO CONCERT SUCCESS HARDER THAN FORMERLY

High Road to Fame for Artists Becomes More Difficult With Larger Field of Competition Is Claim.

(By the Associated Press.) NEW YORK, Dec. 25.—The road to success on the concert stage in the olden days was difficult, but it was even harder, more arduous, for ambitious artists than ever being cranked into disreputation.

Why, when I brought out Paul Robeson in London and New York, who was the first manager of the great artist, there were only 100 of 12 famous pianists in the world.

Then the artist must get into the hall to make his debut performance, which usually is given in New York, Boston and Chicago. On many of these occasions in New York, the hall is packed with persons, but the chances are the ticket will be sold out long before the artist, or a wealthy sponsor will be of assistance.

Concert managers here are in touch with managers and music organizations in hundreds of cities and towns throughout the country. When a new artist is being promoted, the artist is guaranteed a small fixed fee for each performance.

Major, who in addition to bringing out the new artist, is the manager of Melba, Yvonne, Davlow, Bauer, Elman and Glavens, does not mind the artist's own opinion, but as manager as having "made" an artist.
