LOS ANGELES, Cal., Dec. 26.—An iron pipe, bent and twisted, depicted the losing game of a probable champion—and then made of him one of the greatest trainers in the world.

The story concerns Gus Wilson. Along about the age of 14, Gus of the west coast, trained in the line-ups, the play was brilliant except for some fumbling upon receiving from the West.

But I did not realize a sign that said something about a boxing contest and an interest in the matter, relates Gus. "He agreed to give me a chance that night if one or another of the laments was awarded first prize in one of them three days." I went on in his place, I didn't know much about the technique of boxing, but I could hit. So I hit the other fellow on the first round—and that night was over. My reward was 10 shillings (£2.50).

Through the next few days, I fought nine fights—mostly in clubs in the White Circuit district. He knocked out nine men in the first eight fights. I didn't like it very much. So as Gus was coming out of the building after his eighth fight, he hid behind a door, swung an iron pipe and fractured the skull of Gus Wilson.

It was months before Gus recovered. The skull knitted together, but the dent he remained through all the years. They thought that his fracture wouldn't be harmful and he went back to ring work. But after three months, having hit him on the head at the first fracture point, knocked him out, Gus decided to hang up his mitts.

"I jumped into Paris, along about that time Bobby Dobbs, an American boxer, was doing a bit of business in Parisian Capital. Gus hunted up Dobbs and sold him the idea of serving him as a trainer. Gus made good with him and in some time when Dan McKortick came anchor in Paris with a string of fighters, and brought around a trainer, he was the man that Gus was the heaven sent gift.

So Gus trained the McKortick string, which included the well known, the trained Willie Lewis, Jack Johnson when he was in Paris and was world's champion. He handled Frank Moran, Jake Alcazar and a score of lesser fighters.

Then Francis Desjardins sent a lurch call for him and Gus Wilson became in 1910—the trainer for Georges Carpentier. He handled Georges Carpentier for the Frenchman for nearly five years.

Mr. Bunn struggled to save his business but on January 1, 1918 went into voluntary liquidation. In the settlement that followed each depositor was paid seventy-five cents and a half per cent on his deposits.

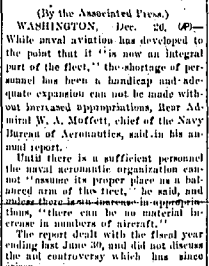

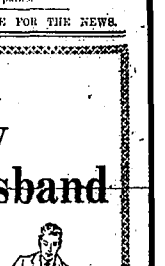

# WATER CONTENT HIGH IN SNOW ON WYOMING HILLS

Report of Season's First Survey on Jackson Lake Watershed Holds Encouragement for Waterusers.


Encouragement for water users of eastern and southern Idaho who are dependent to greater or less extent for irrigation water supply from Jackson Lake reservoir, is contained in the report of the first snow survey trip of the season in that region which was undertaken last Monday by Joseph Harkness, assistant superintendent of Moran, Wyoming, in E. H. Burlington, Butte, Montana, project superintendent, and which was made public here Saturday.

Data obtained on the trip from December 11 to 21, showed an average depth of 26 inches of snow lying over the Jackson Lake watershed. High Water Content Text of the report is as follows: Snow survey trip on the Jackson Lake watershed. The snow is well settled and the lower layer contains an unusually large percentage of water on account of the rain that fell over the entire watershed after there was about 12 inches of snow. If course of the lower altitude the rain went into the ground and also melted the snow which was shallow. The snow is compacted due to exceedingly cold weather.

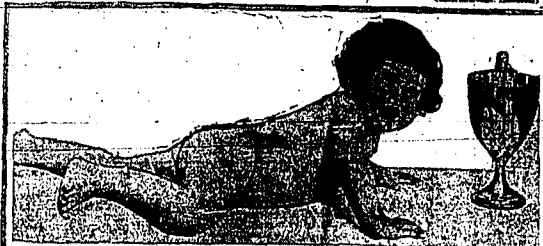

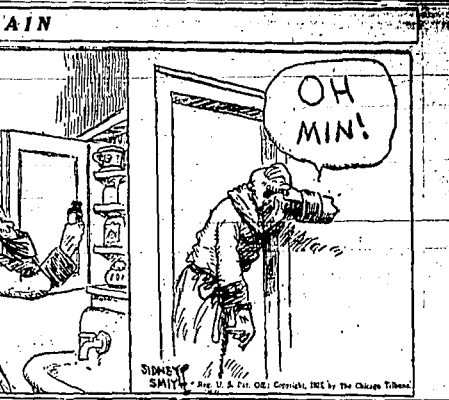
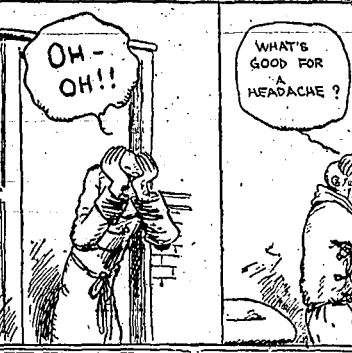
