

OPERATORS AND OWNERS CONFERENCE TODAY ON WAGE

Ray of Hope Held Out That Strike in Eastern Anthracite Fields May Be Called Off as Result of Meeting.

(By the Associated Press) NEW YORK, Dec. 28.—A ray of hope for a settlement of at least a temporary nature in the anthracite coal fields, which has kept 15,000 miners idle since September 1, and caused a wide-spread unemployment, was seen tonight as representatives of the miners and operators gathered to attend a conference tomorrow. It will be the first meeting of the two groups since negotiations were broken off at Atlantic City last summer.

Tomorrow morning there will be separate informal conferences between the joint meeting, which closed doors, will be called at 2 p. m. at the Union League club.

Green Means Forecast However, tonight it was evident to observers that the feeling was not so tense as it has been in the past. Signs of a settlement were the statement issued on Sunday by William Green, secretary of the American Federation of Labor, that the strike would be settled within ten days.

During the last convention of the federation at Atlantic City, when it voted unanimously to support the miners in their strike, Green stated that the mines "would be as silent as King's Park" before the end of the year. His statement of Sunday, therefore, was regarded as significant.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 28.—The labor department today designated Hywel Davies of the bureau of conciliation to act as its observer of the meeting between the operators and United Mine Workers officials tomorrow in New York to discuss plans for ending the long suspension in the hard coal fields.

Mr. Davies, who is considered one of the department's foremost experts, will choose one other member of the conciliation service in New York and the two will work in close cooperation, in which officials said there was reason to hope for an early resumption of work in the anthracite mines.
