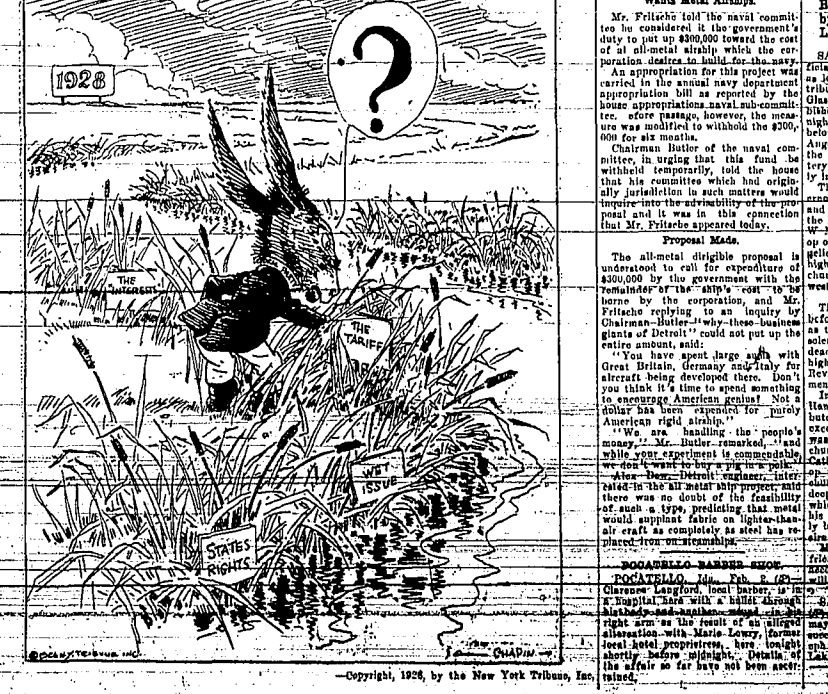

Boat Given of Crew a Rescue at Sea During Storm

Men of Schooner Taken Off Boat Before Boat Went Down 25 Miles North of Miami Says Radio From Captain.

PORT ARTHUR, Tex., Feb. 2. (AP)—This is the story of a rescue at sea of the men of the schooner *Simmons* by the crew of the *Para*, the company's tug, which was on a mission to tow the *Simmons* to Miami, was received here today in a radiogram to the Associated Press from Captain Maxwell of the tug.

The rescue came after a long battle with the waves off the Atlantic coast, just as the *Simmons* started to sink. The entire crew of the tug volunteered to go to the rescue. The wireless message from the tug follows:

Distress Signal.

"On January 29, at 2 p. m., 25 miles south of Miami the tug *Para* was sighted the schooner *Simmons* in distress. After three attempts *Para* was unable to get within 100 yards of the schooner. The *Simmons* believed he could still float 100 miles was reached, but at 10 p. m. the tug was ordered to go to the rescue. The *Para* was rapidly drifting on to the beach. All this time the *Simmons* was being towed by the tug. The crew landed at Key West."

Snowfall Lighter in Drainage Area

Comparison of the same measurements this year with those of previous years, according to reclamation office officials, indicates probability of considerably lighter runoff in Snake river this year than last, although the difference is not regarded as a serious one.
