SWEDEN SIGNS TREATY OUTLAWING WAR WITH SCANDINAVIAN FRIENDS

STOCKHOLM, Feb. 3 (AP)—By the signature yesterday of a compulsory, unlimited arbitration treaty with Finland, Sweden completed a system of agreements with all her Scandinavian neighbors for the outlawing of war, similar treaties already having been concluded with Norway and Denmark.

These agreements provide that all disputes between the signatories shall be submitted to arbitration and in cases in which direct diplomatic negotiations prove futile the decision of the permanent court of international justice is accepted in advance as final.

SUPER STATION TO STAY ON AIR

Hoover and Assistants Investigate Charges Against R. A. C. And Decide for Company.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 3 (AP)—As a result of a conference today between Secretary Hoover and his assistants in charge of radio regulation and representatives of the Radio Corporation of America, that company's station WJZ at Trenton, N. J., will be allowed for the present to continue use of super-power in broadcasting.

Radio listeners in the vicinity of the station have complained that the immense power was blanketing the reception of radio programs from all other points.

At the conference today in corporation officials declared their willingness to furnish expert service to each complainant in an endeavor to stop the trouble.

In 400 cases, they said, it has been found possible to make slight changes or adjustments in receiving sets which eliminated all of the owners' complaints.
