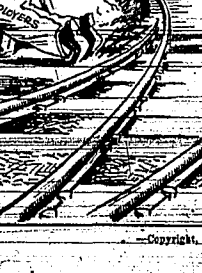

### COUNTY BUILDS WARDS TO HOLD YOUNG OFFENDER

Separate Quarters for Erving Boys and Girls to be Provided to Permit of Segregation from Elders.

Construction of two large wards on the ground floor of the court house building here for detention of juvenile offenders was begun today by the contractor under the supervision of the county commissioners. The new wards are to be situated at the south end of the building and will be approximately 50-25 feet. Three windows will admit light and permit of adequate ventilation.

The work is to be done under supervision of H. E. Bolter, building contractor, and the total expense is not to exceed \$1000. Installation of plumbing fixtures was begun Friday.

Primary purpose of the new wards is to make possible the segregation of younger offenders and to prevent their coming in contact with older and more hardened criminals in custody in the county jail.

### Court Lenient With Married Offender
