POWER COMPANY ASKS COURT FOR RATE INCREASE

Schedules Fixed by Idaho Public Utilities Commission Declared Confiscatory in Federal Court.

(By the Associated Press)

BOSTON, March 8 (AP)—The Idaho Power company argued Monday that schedules of rates fixed by the Idaho public utilities commission are confiscatory and the hearing of its suit against the commission, which opened before a special statutory United States court of three judges here, was adjourned.

The judges—Chief Judge Wallace McMillan of Oregon, Judge F. R. Johnson of Idaho and Judge H. Chapman of Washington.

The court tomorrow will hear arguments in the suit of the investors' syndicate of Minneapolis against E. W. Pugh, Idaho's attorney general, and the Idaho Power and the American Economics, both of Idaho; against A. H. Conner, attorney general, and other state and county officials. Constitutional questions are involved in each of the cases.

J. F. McNamee of Salt Lake, was one of counsel for the power company, with Jess Hawley of Boise and A. J. Price, company attorney, assisting. Charles E. McCarthy of Boise and John C. Hees, Caldwell, Idaho, former state senator, also, were present.

Rates Declared Unjust

Counsel for the commission contend that rates fair and reasonable were within the jurisdiction of the commission to establish, and that the duties of the commission did not require it to make out a subject to interference by the courts unless there was flagrant indication that rates established were confiscatory. If the commission had no such power, the court could not be broader, it declared, as no federal statute gives that power. When courts go beyond this they become regulatory, and a committee conclusion on a bill.

Eight Point Asked

The power company maintained that as the Idaho statute gives the utilities commission power to fix just and reasonable rates, when it did not do the matter would be subject to review before a court. The company holds that a fair and just return on the property value at approximately \$27,000,000 should be 8 per cent, instead of the 7½ allowed by the commission.

To PROBE FOREIGN PRICES

WASHINGTON, March 8 (AP)—An investigation into the retail prices of American farm machinery and other machinery sold in foreign countries, as compared with the retail prices in the United States, was asked in a resolution introduced today by Rep. John W. McCormack, Democrat.

PRICES GO DOWN

Last Hour Market Downward
Trend in All Commodities; Mar-
ket Strong at Beginning.

CHICAGO, March 8.—(P)—Selling which developed after the market closed, visible supply figures were announced, led to a material setback in wheat prices today and pulled down the corn market as well as oats. Wheat closed 10¢ lower, to 41¢ per bushel, and corn fell 10¢, to 16¢ per bushel, from 16.10 to 15.10. Corn finished at 16¢ net decline, oats 4¢, to 16¢ off and provisions unchanged to 16¢ down. Prior to the downward swing of wheat, however, there had been a market displayed strength from the very beginning. Many traders were expecting that the United States' visible supply statement would show a decent load of as much as 100,000 bushels, but the figure was even more incentive to buy was found elsewhere in assertions that low temperatures Sunday and lack of snow covering had probably damaged the new domestic winter crop.
