

ESTIMATED GAIN IN POPULATION

National Research Bureau Issues Figures Showing Approximate Growth in 1925

NEW YORK, March 23 (AP)—An estimated gain of 1,225,000 in population in the United States last year was announced recently by the national bureau of economic research. The estimated gain for 1925 was almost identical with that for 1924.

The estimated population of continental United States was placed at 15,940,000 on January 1, 1925, or a gain of more than ten millions since the last federal census in 1920.

The estimates were reached principally by a process of figures covering the registration area, upon which data and departures from the United States and upon a reapportionment of the work done by the bureau's former years.

There was a moderate decrease in the number of net migration into the United States, the bureau said, but it was offset by a larger number of births and a smaller number of deaths.

"The total population gain in 1925 was slightly larger than the average for the past several years," said the report, "but materially less than that of 1923, when the large amount of immigration contributed to a population increase of 1,900,000, or 12.1 percent, when for the same cause, the population growth, up to 2,174,000, being the last year, immigration played but a minor role in the population growth of the country, accounting for less than one-sixth of the total increase, the reason being that over deaths adding 1,307,000 persons, while immigration accounted for but 1,000,000."

"It is a noteworthy fact that, despite the growth in population, both the number of births and the number of deaths were appreciably less in 1925 than in 1924. The year 1920 had an unusually high birth rate, and it therefore had a slight increase in the number of births, which to have been a tendency toward an increase in the number of children born in the United States, while the number of deaths tends to run lower than in previous years."

SPRAY SEASON NOW AT HAND

Growers Must Act Promptly To Control Orchard Pests, District Inspector Advises

Fruit growers of the Twin Falls district must make prompt application of lime sulphur spray if they hope to protect their trees and fruit against ravages of the blister beetle this season, according to statements issued Monday by E. V. Gipson, district horticultural inspector.

Because of the early season, Mr. Gipson stated, development of buds has been advanced, so that only three or four days remain for effective application of spray for blister beetle spray for control of leaf roller and scale, as well, should be done as soon as possible.

The end of this week, Mr. Gipson stated, should be completion of the spray for blister beetle in all orchards in which growers hope to control that pest this season. Late spraying will be ineffective against this pest, the inspector stated.

Gives Formula.

The inspector advised two lime sulphur spray formulas: Where the dilution is used the proportion should be 24 gallons of lime sulphur to 200 gallons of water.

In orchards which are infested with leaf roller or scale as well as with blister beetle, Mr. Gipson stated, thorough application of an oil spray may be expected to control the mite. Oil spray is necessary for control of leaf roller and scale and for this purpose the inspector recommended use of spray containing seven per cent oil content.

STREET CORNERS ON CHICAGO

Spirited—Buying—on Chicago Exchange—Sends Values Higher—Close Is Strong.

CHICAGO, March 21. (AP)—Spirited buying developed in the wheat market today and gave a sharp upturn to values. Despite the fact that earlier in the day September delivery had dropped to the lowest price yet this season, the world available supply showed a decrease of 430,000 barrels and there were indications of export business in United States wheat by way of the Gulf of Mexico.

Wheat—closed about 1 1/2 to 2 3/8 net higher; May new \$1.27 to 1.27 1/8 and July 26 to 1.26 1/2 a year; at 3 1/2 to 3 3/4 advance; oats unchanged to 1-4 up and provisions unchanged to 100 down. It was estimated that 600,000 bushels of North American wheat and 500,000 bushels of rye were taken today for shipment to Europe. In addition to the stimulus from the commodities market was the fact that the Liverpool market today was firmer than was expected and that a minimum of freight rates were disposed to look for a rally on account of recent severe declines. For a while, however, the upward trend of the wheat market here was limited by weakness of corn values and by reports that 1,000,000 bushels of wheat had been ordered from four elevators to Minneapolis and Butte.

Active Buying.

Flour—Trading quiet with a range of about four cents, the wheat market largely to move upward in earnest at the day opened on March 21. At this time buyers with eastern connections became aggressive buyers and there was active purchasing on the part of previous sellers. Among the factors which also attracted buyers was a reduction of 100,000 bushels in British consumption in the Argentine wheat market. Some talk also was current of foreign demand from United States crop buyers.

Corn and oats rallied with wheat in the late afternoon after selling at a new low price record for the season.

NEW YORK, March 21. (AP)—Development of active weakness in the stock market and merchandising shares turned the market into a losing one today.

After an opening of play of strength, further selling of bank stocks, which had been held up by a rally in the market, and a decline in the price of oil, helped to dampen bull enthusiasm. The average of 30 leading industrial issues tumbled 1/2 to 3/4, and the market closed with a marked falling off in volume.

The day's sales aggregated 1,250,000 shares.

Selling of the mail order stocks, which originated with bear traders, apparently originated on the theory that business of those companies would quickly reflect the decreased purchasing power of the consumer.
