GENERAL STORM
COMES OVER
WEST COUNTRY

New Tempest Threatens California; Utah Is Center of Heavy Showers, While Wyoming Is Visited by Snow.

(By The Associated Press.) SAN FRANCISCO, April 6.—On the heels of the storm which struck the California coast, a new storm is being felt all over the state to relieve a month's dry spell, a new storm was predicted by the Bureau of weather tonight. The new storm is due to hit the coast Thursday on its eastward journey, the United States weather bureau reported.

Rivers in northern and central California already are approaching the flood stage, but as much of the moisture is being absorbed by the ground that flood warnings are not contemplated for at least another day, the weather bureau said.

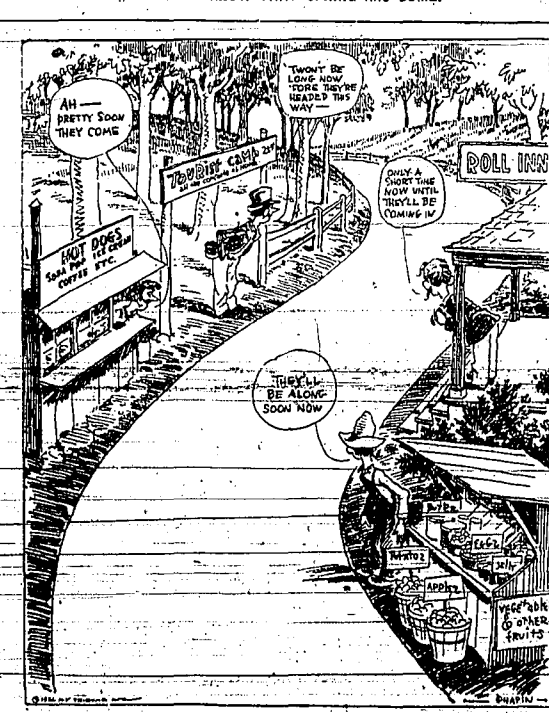
