SPECIAL TEXAS
VOTE TO DECIDE
PARTY NOMINEEDemocratic State Executive
Committee Certifies Names of
Moody and Ferguson for
Run-off Primary August 20.

(By Associated Press.)

DALLAS, Texas, Aug. 9.—The battle for the democratic nominations for governor of Texas is to be fought all over again between Governor Miriam A. Ferguson and Attorney General Dan Moody.

In the midst of threats of court action to disqualify Moody, followed by a heated speech by Moody, the democratic state executive committee today certified the names of Mrs. Ferguson and Moody to go on the ballot for the runoff primary August 20.

The election was deferred, however, after an official canvass of the July

primary vote by a sub-committee, which showed that Moody received 1770 votes and Ferguson 1,000, and that the two candidates were tied.

Under the Texas election law, the executive committee must certify the names of the two highest candidates for runoff when the returns do not show a majority for any candidate.

Promises Not Mentioned.

No mention was made in the committee's report of Mrs. Ferguson's promise to resign from the office of her announced intent to resign from her office at the close of the special legislative session which has called for September 15.

The committee, however, showed that Moody had 409,752 votes and that the total of all other democratic gubernatorial candidates was 411,592. No official returns were received from two counties—Dallas and Gray—but the committee's report states that unoffical returns from these two counties indicated that the official vote would not change the total result. The report also stated that the returns from these two counties did not include the return from those two counties.

Petition to Disqualify Fails.

An attempt to have the committee consider a petition asking that Moody be disqualified as a candidate on the ground of alleged irregularities in campaign contributions failed, when the committee rejected it.

Hamilton, who said that the matter was just and since the committee was not a judicial body it could not determine the question raised by the petition, the document was received and filed on file.

It is stated that Moody's campaign expense statement, filed with the secretary of state, showed that he, the subject of the disqualification, had given the largest amount to the National Committee for Al Smith, former speaker and candidate to succeed himself, had contributed \$250 each to Moody's campaign.

The petition alleged that there was a violation of the law and that no clippers of the law prohibiting candidates to contribute to the campaign funds of other candidates.

DEADLOCK HOLDS
IN CHURCH ROWRepresentatives of Both Sides
Tell How Other Faction Can



WHEAT VALUES SCORE ADVANCE

Despite increase in United States Visible Supply, Prices Move Upward on Mar.

CHICAGO, Aug. 9 (AP)—Notwithstanding announcement of a record-breaking increase of the United States wheat visible supply, wheat values today scored an advance. First reports of the latest statistics, together with news of a record in British wheat production, damage in Kansas, had a bullish effect. Closing quotations on wheat were unsettled 1-1/2 to 3-1/2 net higher, with 1-1/2 to 2-1/2 advance, oats unchanged, and corn up, and wheat varying from the same in each case, to finish in a rise of 10c.

In view of the wheat domestic visible supply being larger than ever shown, the firmness of wheat prices appeared remarkable. Announcement of the increase led to augmented offerings and the market's reaction to the day's latest quotations, but the effects were readily absorbed, and a quick rally ensued with shorts running to cover at the last. Local reports from San Joaquin, Calif., show a general part of the state's cotton producers led to fears of delayed wheat harvest there.

Liverpool Market Firm.

Unexpected firmness of wheat quotations at Liverpool emphasized the market effects of advice about revolutionary disorders in South Russia, and attention turned to similar disorders of British wheat crop, which was reported to have suffered a sharp reduction because of the government's estimate of怯懦.

Exports business today was estimated at 40,000 bushels.

Imports in Kansas with the temperatures both yesterday and today above 100, dominated the corn market despite beneficial rains in Illinois and Iowa. Firmness of oats was reflected in a rise of 10c of sharp reduction tomorrow of the government estimate of oats yield.
