

IDENTIFICATION
IN CASE FAILS

Name of Bomber Who Blew Up
Pittsburgh Bank Remains a
Mystery; Recover Note.

PITTSBURGH, Aug. 25. (AP)—The name of the perpetrator of the fatal bomb explosion in the Farmer's Deposit Savings bank remained a mystery tonight after two possible identifications had proven erroneous.

The most important development of the day was the hearing of the name in which the bomber yesterday afternoon made his demand for \$200 and the threat to blow up the bank if he did not get it. The note revealed that the man carried 20 sticks of dynamite in a little satchel. "It will discharge," it was written, "when the handle is out of my hands, if you or anyone else forces a gun on me there will be no escape left, we will all be blown to pieces." The note was handed to a teller and the explosion occurred when the man charged the satchel as a teller approached.

The bomber's finger prints were taken and police will compare them with available records.

Four in Serious Condition
Seven of the men who were injured in the explosion remained at hospitals, four in a serious condition, while Mrs. George Ortmann, wife of the policeman who was killed with the bomber, was reported seriously ill as a result of shock.

MEDICAL STUDENT FACES
MANSLAUGHTER CHARGE

CLEVELAND, Ohio, Aug. 25. (AP)—Police announced tonight that criminal charges will be brought against Emil "Frenchy" Balanescu, 21, medical student, whose sweetheart, Dorothy Elizabeth Kirk, pretty 21 year old stenographer, died mysteriously in a hospital Sunday.

If the coroner's report definitely finds that Miss Kirk died from the effects of drugs and medicines which her youthful suitor is alleged to have given her, manslaughter charges probably will be filed against Balanescu, detective Chief Cornelius Culy said.

If, however, it is found that the girl died from other causes, for which the youth was not to blame, Balanescu will have to answer charges of administering drugs in violation of the state pharmacy act, Culy declared.

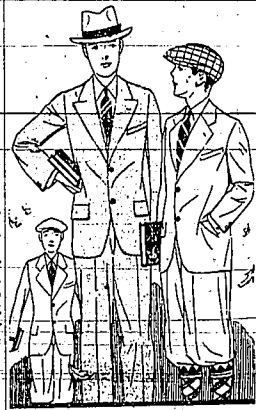

Sees Republican Majority for Next Session of House

PAUL SMITH, N. Y., Aug. 25. (AP)—The republicans will elect in November a working majority of at least 25 in the national house of representatives. President Coolidge was told today by Representative Wood, republican, chairman of the republican congressional campaign committee. The present working majority is 35, but Mr. Wood, who came to White Pine camp from Washington to report on the republican campaign, said he could be expected that some seats would be lost in an off year after the heavy sweep of the presidential election which carried many republicans into office from nominally democratic or doubtful districts.

For the most part, however, he added the republicans will not lose many seats in either the west or the east. The report was said to have been along the lines of other information in the possession of Mr. Coolidge and he was said to be pleased with the prospects. "Prosperity is the issue, Mr. Wood said, asking 'why change to democracy who in 1914, under the unfavorable tariff brought about our victories in our cities?'"

The democrats have attempted to make the tariff the issue, he added, but the farmers are for protection and to both the farmer and the laborer a high tariff is vital. Ninety per cent of all imports the farmers use on the farms, he continued, are on the free list, while the raw products of the farms are protected.

THREATENED ACTION DOES NOT MATERIALIZE

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 25. (AP)—Threatened action of James J. Corbett, former heavyweight champion, who claims to have had an understanding with the head external expert of the authorities to hold the Dempsey-Tunney heavyweight title bout in the Squawamish stadium, did not materialize today.

I think the action we propose will be the faith of an intention," said John A. McLevitt, counsel for Corbett today. "Corbett and I feel we have not been treated fairly. We were asked if the fight came here we would have exclusive right to the stadium. We had planned to hold the fight July fourth, but changed the matter which we were led to believe it could not be staged here."

VALUABLE MANUSCRIPT STOLEN FROM ART CLUB

NEW YORK, Aug. 25. (AP)—A Latin manuscript valued at \$25,000, one of a collection dealing with the early history of the Roman Catholic church, was stolen today from the exhibition room of the National Art club. The police have issued a general alarm.

It is one of a number of Latin and German manuscripts, hundreds of years old, which were brought to this country for exhibition in connection with the recent encyclical congress in Chicago. The collection was being returned to Europe in the custody of a German, when it was discovered that it had been stolen. The collection, always kept closely guarded, is valued at hundreds of thousands of dollars.

State Department Publishes Note to China Government

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25. (AP)—The state department published today the note of "emphatic protest" which Minister MacMurray has delivered in the Peking government in an effort to induce the payment of obligations due American banking, shipping and industrial houses and to prevent the pledging of customs surplus moneys as security for a new domestic loan.

After reciting by the American institutions to which the Chinese government has long been obligated, the note said the American legation had been compelled to deny specifically "the justice of the position adopted by the Chinese government to the effect that the consolidated domestic loans enjoy a preferential right to the use of customs surplus funds after services of the pre-war loans, the Boxer indemnities and the reorganization loan of 1913 have been met."

"The American legation," the note added, "therefore insists that the Chinese authorities concerned have no right to utilize as the security for new domestic financing the amount of approximately \$1,000,000 per annum to become available upon the extinction of the ninth year domestic loan and could only obtain any such action taken by the Chinese authorities as a further failure to observe good faith towards the American creditors of China. The American legation, therefore, protests."

REPUBLICANS IN OHIO READY FOR FALL TEST

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Aug. 25. (AP)—Republicans were virtually squared away for battle tonight with their democratic opponents for voters at the November election. The state convention voted unanimous adoption of the party platform without a change in the text as presented by the resolutions committee. Before adjourning the state convention today, United States Senator Simon Pease, chairman and keynote speaker, made a last appeal for the reelection of Senator Frank B. Willis and republican congressmen to insure republican control of the next congress—that policies of President Coolidge may be carried out.

THOMPSON TO COME HOME

PAUL SMITH, N. Y., Aug. 25. (AP)—Published reports from Manila that Carmel A. Thompson of Ohio, who is making an economic survey of the Philippines for President Coolidge, was seen going to China for a similar survey led officials at the summer White House today to say that any such plans were unknown to the president.

Mr. Thompson, it was added, is not going to China on any mission for the president, and no investigation there has been authorized or is desired.

Hold Secretary to Leader of Mexican Rebellion in Jail

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 25. (AP)—Josh B. Hooley, red-haired Irish-Mexican newspaper-man and assistant secretary to General Enrique Estrada, was held in jail today for lack of \$10,000 bail following his arraignment on charges of aiding his employer in plans for a punitive expedition into Mexico which ended with the arrest of Estrada near San Diego several days ago.

The complaint against Hooley alleged that he conspired with Estrada and four unnamed persons against Mexico, to bring about the overthrow of the government of Mexico by force and other materials of war that have been seized during the last week. Federal officers said at the time of Hooley's arrest today that the airplanes were to have been purchased for \$10,000 and were to have been delivered upon the evening of a raid upon Tijuana, which was to be the first move in the alleged invasion. Officials said that the west coast of Mexico was then to be bombarded from the point of view of California and a drive directed upon Mexico City with Maratón as a base of operations.

Hooley is of Irish parentage but is a citizen of Mexico and said to have acted as southern California correspondent for a Mexican newspaper.

AMERICAN WARSHIPS GO TO NICARAGUAN WATERS

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25. (AP)—The navy was called on today by the state department to protect American interests in Nicaragua, where another revolution has developed.

As a result, orders were issued for the dispatch of two American warships to the Nicaraguan ports of Bluefields and Corinto. Selection of the vessels for duty there was left to Rear Admiral Bailey, in command of the special service squadron in Central American waters.

Decision to send warships to Bluefields and Corinto was reached after the state department had received additional reports from American diplomatic representatives in Nicaragua as to conditions there. The state department did not disclose the substance of these reports, but there were indications that the need of additional protection for American lives and property at both ports and at Managua, the capital, has been emphasized.

FRENCH AVIATOR MAKES GOOD TIME IN FLIGHT

PARIS, Aug. 25. (AP)—Captain George Pelletier Doley, French aviator of Paris-Tokyo fame, completed one of the most remarkable flights in the annals of French aviation when he landed at Le Bourget at 11:15 o'clock tonight, after covering 2750 miles including five landings to refuel, in 53 3/4 hours, actual flying time.

Captain Pelletier Doley took off from Villa Coublay at 5:30 o'clock yesterday morning. He landed at Rome, Italy, shortly after noon, then went on to Tunis, French north Africa, arriving there at 7:30 p.m.—He then started out a night flight across half of the African continent to Casablanca. He reached the Moroccan town at 8:30 a. m. his next goal was made Madrid, Spain, which he made at 2 this afternoon. He reached Bordeaux, France, soon after 7 this evening and headed straight for Le Bourget, the airport of Paris.

Captain Pelletier Doley was accompanied by one mechanic and piloted the airplane himself during the entire journey.

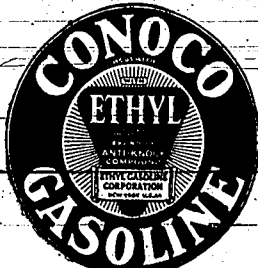
