"The children of Idaho are by far the most important resource," stated Congressman Addison T. Smith, in his address before the assembled students and faculty at the Twin Falls High School yesterday afternoon. "This resource was not disregarded in the early days of the state when development of other resources was begun. Today the children of Idaho are as good as those found in New York, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania and other states similarly situated of the nation."

The speaker prefaced these remarks with a reference to the first school in Twin Falls, which enrollment of less than forty pupils...

In urging a receptive attitude toward the knowledge which is offered, he said: "It is impossible to prepare a young person to take his place in the world without active cooperation from that young person himself. You have the right to be well educated, with capital of intellect and time invested. You make a profit if you get all it is possible to get from the school. There are four factors necessary to success, namely: money, time, influence, education and personality. All these you can do anything."

A recipe for success in the universal search for happiness was mentioned by the speaker. "If you are not satisfied with the things which you admire in others," he said, "you will be on the way toward happiness. After all, the real test of happiness is the feeling that you are filling your life with something that contributes to the happiness of others."




