MONEY AND ESTEEM

American cities are notoriously lavish in their methods of welcoming celebrities to their midst or paying homage to the good and the brave. But now and then something happens to make citizens wonder whether the right expressions of respect have been chosen, and whether the end sought is sufficiently well served to be worth the high cost.

Such thoughtfulness has been forced in New York by the recent refusal of the Comptroller to approve several bills incurred by the city in welcoming heroes and royalty. The bills denied run into thousands of dollars. They include such items as seals offering the freedom of the city and flowers for hundred thirty-five dollars, flowers for the mayor at forty dollars, coffee and sandwiches at three hundred thirty-five dollars and fifty cents, and portraits of the immortal words of speakers at forty-five dollars. "Highlight" the mayor at forty dollars, coffee and sandwiches at three hundred thirty-five dollars and fifty cents, and so on. It may be an unusually long list, but other cities probably have their own pretty good imitations.

Some of the visitors so expensively welcomed are of really great note—for example, Captain Fried and Chief Officer Miller of the Roosevelt. Certain royal visitors, too, seem to justify a little special expenditure. But when the custom is extended to movie and beauty queens and swimming champions and everybody that has broken into sudden wealth, it begins to look like a little foolishness.

And even when honoring such worthies as the brave men from the Roosevelt—just how much respect, esteem and honor can be expressed in a nine hundred thirty-five dollar Illinois state scroll? Especially when, as is charged, the words of praise are couched in poor English? Our standards for such things are a bit confused. We think that money and gilt and bunting and badges can express deep feeling better than broad heads, respectful silences, honest tears and proud and loyal hearts.

THE ROMANIAN CRISIS

Queen Marie's "sign," if "America" meant greater jealousy about her own country than Americans had ever felt before. Her return home with the conflicting reports regarding the health of King Ferdinand and the complicated political situation there, has intensified the interest.

Here is what looks like "the low-down" on the Romanian situation, as told by Captain Fish Armstrong in "The New Balkans." The quotation, though a mere fragment, is highly illuminating:

"King Ferdinand is a cold-blooded intriguer in disputes from Bucharest except when he is ill. He has never been a directing factor in Romanian politics, and he would not be today even if he were in good health. Unlike many in his entourage, he is not interested in politics, either theoretical or applied, and is ignorant of his country's needs and wishes."

"An impotent broker sovereign; a scuttling consort with an infinite fund of energy, ambition and determination, marred by bad judgment; a young gentleman (the crown prince) with no particular qualification for leadership, unnecessarily elevated to martyrdom through exile and disdained from a throne which neither elimination nor temperament adapt him to fill very acceptably; a deserted wife and healthy five-year-old son, whose whole head are already gathering the ripples and strife; that seems the inevitable lot of minor rulers—these are the leading personal factors which the politicians of Romania are trying to manipulate today."
