SEE DANGER IN

LAW ENACTMENT

University Professors Start
Movement for Better Co-op-
eration in Combatting Spread
of Legislation in States.

(By The Associated Press)
PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 31.—The American Association of University Professors today started a movement for more effective action against religious groups in opposing the spread of anti-evolution legislation in the several States. The organization met in connection with the annual meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

This national association of professors of science, which has headquarters at Loyola College, Chicago, Illinois, was organized in 1915.

It declared that this association takes particular interest in bringing about a more effective cooperation between all groups of organizations interested in opposing legislative restriction on freedom of teaching in state-supported institutions of higher learning, and in the separation of church and state in the

Second Resolution
Another resolution on the same subject, presented by Professor R. H. Johnson of the University of Pittsburgh, was also adopted:

"Resolved, that when some similar organization is formed it should investigate the legality of the action of the Texas state, text books commission which has removed all mention of evolution from text books in state supported schools."

The action of the association followed the reading of a report from the committee on freedom of teaching in science, of which Professor R. B. Holmes of the University of California is chairman, on the spread of anti-evolutionism.

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DENIES TALE OF FINANCIAL HELP

President Diaz of Nicaragua Refutes Charges That American Bankers Are Aiding

WASHINGTON, Dec. 31 (AP)—Mr. Diaz, in a cablegram to the Nicaraguan legation today, made an emphatic statement that the government of Nicaragua was receiving financial aid from American bankers. His statement, the legation said, was a refutation of charges by Dr. Juan Somoza, head of the Nicaraguan liberal faction.

Diaz, who has been recognized by the United States government as the legitimate ruler of the nation, said:

"The statements made by Somoza and the revolutionists that my government is under obligation to American bankers is absurd and untrue. The Nicaraguan government does not owe any debt to American bankers. At present the only outstanding debts are those incurred during the Somoza regime, over 20 years ago."

"My government feels quite capable of maintaining law and order in the country and of continuing to provide the revolutionists with no assistance, financial aid from Mexico as it has been doing this far."

"Obviously, if Mexican revolutionists support the revolution with war supplies and funds, such assistance will be continued until the establishment of peace will be permanent since my government cannot suppress this source of revolutionary supplies."

Turns Down Offer

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, Dec. 31 (AP)—The Nicaraguan government today refused to accept the offer of mediation made by the government of Nicaragua to the United States for recognition of the Diaz government there was no need for mediation.

It is reported by the liberals that in the recent four-day battle at Las Peñas, their forces were 32 dead and wounded. They place the loss of the government forces at 150 dead and wounded and say that the liberals captured 500 prisoners, 500 rifles, 300,000 rounds of ammunition, machine guns and provisions.

President Diaz, of Costa Rica, had made it known that he could not recognize Diaz because he was not the legal president, and that he could not recognize Juan B. Somoza, head of the liberal faction, because Somoza did not have control over Nicaragua.

Moscow Report on Soviet Recognition Lacks Foundation

WASHINGTON, Dec. 31 (AP)—From both the White House and the state department, the word went out today that the report of the Moscow Times that the United States had recognized the Diaz government was unfounded.

The first statement was made at the White House that President Coolidge had no intention of looking for recognition of the Diaz government at the state department. It was stated that the attitude of the American government toward Russia was unchanged.

President Coolidge feels that diplomatic relations with Russia should be based on the voluntary activities of Americans who, while abroad, retain the courtesy impression that they have authority to represent the United States.

Representatives of foreign governments, in his opinion, are not to be considered as having been approached in the official way.

At the state department it was said that the Hughes pronouncement of 1924 that the United States could not discuss the question of Russian recognition and did not propose to recognize Russia was the department's present attitude.

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LABOR OUTLOOK FAVORABLE ONE
