VERBAL ATTACK BRINGS CHEERS FROM DEPUTIES

United States "Aggression" is Bitterly Criticized by Orators of Mexican Assembly; Calles Stand Firm - Favor.

(By The Associated Press) MEXICO CITY, Jan. 1 (AP)—The new petroleum and land laws, at midnight last night the chamber of deputies, during the closing moments of its 1926 session, heard violent oratorical attacks against the United States for its Mexican interventionist policy.

Situation Unchanged The first day the new laws went in effect appear to have passed without incident, the uncertainty of the situation continues unchanged, fundamentally it is still a case of waiting to see whether the Mexican government actually will confiscate any land to which foreign interests claim title or leases legally acquired before the policy is actually enforced.

It is thought the Mexican government will not intensify the character of the foreign exchange committee for reasons, but well-informed observers do not think they include applications by foreign exchange companies for the confirmation of their titles or leases to all land requiring such confirmation.

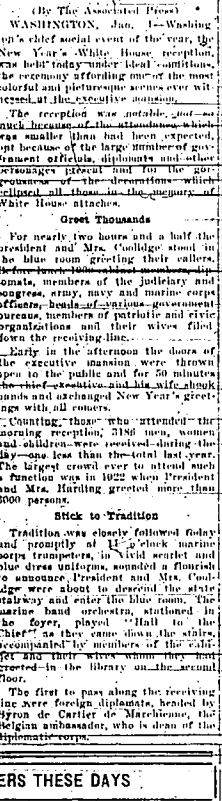

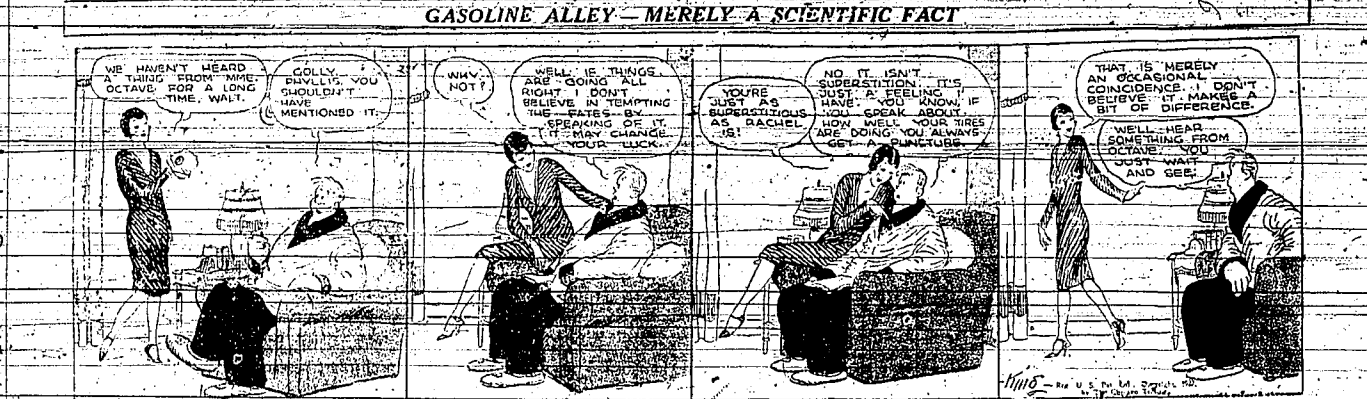

(By The Associated Press) PASADENA, Pasadena, Cal., Jan. 1 (AP)—Alabama's crimson tigers, the nation's southern champions, battered, ledged and without effect the Stanford axle and wheel football team in the final game of the annual classic, which ended in brilliancy at a neck-and-neck tie, 7-7.

The Stanford Cardinals started the scoring in the first quarter, failed again to register but held off every attempt by Alabama until the closing moments of the game.

Citizens of Fatherland to Drink More Solemnly to Dawes Plan After New Year's.

BURLING, Jan. 1 (AP)—All Germany will be drinking more solemnly to the health of the Dawes plan after New Year's than in the past of the country's famous beverage will probably be because of the new tax on beer.

**GEOGRAPHIC BULLETIN EXPLAINS WHEN AND WHERE THE NEW YEAR BEGINS; AMERICA IS SIXTH IN LINE**

WASHINGTON, Jan. 1.—When and where the New Year begins is a question that has long puzzled the minds of many. The Geographic Bulletin, published by the National Geographic Society, explains the matter in a bulletin from Washington, D. C., headed by the society's secretary.

What appears at first glance to be a question of simple logic can be simplified by a little imagination. We know that the earth rotates through space, revolving in a circle around the sun. The earth's surface, hour marks are in some way suspended, and that the earth turns round, just as the hour hand of a clock. Within the circle of its hour marks, there will be 24 hour marks for each day, and a point on the earth will turn once from any mark back to it in 24 hours.

these zones, and to differ by one hour from the time in the next zone. The difference across the date line, however, must be one day instead of one hour. Because of these zones and the theories that it has been necessary to take with their boundaries because of national and state lines and railway divisions, the new year will begin at the wrong theoretical time at many places in the world.

The Hawaiian Islands, for example, hear the pistol the half an hour before the rest of the world. Instead of using a regular standard time zone the islands have adopted a zone between two of the standard ones. In effect they have hung their midnight line over an hour earlier than the rest of the world.

New Year Delayed 25 Hours. The westernmost Aleutian Islands began an extraordinary day on the 25th. Geographically, they lie a sharp distance west of the date line, but in the middle of the island chain, Alaska is extended westward to include these islands. As a result their New Year comes then 25 hours later than it should.

New Day Begins in Mid-Pacific. A most interesting situation exists at the one hundred eighty eighth degree line in the middle of the Pacific Ocean. This is known as the international date line. It is exactly half way around the world from the longitudes that pass through Greenwich and the Indian Ocean.

Two Days Dates At Same Time. Only a question of time is involved. If a city lies east of you (that is, east of the date line) it will be a day ahead of you at the same time, and a day behind you at the same time.

January and December. When we say January 1, 1927, we mean the first day of the year 1927 will come to an end. The year 1926 will come to an end under the midnight line. The first second of the new year will be the first second of the new year.

Passengers on Pacific liners that happen to cross the date line from east to west on December 31, will sail presently into 1927. Those on ships that cross the 180th meridian going eastward on January 1, will sail into the United States.

Some of the anomalies are to be found in the United States. The central time zone is twice as wide as the eastern zone, although theoretically they should be equal. The central zone is stretched far enough west to include the entire state of Texas.

The yellow rag of cloth was found by a merchant in a bag of old documents and is the only specimen of its kind known to exist east of the date line.

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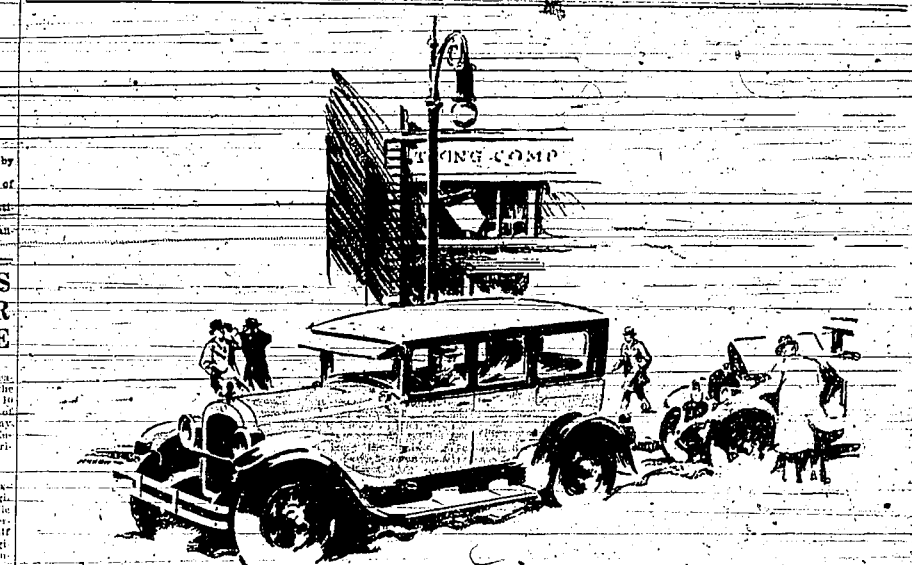
**SEES REVIVING CHORAL INTEREST SINCE WAR**
