PRISON WARDEN HOLDS TRUMPS IN DELIBERATE

Colorado Governor Issues Executive Order Suspending Official, but Sheriff May Not Be Able to Serve Notice.

(By The Associated Press) DENVER, Colo., Jan. 4.—(Times) T. S. Tyson, warden of the Colorado state penitentiary at Cañon City, is expected to say today he will pay for executive order of Governor Clarence J. Morley tonight.

The warden, according to the governor, received effective immediately upon receipt of notification by Warden Tyson. This notice was transmitted to him by telephone, the governor said.

Warden Tyson, speaking from the penitentiary, declined an offer to have a copy of the executive order made available to him to read. He said he had no right to read the order and that it would be made available to the warden's ex-officio service employee.

At the same time he issued a similar executive order suspending Governor Morley named Clifford H. Glasgow, sheriff of Fremont county, where the warden of the penitentiary, the order was placed in the mail tonight.

Prison Gates Padlocked

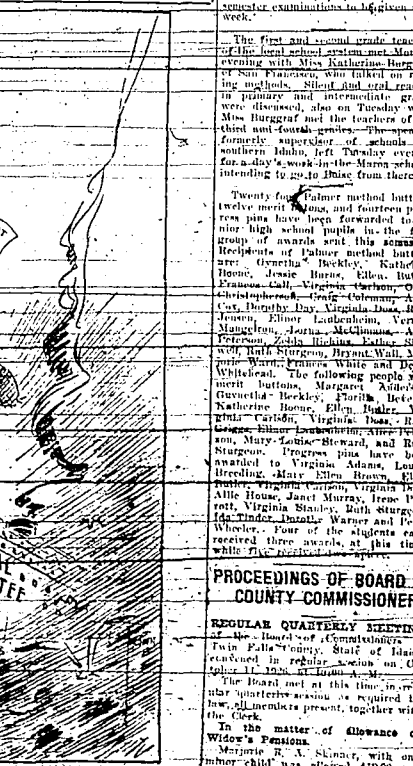

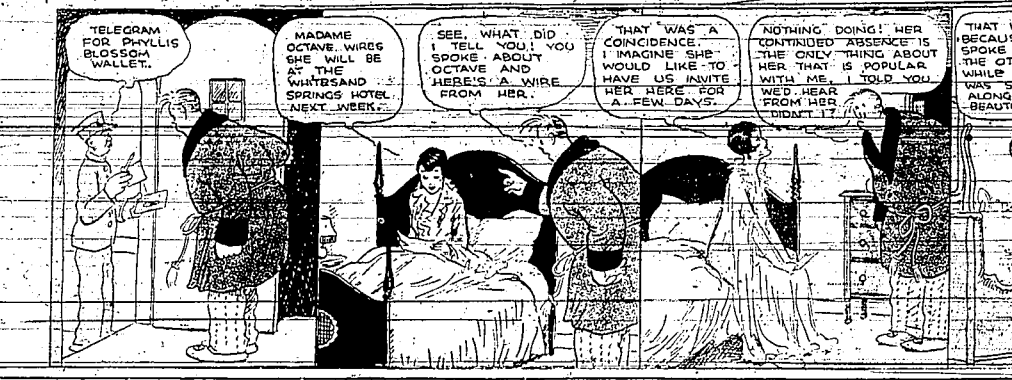

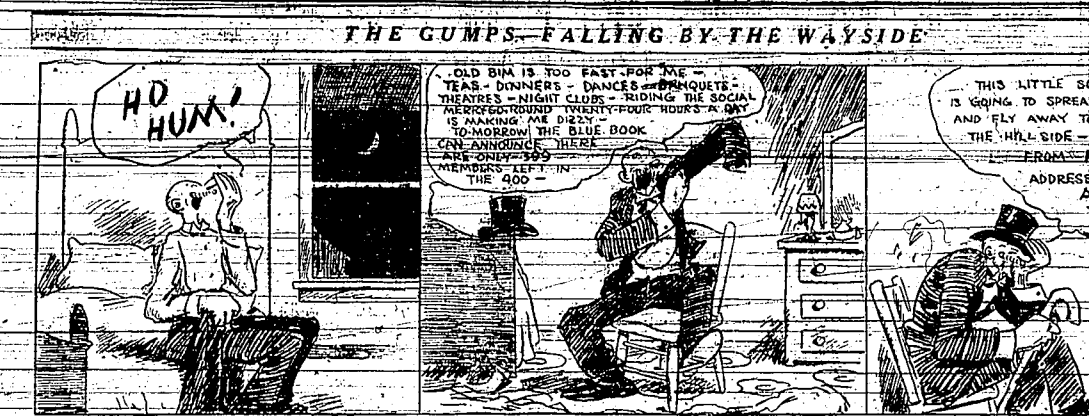
