CHICAGO, Jan. 7. (AP)—Stimulus for an advance in wheat came today from predictions by a noted speculator that part-of-the-growth world stocks will prove below normal. 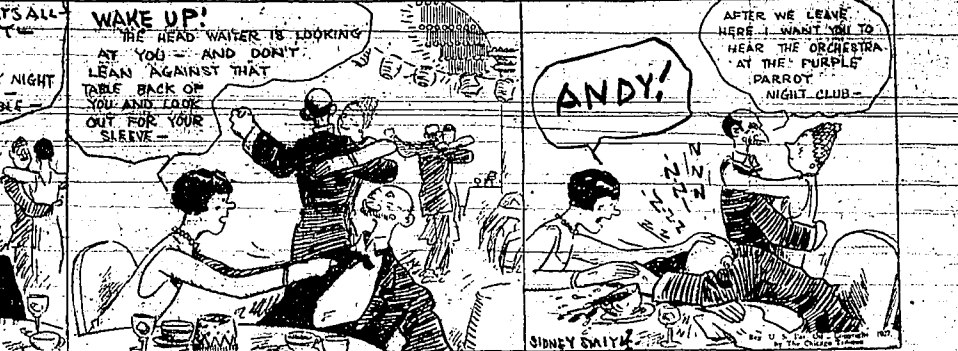
