

IDAHO DEBATORS HIGH DECISION ON LEGISLATION

Announcement That No Bills Will Be Introduced as Democratic Platform Measures Follows Joint Caucus.

(By The Associated Press) INTRODUCTION of bills by members of the nineteenth Idaho legislative session today at a joint house and senate caucus, announced that no bills would be introduced.

The resolution adopted follows: "The democrats in the legislature uniformly to support any measure in their bills their state platform or their party platform, and in fact any measure progressive legislation. But if they do not have a majority in either a publican action in the legislature or through the voters, any such measure should be dropped."

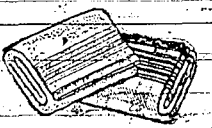
