WARGING PERIOD UNDER MEXICAN RULES EXPIRES

Peace of One Year Allowed Foreign Land Owners to Register Declarations Ends; New Angle Enters Situation.

(By The Associated Press) MEXICO CITY, Jan. 21.—With public interest centered on possible arbitration of the differences between Mexico and the United States, over the new oil-and-land laws, a new angle was added to the situation today, when all foreign landowners in Mexico became theoretically Mexican citizens as far as questions concerning their property is concerned.

Under the time-expiring provisions to register a declaration of their land ownership, the law will continue in force in accordance with article XVII of the Mexican constitution, and the alien land law enacted under it.

The law has been in effect one year, but a period of grace expiring today allows the foreign landowners to make a declaration. The law enacts a constitutional article which permits only Mexican-born citizens to own land in Mexico. It gives the Mexican government full power to grant property rights to foreigners who renounce the right of appeal to their home government in case of disputes.

It is understood that registration under the law will continue by the Mexican government as acceptance of its provisions, including the renunciation of the right of appeal, and that failure to register automatically moves the right of appeal.

The extent to which foreigners filed declarations throughout the country is not known and it may be some time before the report will be tabulated. Most of the time before application of the law will produce test cases in the courts and will present the question of what will happen if a foreigner declines to accept the law.

The right of appeal does in fact appeal from the courts to the government in enforcement of its property rights. No immediate developments are expected in foreign observers in this connection.

Ferguson, actually carried the office for political favoritism and financial gain. An investigating committee declared in a report to the legislature today.

The report charged that Ferguson, who was impeached as governor in 1917, was the principal figure in a scheme of dollars of state highway funds collected tribute from persons seeking state contracts and rewarded his friends at the expense of the state, while Mrs. Ferguson rubber stamped his actions.

It is his opinion that the only course under our existing laws is by impeachment, wrong done to our state by the chief executive under the dominion of his husband.

PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES

Idaho Farm Department to Fight Potato Injunction

New Commissioner of Agriculture Announces Only Course Open is to Enforce Grading Regulations.

(By The Associated Press) BOISE, Jan. 21.—Idaho's department of agriculture will fight the injunction proceedings brought against Idaho potato regulations made by A. W. B. Kjosness, former commissioner of agriculture, John F. Wain, newly appointed commissioner of agriculture declared in his first public statement, issued today.

WAIN has been in contact with Mr. Wain and declares his offers of settlement have been rejected by those supporting the injunction. Meanwhile, the department is making every effort to hold hearings on possible modifications for the movement of the 1927 crop.

TWIN FALLS SHIPPERS ACT

REGULATIONS sought to be enjoined never shipments of U. S. No. 1 and U. S. No. 2 grades of potatoes from the state if their produce were not to be plainly marked with the class of potatoes contained therein and that the regulations were to have become effective January 1 but certain Twin Falls shippers, opposing the rules, obtained a temporary injunction at their expense.

Text of Statement
