# CALL HALT IN SINGULAR CASE

## Justice Hitz Reverses Usual Court Procedure in Brief Session; Adjourned to Monday.

WASHINGTON, March 10 (AP)—Justice Hitz today called Monday for the resumption of the trial of Harry E. Sinclair, charged with the adultery of the defendant's wife. Justice Hitz reversed the usual court procedure by calling the jury and hearing himself the evidence which the state has offered before the 12 men selected to try the multimillionaire's case. The court adjourned to Monday.

### Defense Calls Witness

The defense then changed the ordinary courtroom scene by calling as its only witness, Martin W. Hildner, counsel for Sinclair. Hildner testified that it was upon his advice that the defendant refused to testify. He questioned upon his sixth appearance before the senate oil investigating committee.

Justice Hitz called the defendant to the stand, the defense lawyer placed into the record before Justice Hitz that the government sought to recover the Teapot Dome money was called by the committee and that in declining to answer questions regarding the issue of that money, the defendant was in violation of the law. The case had been transferred to the court.

While the trial will be resumed Monday morning, the jury will not be called into court again until that afternoon when Justice Hitz will call the defendant to the stand on the question of the present trial of evidence in the presence of the defendant.

# BRITISH ACCEPT COOLIDGE PLAN

## Proposal for Three Power Conference on Competitive Naval Building Finds Favor.

WASHINGTON, March 10 (AP)—American hopes for further ending competitive naval building received a long stride today when British acceptance of the three-power conference plan was received at the state department.

Word from Japan is still awaited, but with confidence assumed preparation of formal notes of invitation to military verbal agreements for a meeting at Geneva this summer has already begun.

Paralleling this definite step toward a three-power conference, news of the strong hope of Washington authorities that France and Italy ultimately will find it possible to participate in some degree.

The British acceptance was delivered verbally by Ambassador Howard to Acting Secretary Howe, Ambassador Martin Dyer, is expected to communicate Japanese acceptance as soon as he hears from Tokyo.

It is already certain that the formal invitations will contain no American proposal for extending the principles of the Washington treaty to auxiliary arms, but any such declaration that will prevent the free and open competition of every aspect of the question at Geneva.

### No Effort Toward Haste

There will be no effort to hasten the Washington government to hasten the Geneva deliberations, the American plan contemplates the most extensive consideration of the difficult economic and international questions involved with naval building programs in order that a maximum degree of limitation, consistent with national security, for each government may be obtained. It is that reason there will be no effort to propose a formula in advance probably not even as to ratios although the five-to-three Washington treaty agreement as to the more vital element of battleships and airplane carriers naturally may be expected to prevail.

## Reindeer Problem Confronts Alaska; Herds Grow Rapidly

NOAH, Alaska, March 10 (AP)—Reindeer, originally introduced into northern Alaska to ward off starvation of the Eskimos, today presents a problem which is commanding serious attention of government officials and private citizens alike.

The herd of 1200 imported into the territory in the four years prior to 1922 has multiplied so rapidly that it is estimated more than a half million are roaming the northern tundra, on the present basis of increase, within 10 years it is expected the number will approach 5,000,000, the maximum that can be handled successfully, say government experts.

The problem of what to do with the vast multiplying herds is one for which no satisfactory solution has yet been found.

Marking the meat in the States has been undertaken, but officially has been abandoned in favor of private sale. Not that it is less profitable than beef or other meat, but the incentives are slow to try a hitherto unknown commodity.

Reindeer breeding began in Alaska in 1891. The coming of the white man and his more efficient methods of killing salmon and whale had largely displaced the natives of their principal source of food. Stories of the plight of the starved Eskimos reached the States and with the aid of eastern newspapers about \$2500 was subscribed to bring reindeer in from Siberia. The United States coast guard cutter Heron landed 15 on the Alaska island, and shipments continued until 1,215 had been imported.

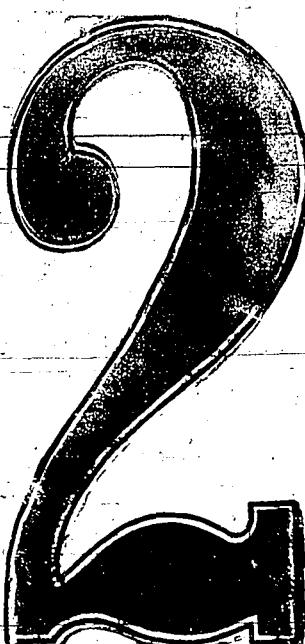

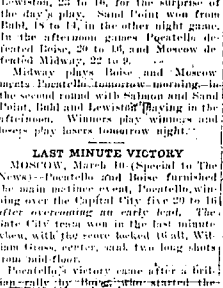

WASHINGTON, March 10 (AP)—Only \$235,000 of the Treasury notes of the series of 1890 remain in circulation. Part of the only government issue ever to be discontinued, they were first put out to pay for silver bullion purchased under the Sherman act, which authorized for coinage of the silver and redemption of the notes with silver dollars. No more notes of the series may be issued, and those in circulation are gradually being recalled and retired whenever supplied by the treasury. The floating supply has been furnished in this way from about \$20,000,000 in the last ten years.

## RICKARD WANTS NO IMPEDIMENT IN JACK'S PATH

Promoter Insists on Former Champ Fighting Way Back to Top, but Would Abolish Various Causes of Worry.

(By ALAN J. GOULD.) NEW YORK, March 10 (AP)—If Tex Rickard has his way about it, and he mainly does when it comes to debbing the heavyweight pugilistic code, Jack Dempsey's attempted comeback will not be impeded by economic necessities, personal greed, advancing tax laws or over-caution of advice.

Separately or collectively, all of these things have figured in published explanations of Dempsey's defeat by Gene Tunney in the historic battle of the seigni centennial. Rickard dismisses the "poison of the press" but does feel that worries over business and personal affairs helped account for Dempsey's downfall—that and a bit of real fighting out there, the edge that comes only from competition.

"I intend to see that Dempsey is free from all outside concerns this time," Rickard told the Associated Press. "His handlers will be carefully chosen and he will be able to put his mind solely on the business of fighting."

"Dempsey can come back only by regular fighting bouts that will give him real tests," the promoter went on. "He doesn't survive the preliminary; he will know that the 'hollo shell' they are advanced after the Tunney fight was contrived. If he gets a return fight with the champion he must earn it. I know him well enough to be convinced that he will put everything he has into this comeback."

In spite of Dempsey's showing against Tunney and doubt of his ability to regain his former prowess after experiencing only one ring battle in four years, a majority of metropolitan cities rate the former champion at the top of the surviving group of contenders. Jack Sharkey and Jim McInerney, boxed on May 11 at the Yankee stadium in one of the "scout finals," are rated close to Dempsey, whose first opponent in June is expected to be picked from these four—Faulstich, Tom Bracey, Johnny Risso and Jack Delaney.

Aristocratic Bivalve Being Developed for Use on Exclusive Dinner Tables of World.

OSTER HAY, N. Y., March 10 (AP)—The super oyster, sporting a pedigree not a pearl has arrived. The aristocratic bivalve has not yet left its laboratory nursery, but probably will be seen at the dinner table soon.

The blue-blooded mollusk is a direct descendant of the first families of aristocratic oysters. Its step mother is a cream separator. Its godfather is William Park Wells, biologist of the New York state conservation department.

The annual supply of oysters passed its peak in 1910 and has been dwindling ever since. Oyster men long ago began seeking means of artificial propagation, but were confronted with the difficult task of preventing the escape of millions of fry larvae when they changed the water in breeding tanks.

The boys were killed. S. Swanner, driver of the bus, did everything possible to avoid the accident.

OKLAHOMA CITY, March 10 (AP)—Two descendants of a mighty race of hunters, using the modern weapon of legislation, are leading a fight in Oklahoma to protect wild life from destruction.

Indians are directing the fish and game conservation program in both houses of the Oklahoma legislature. Senator Bill Graham of Nowata, a Cherokee, is chairman of the senate fish and game committee, and James Dyer of McCurtain county, a Choctaw, is vice chairman of the house fish and game committee.

Graham's committee has drafted the fish and game laws and offered the result to the legislature in the form of a bill. Proposed changes include the reduction of bag limits, shortening of seasons, protection of small fur-bearing animals and elimination of the professional trapper.

There are wild turkey still abundant in Oklahoma county. Dyer's name and it is his wish to perpetuate the benefits of the great outdoors for his descendants.

"It is an instinct in us Indians to kill only the game we can eat," Dyer said. "If that practice is carried out, game never will become extinct."

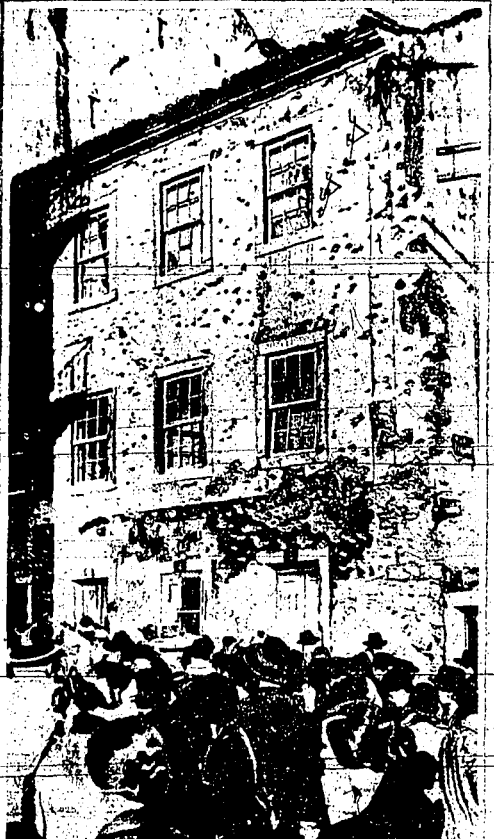

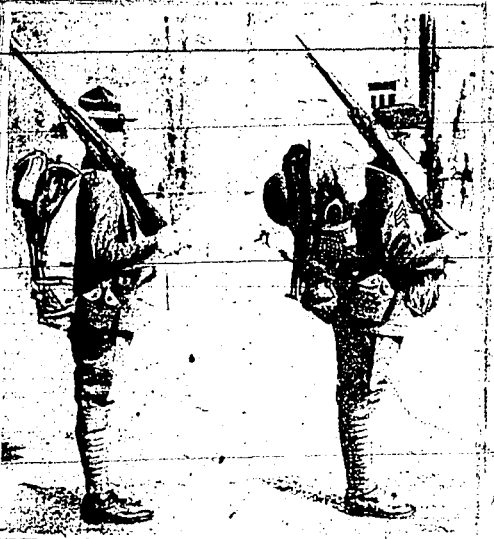
