23 COUNTIES, RECEIVE PAYMENT ON BACK TAXES

WASHINGTON, April 11 (AP)—Payment of approximately \$10,000,000 in back taxes to 23 counties in Oregon and Washington has been approved by the interior department. The interest for land formerly held by the Oregon land reformers and taken over by the government in 1915. One of the largest payments is to Douglas county, Oregon, which will receive \$1,774,000. Several to other counties run into several hundred thousand dollars.

Comptroller General McCast, to whom the recommendation for payment is submitted by the interior department after the amount is determined, has approved that in Douglas county.

Under Twin Falls, new city administration as organized Monday evening following the municipal election of last Tuesday, Mayor Richard E. Holler assumed today the functions of commissioner of public affairs, but he will become responsible for the work of the sanitary department, including garbage collection.

Under the preceding administration supervision of the police department was delegated to the mayor, and W. J. Leslie as commissioner of public safety had charge of the fire and sanitary departments.

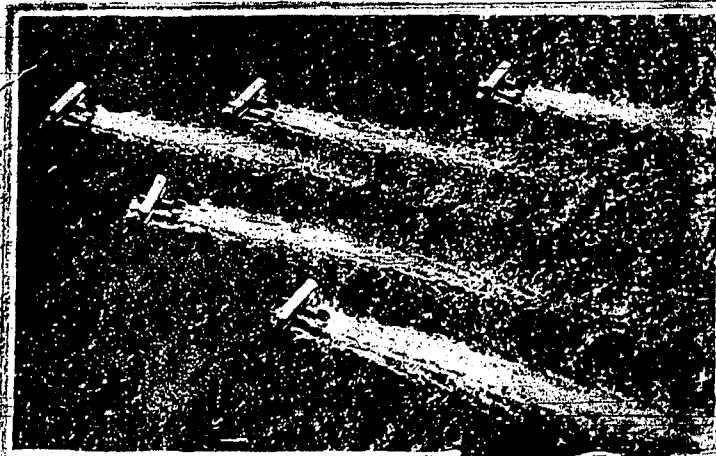

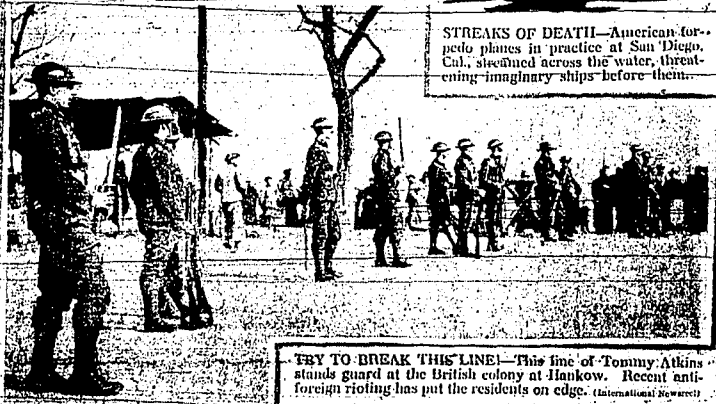
STREAKS OF DEATH—American torpedo planes in practice at San Diego, Cal., steamed across the water, threatening imaginary ships before them.



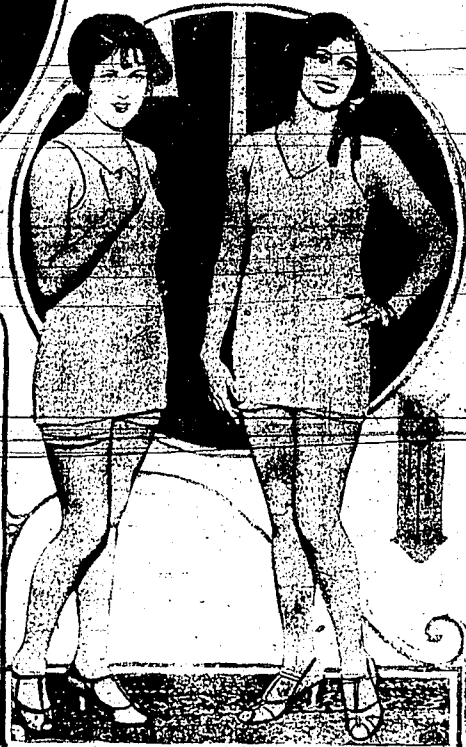

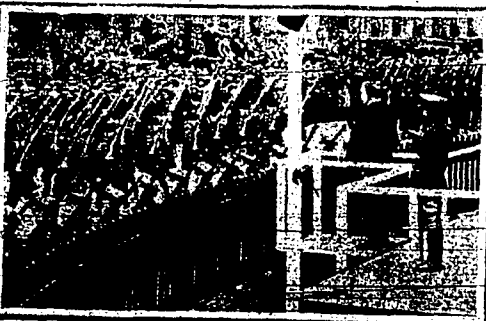

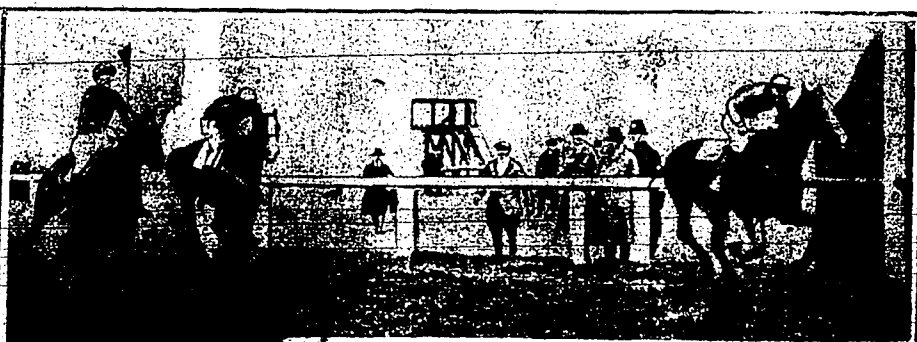

(By The Associated Press) PARIS, April 11.—The notaries, for centuries a powerful figure in French life, has lost his proud position. The notaries claim they are "starving to death" and are calling for union, for common and going on strike. They want the days which popular belief held their greatest worry was where to store their money.

The government has doubted the financial value of their work, but with paper francs worth only one-fifth of their former value the notaries claim the work hardly pays the clerks who do the work. Also increasing contracts are becoming rare; people with money to invest are doing their own investing, and more and more persons are doing business through large corporations.

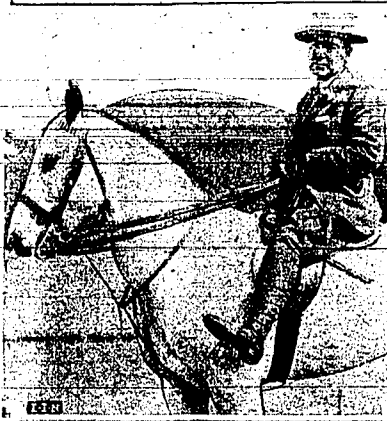

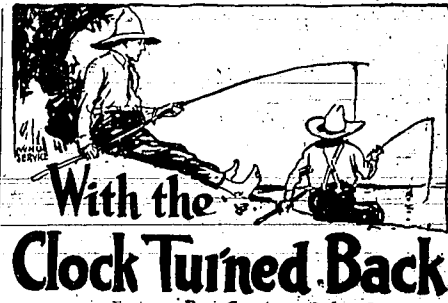

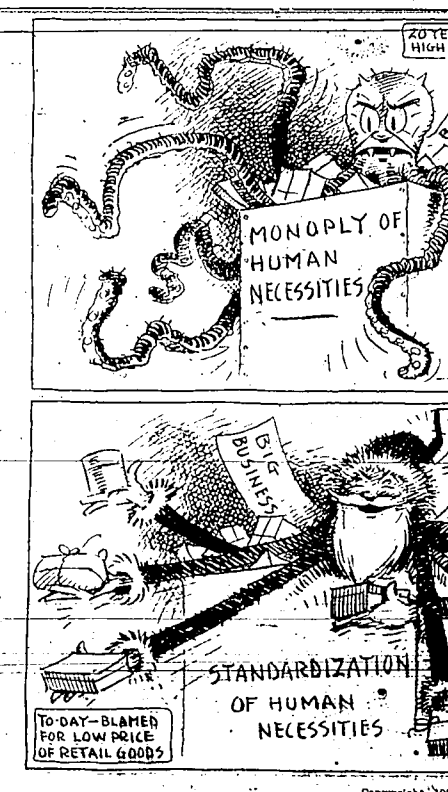
