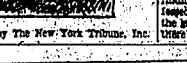

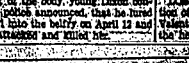

COUNCIL APPROVES ESTIMATE OF CITY'S EXPENSES FOR YEAR

Annual Appropriation Bill Totals \$68,225; Accumulated Funds Available for Present Administration Needs.

An appropriation bill providing for all Twin Falls municipal expenditures during the fiscal year just opened Monday, except waterworks, bond sinking fund and interest, and municipal bond maintenance, was adopted by Twin Falls city council in regular session last evening. Estimated expenditures set forth in the bill total \$68,225, and include provision for city scales, street improvements and other institutions or works that have been permitted to be undertaken during a normal regime of the past five or six years.

Under interpretation of article given by E. H. Director, city attorney, will not be necessary to levy a tax for the purposes listed in excess of the maximum ten-mills levy for purposes listed, but a credit of approximately \$23,000 that has accumulated through collection of "levy" for warrant redemption may be drawn upon to balance the budget.

This fund, the city attorney advised, should be regarded as a buffer account to be drawn upon as needed to meet actual requirements and prevent defaults.

Employees Begin Work With the opening of the new fiscal year, newly elected city employees entered their positions. O. M. Hall, city treasurer-elect, took the oath of office and filed his official bond and acceptance of the office. He will succeed Mrs. Katherine Provost, retiring treasurer. Miss Blanche Walker will return to the city hall today to become waterworks department clerk.

The council at this session received and accepted the resignation of E. W. Berg as city engineer, and elected Harold William Merrill, county surveyor, to fill the vacancy. Mr. Berg, who has served for a number of years as city engineer, expects to leave Friday for Aberdeen, Idaho, to become manager of the Aberdeen-Spokane irrigation project.

In his capacity as Twin Falls boy scout commissioner, Mr. Berg last evening asked and received permission of the council for the scouts to parade on Shoshone street and Main avenue next Friday. In connection with observance here of bow-tie week.

Excludes Filling Station On his third reading last evening, an ordinance prohibiting installation or operation of service stations within 250 feet of Shoshone street between Fourth avenue and the Washington school was adopted by unanimous vote of the council. 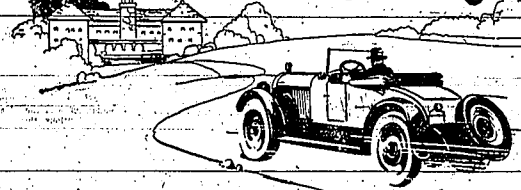

CONDUCT FRUITLESS THREE-DAY HUNT FOR OAKLEY RANGEMAN

Combined Efforts of 200 Persons Fail to Reveal Whereabouts of John Alexander, 38, Missing Since Friday.

OAKLEY, May 2 (Special to The News)—Three days of searching, combing hills and valleys, by as many as 200 residents of this community, fails to reveal the whereabouts of John Alexander, Oakley ranger, who left his place about 0:30 Friday morning and who has not been heard from since.

Alexander, a native of Oakley, left his wife and five children on the ranch Friday morning without saying where he was going and when he did not return in the evening Mrs. Alexander advised her relatives that she immediately began an organized search of adjacent territory in an effort to locate the missing man. The hunt reached its climax Sunday. More than 200 persons under the leadership of Eugene Pickett, Cassia county sheriff, combed hills and valleys with no uncovering a single clue.

Last June 1 Alexander was committed to the state institution for the insane at Blackfoot, where he subsequently underwent an operation for ulcers of the stomach and chronic appendicitis. He was paroled from the institution about two months later and when that time he was attending to his ranch duties here with every indication of permanent improvement.

His disappearance was reported by his missing man, broadcast today by Oakley authorities in the hope that it might bring in the missing man. Alexander, 38 years, height, 5 feet 10 inches, weight, 165 pounds, dark-complexioned and neatly built. He had just had all teeth extracted and was dressed in a blue work shirt, heavy hat, big overalls and heavy work shoes. When he left home Alexander was carrying a gun.

The search, according to Mr. Pickett, will be prosecuted until Alexander is located or until hope for finding him has been abandoned.

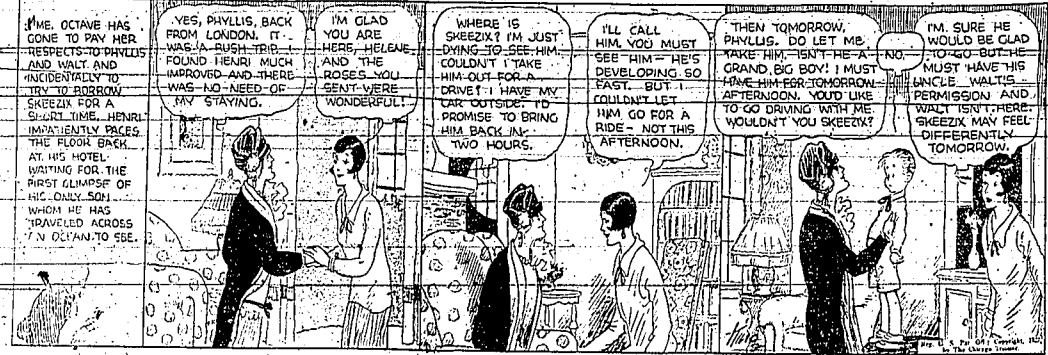

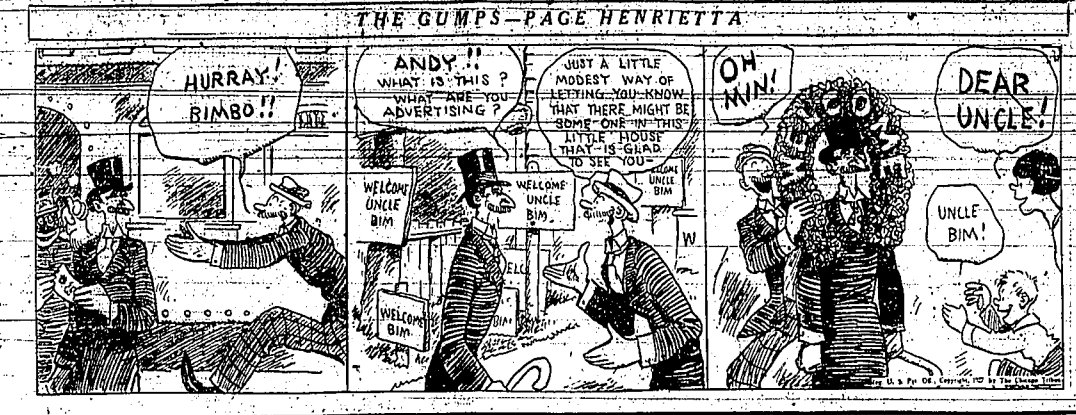

RED CROSS WORKERS START FLOOD RELIEF CAMPAIGN OVER CITY

Local Chapter, in Response to Telegram for Additional Funds, Organizes for Concentrated Drive Today.

Twin Falls county's quota for Missions flood relief work was raised Monday from \$1000 to \$2000. Chairman George Blach of the local chapter of the Red Cross, announced following receipt of a telegram from W. G. Hunt of San Francisco, regional director of the Red Cross. The telegram called attention to the appeal of President Coolidge for an additional \$5,000,000 issued at the instigation of Secretary Hoover and other relief leaders in the flood zone.

At a meeting of the local chapter's board of directors held in probate court here Monday evening it was decided to start an active drive today throughout the city in an effort to go over the top of this humanitarian work. Twin Falls county is divided into four zones with Main avenue and Shoshone street as dividing lines. Committees were appointed to work and given territory as follows:

Zone 1—City Drive Planned. Chairman, northwest zone; Kliment committee, W. E. Nixon, chairman, northeast; American Legion, Dr. W. P. Parker, chairman, southwest; Business and Professional Women's committee, Mrs. John W. Adair, chairman, southeast. Mrs. E. B. Simpson and Mrs. L. O. Kirkman will head a special committee to call upon all church organizations in the city. The other workers will call upon organizations, professional men and business houses, placing their funds in pay-station boxes in theatres, banks, drug and department stores.

No further check-up of funds was made Monday evening, the board being too busy outlining a program to cope with the new situation. Seriousness of the situation was stressed in Mr. Hunt's telegram which read:

"Upon recommendation Hoover and Plessler, just returned from disaster area, central committee national Red Cross decided in view of last increase in flooded-area emergency situation now demands minimum of ten millions. This means doubling original quota each chapter. If you, have already raised double original quota, please continue effort to secure half amount as possible. In this crisis we are confident we can depend upon continuation your loyal and devoted efforts."

BEET ACREAGE NEAR BOONUS REQUIREMENT

Surplus—Continues to Make Gain of Higher Price and Factory Operation.

In order to make certain the planting of sufficient acreage of sugar beets in the Twin Falls district this season to insure operation of the Twin Falls factory and payment of a bonus to growers, a campaign for beet acreage is being continued for a few days, although the total acreage reported by growers' contracts was figured Saturday to exceed the required 5000 acres. It was stated Monday in the Annanulated Sugar company offices here.

The check up showed 5000 acres reported by growers' contracts. Experience in past seasons, it was stated, has shown that the actual acreage may fall as high as five per cent below the contracted acreage, and it is to offset this possible decline that the sign up campaign is being continued. Bonus For Growers With 5000 acres planted in sugar beets in this district this season, growers will be entitled to a "bonus" price of \$8 per ton for their beets, instead of \$7.50 that would be paid if a lesser acreage were grown, and the Twin Falls country will be assured of the operation next fall and winter of the sugar factory here.

The campaign for increasing the sugar beet acreage was launched some two or three weeks ago and is being conducted by a growers' organization.

Mercury in Twin Falls started the month of May with a toboggan slide, dropping to 67 degrees for Sunday night and taking an upward plunge to 57 for Monday, maximum. A high wind Sunday helped drive the mercury downward, while Monday evening it seemed headed toward freezing temperature of its own accord.
