ENGLISH PRINCES ARE DANCE HONORS RIVALS

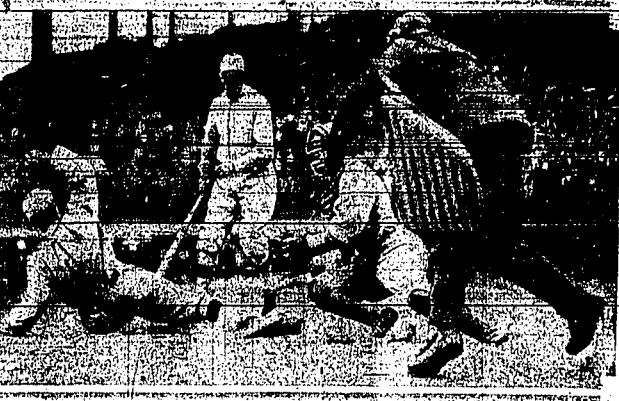
Famous Englishman and Brother-in-Law With One Another for Dancing Reputation.

Nationally characteristics were found to be an important factor in the consumption of the Oregon prune. Only one in 10 of the housewives interviewed outside the Jewish group knew of more than one prune variety. Jewish housewives expressed a preference for the tart Oregon prune in mixing heavy slugs.

The old saying that "All prunes are stoned prunes" was partly borne out in the survey. Practically every housewife used them in this form, while 80 per cent served them principally for breakfast.

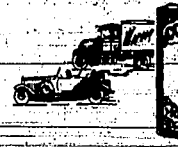

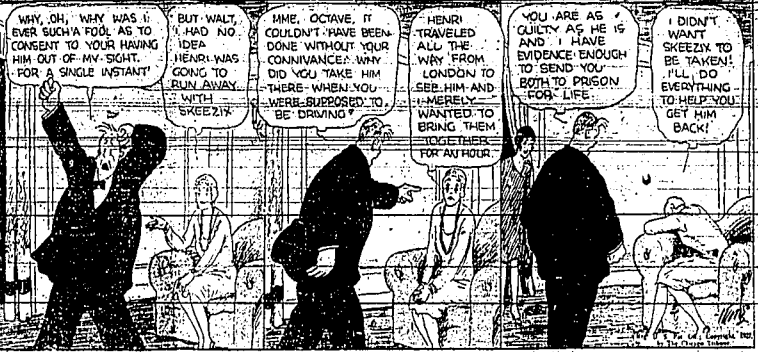

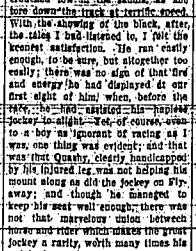

Supplies of Metal Reported Diminishing; United States Uses One-Half of World Output

WASHINGTON, May 4.—Tin supplies are reported diminishing due to the increasing demand for the metal, says a bulletin from the Washington, D. C. headquarters of the National Geographic Society.

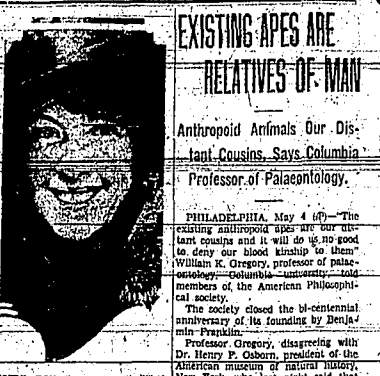
