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HUGE SPUD CELLAR NEARS COMPLETION

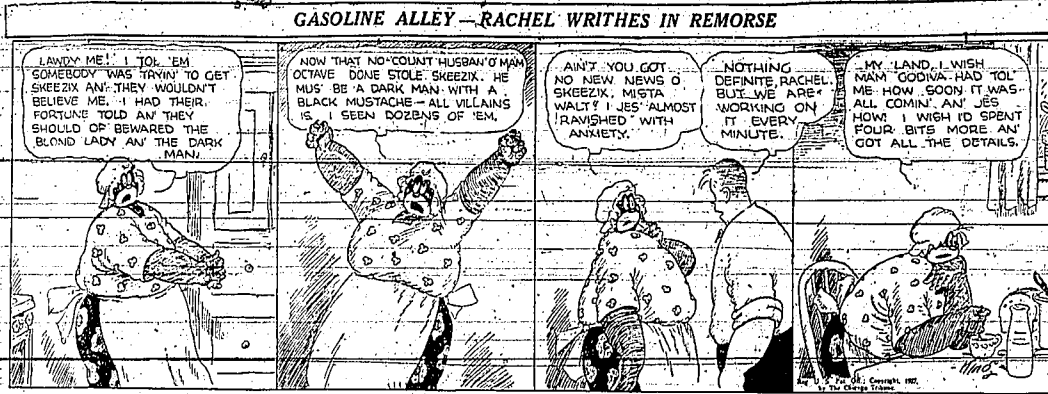
Bohl Man Constructing Extensive Basement for Accommodation of 110 Cars Potatoes.

DUKE May's Special To The News... The basement, which is nearly completed, and will take care of men and the spud-bone heads in a few days, to cut piles for the covering and supports of the structure.

Largest Cellar In Territory... The cellar will be the largest in the section of the county, being 100 feet wide by 300 feet long, with two driveways through lengthwise. Potatoes will be stored in bins loosely, which, according to Mr. Gray, assures better ventilation also a more even distribution of weight—catch—makes for better keeping.

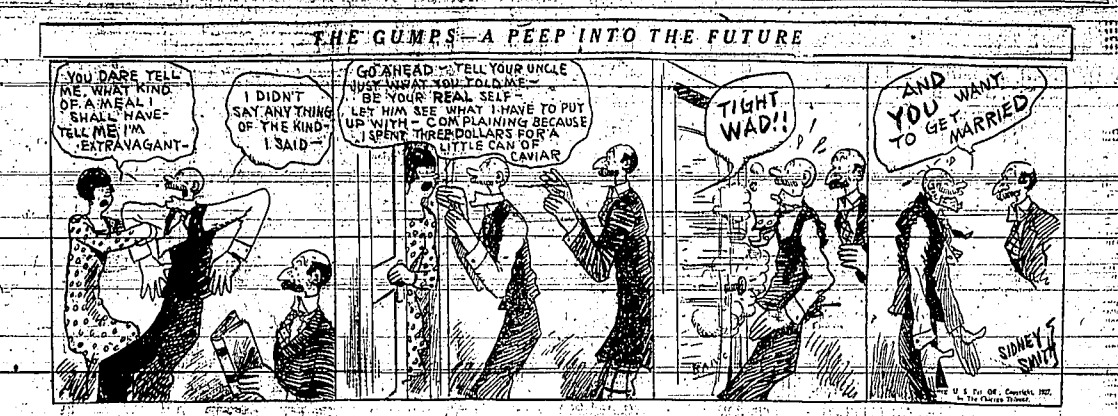

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MARSHALS ARGUMENT FOR RIGHT TO BUILD GAS FILLING STATION

Continental Oil Company Brands City's Denial of Permit as Arbitrary and Discriminatory.

Twin Falls city administration's refusal to grant a permit for construction of a new gas filling station at the end of Sherman street across the street from the Washington school, according to a newspaper complaint filed in district court here Friday by Walters & Torrey, attorneys for the Continental Oil company, is arbitrary, discriminatory and unreasonable.

The amended complaint was filed in the district court by the Continental Oil company about two weeks ago to restrain the city from interfering with its construction of the proposed service station.

In its original complaint the Continental company attacked the validity of an ordinance which the building department was asked to enforce.

The amended complaint contains a number of allegations which are the basis of the city's action. It is alleged that the city's action is arbitrary and discriminatory.

The ordinance provides for the location and operation of service stations within 500 feet of a school house is discriminatory, the amended complaint says. There is no similar prohibition against public garages, drive-in theatres, hotels, restaurants, liquor stores, banks, saloons, barber shops, cigar stores, billiard parlors, etc.

See Discernance.

Permits now are being granted, the complaint asserts, for drive-in roller stands, curb-pumps and "other devices of greater danger to public health, safety and morals than the proposed gasoline service station."

The site in question which the Continental company has owned for some time, it is asserted, is chiefly valuable for use as a service station; the proposed station will be not less than 500 feet from the school; no children pass on two of the streets by which the property is bounded; and it is further asserted, that establishment and operation of the proposed station will not increase the number of automobiles passing the property or create unusual or extraordinary noises or odors.

Construction of the proposed station has been halted in obedience to an order of a temporary restraining order issued in district court on application of Twin Falls Independent school district.
