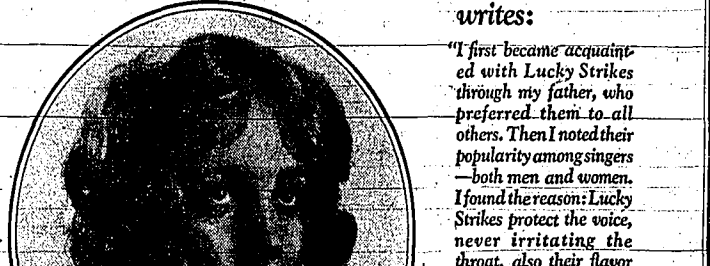

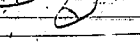

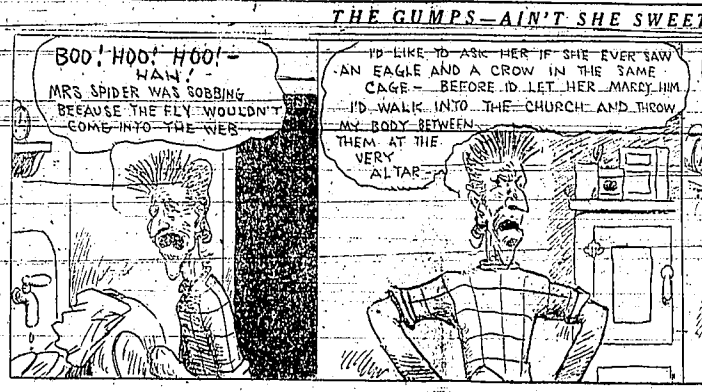

NEW PHASE ENTERED IN DEVELOPMENT OF MINES OF JARBIDGE

Mining Men See Possibilities for District in Nevada in Installation of Machinery to Handle Concentrates.

With the installation of a heavy crusher weighing 1500 pounds, Jarbidge, Nevada, mining men believe that the Guggenheim interests are preparing for extensive development of Jarbidge, ore bodies lately uncovered in the Arizona gold mines at Jarbidge. These operations, it is believed, must be conducted on a scale that will attract general attention to the district.

The big crusher was taken off freight cars at Bogertown this week and is being transported by wagon over the road to Jarbidge.

Ore heretofore taken by the Guggenheim interests from the Ekron property has been oxidized or free milling ore that has been converted into bullion at the Ekron mill. The ore of this character, which is known among miners as "grass roots" ore, is extensive in this district, to a depth of from 1200 to 1500 feet.

Involves Smelting Development of the Telluride or non-oxidized ore requires use of heavy crushing machinery for making of concentrates. Reduction of concentrates requires smelting process. The use of this machinery will be conducted at Jarbidge, that the Ekron company will make provision for hauling out of this district and will contract with the railway for shipment to Salt Lake City, or will construct its own smelter at Jarbidge.

SPEAKERS MID IN DRIVE FOR COLLEGE OF IDAHO

Christian Education to be Topic for Five Addresses to Be Made Soon in Twin Falls.

Christian education will be the topic for five addresses in Twin Falls Sunday, when four special field representatives of the Presbyterian board of Christian education speak in local churches. Dr. Newman H. Burdick of Helena, Montana, will speak at the Presbyterian church in the morning and at the Methodist church in the evening. Judge J. A. Kennedy of Louisville, Kentucky, will speak at the Baptist church, and Rev. Daniel J. Kerr of St. Paul, Minnesota, at the Christian

church. The latter two services will both be in the morning. The speakers have had much experience in connection with colleges in every section of the country. The work in Twin Falls will consist of the College of Idaho in the educational scheme of the Northwest. The funds will be collected at the services.

For the past three weeks these speakers have been working in various southern Idaho cities and in all the services have been received with interest by the congregation. The College of Idaho at Caldwell has advanced during the past few years until it has an enrollment of more than 100 young men and women seeking a higher education. Twin Falls territory is well represented in the student body. The college is standard in every way. It is not attempting to expand to any great extent at this time, but rather to maintain the high standards already in use, at the college and to strengthen

The poppies, which are replicas of the world war veterans' flower, have been made by inmates of veterans' hospitals, and those to be sold here were made by veterans in the hospital at Boise. Entire proceeds of the poppy sale will be sent to the disabled veterans.

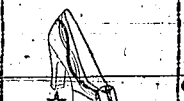

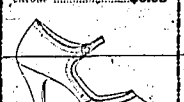

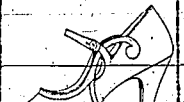
