LINDBERGH'S OFF RETURN TRIP TO CAPITAL OF FRANCE

Famous American Flier Departs in British Plane From London for Paris; Crowds Cheer Enthusiastically; Two Escorts

(By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS) LONDON, June 2 (AP)—The famous American flier, Charles Lindbergh, returned to the capital of France today for his return trip to Paris.

He was met at the airport by a large crowd of Frenchmen and at that time passed his flight indefinitely.

WEATHER HAD THURSDAY LONDON, June 2 (AP)—A severe rain storm today forced Captain Charles A. Lindbergh to postpone his return to Paris.

With that care and quiet thoroughness which characterized his preparations, Lindbergh left London today for Paris in a biplane.

He had tea with the officers and tonight he slept at their mess—among them the talk his language of aeronautics to a woman he is as much a hero as he is to the crowds who have followed him in France, Belgium and England.

CONCENTRATION OF MARINES UNDER WAY

American Forces Move to Tientsin Area of Northern China Prepared for Any Emergency

WASHINGTON, June 2 (AP)—Further steps in the concentration of United States marine forces in the Tientsin area of northern China for the "better position to protect American lives and property in the event of an emergency" were reported tonight.

Advised cable by Admiral Williams, commanding the Asiatic fleet, mentioned only about 3000 of the marines in the Asiatic area and did not state the disposition of the remainder.

170 to Tientsin Official dispatches yesterday were to the effect that 1700 marines from the Philippine Islands, had left three or four days ago for Tientsin and made no mention of stopping at Shanghai.

The second dispatch received today said that about 1500 marines were being sent from Shanghai to Tientsin, near the coast of northern China.

He declared his wife would have the care and support of their children. Charles declared he and his wife had no children.

Chaplin pictured himself as a loving, kind husband, and his wife as a cold and extravagant woman.

STATISTICS FAVORABLE FOR CALVIN COOLIDGE

WASHINGTON, June 2 (AP)—President Coolidge was today voted by James Francis Burke of Pittsburg, former secretary of the republican national committee, that a national survey of "most available" of the republican party had shown Mr. Coolidge to be the choice of 78 per cent of the "most available" presidential candidates.

Frank O. Lowden of Illinois, was endorsed by 10 per cent. Mr. Burke said the "most available" candidates were Lowden, 10 per cent; those other candidates.

Governor Smith of New York was named by 80 per cent as the "most available" candidate.

CLEAN LIVING FOR YOUNG MEN
MEMORIAL OF FRANK S. LAND

Direction of Lives of Rising Generation to Proper Path Purpose of Great Founder.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., June 2 (AP)—Directing the lives of young men into a proper path is the aim of Frank S. Land, Kansas City, founder of the Order of the Molly.

Land, 37 years old, directs the De Moly organization through which more than 200,000 young men have pledged themselves to clean living. The order, with some 1,500 chapters in all parts of the world, began in a modest way. During the early months of 1910 it was the habit of young men to gather in Land's office to talk over their affairs. He at that time was secretary of the social service department of the Scottish Rite bodies of Kansas City. One night, after some weeks of thought on the matter, Land suggested an organization. The young men received the suggestion enthusiastically and Dr. Moly was the result.

All of the youths were between the ages of 18 and 21, so it was decided to make these the age limits. Later the Scottish Rite bodies of Kansas City sponsored the first chapter and in a few months more than 1,000 young men had joined. The organization is non-sectarian.

The first chapter meeting of the organization was April 1, 1912 and Louis G. Lower, Kansas City, was the first Dr. Moly.

The organization took its name from Jacques De Moly, the "last" military grand master of the Knights Templar, who was executed in 1314. Land is in the River Side near Park, March 18, 1914. Land had often told the young men of his admiration for DeMoly was their favorite.

Land based the teachings of the order on love of parents, reverence, industry, duty, courtesy, nobility, self-help, and fidelity. He says all these things are natural with youth and that if they are taught and cultivated they are not properly developed. The order has chapters in every state, the United States, Panama Canal Zone, Porto Rico, Philippine Islands, Italy and France, a chapter in the United States battle fleet, and recently had a temporary chapter on the floating university cruise.

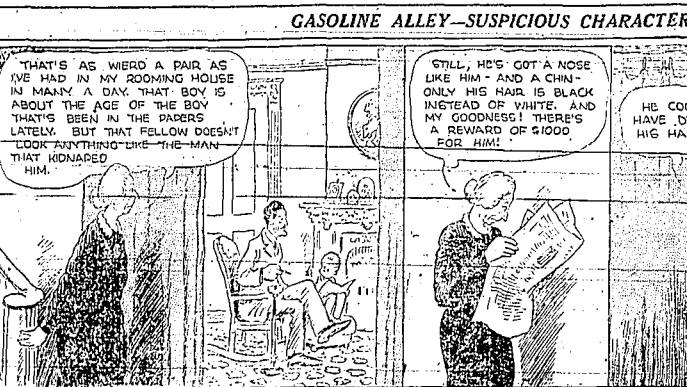
