TWIN TRAIN BANDITS CHARGED WEST TO ANSWER FOR MURDER

Ray and Roy De Autremont Depart With Officers for Columbus, Ohio, to Await Extradition to State of Oregon.

(By The Associated Press) ST. LOUIS, June 10.—After nearly four days of scouting the law, Ray and Roy De Autremont, 27-year-old twins, tonight were on the first leg of their journey back to Oregon where they face charges of mauling robbery and murder.

High Noon On Trial The two brothers were arrested here Wednesday night. Their younger brother, Roy, is now on trial at Jacksonville, Oregon, for murder. He is charged with participation in the attempted holdup from which not one dollar was obtained.

From a front seat in the little courtroom, Ray De Autremont's young wife looked on with her eyes fixed on her husband.

That was their farewell and as she spoke the words, she swooned in her seat.

Sometime later, with her son and \$200 which federal officers took from her husband's pocket, she left St. Louis, to go back to the farm home near Hanging Rock, Ohio.

# Pictures Recount Milestones in Life of Charles Augustus Linbergh, Hero of the Day



CHARLES AUGUSTUS LINBERGH was born in Detroit, Michigan, on February 2, 1902, to Mrs. Evangelina Land Linbergh, the widow of L. Landbergh, a farmer, and later congressman, of Little Falls, Minn. Pictures above show Charles at an early age, his mother, and his late father, and the young man in his first days as an aviator. Four parachute leaps saved his life on four different times, and he won attention by his skill in handling a machine.

THE LURE OF THE New York-to-Paris flight got into Lindbergh, and on May 21 he hopped off to Paris. He made the flight alone without wireless, and with no reserve rations. He succeeded, and became the world's hero overnight. France, Belgium and England paid him tribute, and now America honors him. Picture shows how he appeared over Paris, a closeup, and part of one of the many enthusiastic mobs that besieged him.

## SPEEDY BATTLESHIP SLIPS IN BETWEEN CAPES WITH AIRMAN

Lindbergh Nears End of Another Triumphant Journey; First Welcome Carried Far to Sea by Four Destroyers.

By The Associated Press. CAPE HENRY, Va., June 10.—Hearing another triumphant journey's end, Charles Augustus Linbergh, the aviator, was met at the wharf today by the cutter Memphis. While the official welcome waits tomorrow at Washington, the young hero of the New York to Paris flight, was met by the cutter Memphis from the air, the sea, and the land. As the trans-Atlantic cutter slipped between the Virginia capes, army and navy planes circled overhead, carrying one more to Lindbergh's joy the exact mile of the propeller's drone. Excursion craft, and motor boats, headed to the wharves, which had waited behind the protecting lee of Cape Henry, rushed out into the lower Chesapeake bay to give the aviator a noisy welcome from their whistle and rattle.

## CONGRESSMAN SMITH DETECTS OVERSIGHT

Failure of State, Publicity Board to Mention Twin Falls Section and Irrigated Lands Noted

People of this section do not understand the failure of the state advertising campaign omitting the resources of the Twin Falls section, Congressman Smith, today told Governor H. C. Hulme in a telegram sent to the state chief executive yesterday. The telegram sent by Congressman Smith, after hearing that the advertising copy being prepared for the congressional campaign, omitted the resources of the Twin Falls section, and in looking over the advertising matter prepared for publication in various newspapers, intended to benefit Idaho. It was greatly surprised to find no reference to the irrigated section in the Snake River valley, between American Falls and Hazelton, nor to the scenic section including Shoshone, Blaine, Lakes, the Hansen bridge, and the rim-to-rim bridge north of Twin Falls City, which has the largest and finest highway bridge in the United States. As the appropriation for publicity purposes is paid from the general fund, the people in this section do not understand why some mention was not made of the opportunities for settlers and attractions for tourists in Minidoka, Cassia and Twin Falls counties.

## Idaho Woman Tells Preparations for American Legion Convention in Paris

The parade of the 25 departments of the American Legion, which will inaugurate the ninth annual convention of the American Legion in Paris on September 10, will be in the ranks the veterans of all the allied and associated nations of the great world. Mrs. W. H. DeWelle, president of the Idaho American Legion, women's auxiliary and chairman of its Paris convention committee, with this parade, which will number about 25,000 people, comes swinging down the Avenue des Champs-Elysees and along the Grand Boulevard, groups of varying numbers from a few representatives of the host, distant countries, to whole regiments of French cavalry veterans and regular troops, will assist in making this parade a memorable event, for those who are fortunate enough to see it. This great mingling of the flag and representation of the former combatants will be the most significant gathering since the Victory parade of July 14, 1919. The French military and civilian officials have done everything in their power to aid the France convention committee of the American Legion in its advance arrangements for this convention which will bring no less than 30,000 persons to Paris. Of this great number, only 100 will be the mothers, wives, daughters and sisters of Legionnaires. (Continued From Page One) Hay Crop Outlook. Hay crop outlook for the first three weeks of May, harvesting of the crop will be 15 days later than last year. The crop crop is 81 per cent of normal for June 10. The crop is one point better than last year and eight points ahead of the 10-year average. Harvesting of Idaho growers are more encouraging than last year because of the apparent reduction in the United States crop. The peach production is estimated at 120,000 bushels while late spring frosts reduced cherry and apricot production. Sugar beets are reported in fair shape. With excellent root-moisture conditions rapid growth will result with the coming of warmer weather. There is little evidence of the "white fly" pest.

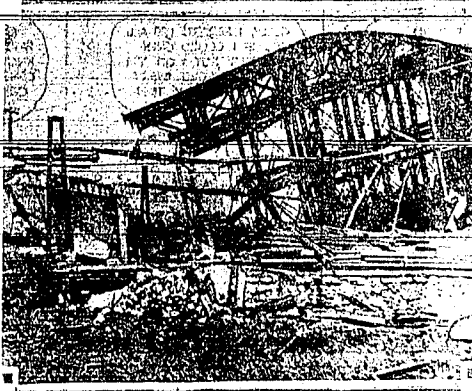

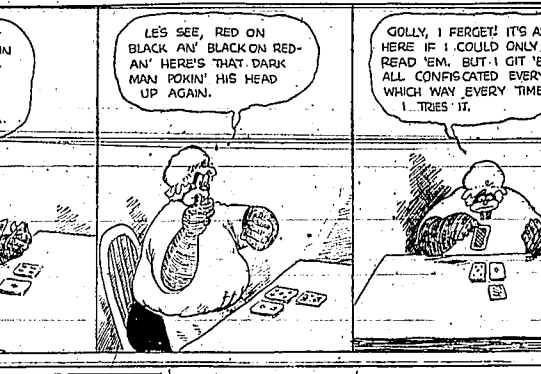
