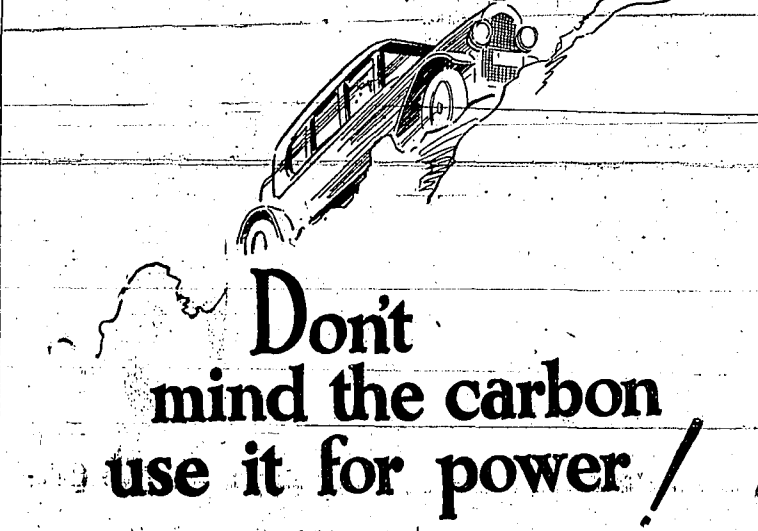

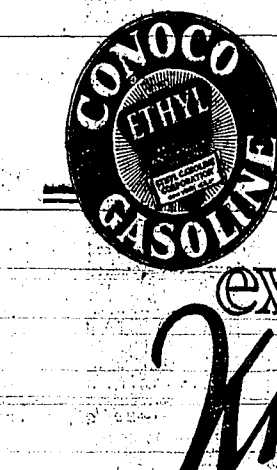

## BADE RUTH HEADING FOR HIGH HONORS

### Famous American Batsman Is Nearing Rightful Place Among Ten Leading League Hitters.

CHICAGO, June 20 (AP)—It won't be long now until Babe Ruth is up in the "rightful place" among the first 10 hitters of the American league. Starting the season with a .347 batting average, he has climbed a few notches at a time, until he is fifteenth in the list of regulars today, in figures including Wednesday's game, with a mark of .410. Along with his ordinary base hits, the Babe has kept pace with the checking home runs, making home runs of 1921. Fifteen of his 64 hits have been for extra bases, among them home runs.

Crowded out of first place in the American league hitters for a few weeks, Bing Miller of St. Louis, was snatched back into the front, with the only .400 mark of the circuit.

Dykes Newcomer

This week's newcomer among the sluggers is Jimmy Dykes of Philadelphia, who made nine hits in his five games, sending him from displaced place to fifth.

St. Louis veteran, displaced here by teammate Ken Williams in tenth place, below whom are Johnny Hottelmann, Old Zax, Wilentz, Jimmie and Dud Glancy, and the White Sox first base find.

There are four players with eight stolen bases apiece, on the trail of the league leader, Goose Goslin of Washington, who passed the first two more weeks to total 10. At St. Louis, George Burns, Bill Hunsfield and Lou Bairo are in the line.

The two White Sox players, Ted Lyons and Al Thomas, stand out conspicuously among the Johnson circuit pitchers with their victories running into double figures. Lyons has won nine in a row, with 12 altogether, and Thomas has grasped victory 10 times. The Yankees broke Thomas' winning streak, but Lyons hurled the Sox to their only victory over New York to keep his string clean.

Miller, St. Louis, .404; Gehrig, New York, .389; Schang, St. Louis, .388; Simmons, Philadelphia, .387; Dykes, Philadelphia, .378; Meusel, New York, .371; Cobb, Pittsburgh, .361; Goulin, Washington, .351; Fothergill, Detroit, .357; Glavin, St. Louis, .352.

Frankie Fritch is now right on the heels of his rival, Rogers Hornsby, only two points separating them in the batting average compile today, including Wednesday's games. Hornsby's slump has carried him on to 150, while Fritch gained to 351. The absence of manager McGraw on an ivory hunt, leaving the managerial duties solely to Hornsby, probably affected his batting eye on this western trip.

The ex-senator, Joe Harris, who was waived out of the American league, has become the sensation of the Harder loop, and has raised his clotting mark to .451. His good example has inspired Barnhart, the Pirates' new outfielder, and Paul Waner, until the three Dreyfus boys are now clustered at the top of the column. Barnhart also having a line .400 mark.

# SOVIET FARM AREA MORE THAN IN PRE-WAR DAYS

MOSCOW, June 20 (AP)—For the first time since the revolution the total cultivated area in the Soviet Union has passed pre-war figures.

Best chairman of the people's commissars, told the All-Russian congress of Soviets that while the total yield for the year 1925 was only 48 per cent of that of 1913, the last pre-revolution year, the sown area exceeded the total for that year.

He announced that mechanical cultivation of the land showed a marked increase. He estimated that 100,000 tractors in use throughout the union at 13,600 and said the production of agricultural machinery exceeded pre-war records by 20 per cent.

Like progress, he continued, was shown in industrial development, and he expressed the opinion that the present year would see more marked results. Funds allocated to industrial projects for 1927 total 240,000,000 rubles (in round numbers \$170,000,000).

An agricultural machinery factory is to be built at Balaichon, a tractor factory at Stalingrad on the Volga, metal works at Kerch on the sea of Azov and at Magad, a number in the Urals and six oil refining plants at Turp in the Caucasus, he said.
