MONTANA INVESTORS OBTAIN LEASE UPON LITTLE VALLEY MINE

Butte People to Begin Immediate Development Work on Intermountain Company's Gold and Placer Ground.

Butte Montana, mining investors have leased from the Intermountain Mining company of Twin Falls, 1000 acres of gold and platinum mining ground in the Little Valley region, Owyhee county.

The lease and option on the property runs for five years. Development work is to be inaugurated at once, it was announced.

Ores bearing gold values of \$125 per ton have been taken from this prospect, and assays are reported to have been made of samples taken from other properties in this field showing gold values as high as \$200 per ton and platinum \$2500 per ton.

The property is situated about five miles west of Bruneau and 12 miles from Mountain Home, the nearest shipping point.

Other Concerns Active Three other concerns are active in the Little Valley region, one being a group of Reno, Nevada, investors.

Another concern is the Intermountain Mining company, which has been organized by a Miss Fremont with whom C. A. Brewster and C. H. Chaney were at one time associated.

Blake Investors were presented in the negotiations with the Intermountain company by Herman Strubbe of Butte, and before reaching a final agreement an investigation of the property was made for the Blake investors by A. J. Miller of Butte, metallurgist and mining engineer, who had just returned from investigation of mining prospects in Mexico.

Mr. Strubbe left Wednesday evening, returning to Butte on an extensive call in the Northwest region to make other mining investigations.

The Intermountain company, it was understood, is perfecting a device for reclaiming placer gold in Snake river sands and is arranging to begin operations on an extensive scale in the near future in the region of Grand View.

Stockholders of the Intermountain Mining company are Charles G. Warren, Harry Selfridge, Walter Clark, Ed Page, E. V. Larson and M. G. Warren of Butte.

The city council has adopted the view that the library board is qualified to execute its own contracts and has refused to consider the same in an advisory capacity, which Brewster says is "void" last Monday to cancel the library lease at the same time as he filed the lease contract, which was obtained from the Elks lodge by Mrs. H. Eureka Company Representative Live Announces Purpose to Begin Exploration Here.

### DEATH BY BOILER ROCK CREEK WATERS

#### Evidence Gathered by Local Officers and Portland Police Agree in Conclusion That Oregon Man Perished Here.

Identification of the man whose body was taken from shallow water near here last night day was established by Twin Falls city and county officers in conjunction with Portland, Ore. police. It was announced Thursday at the sheriff's office here. The dead man had been identified as Paulson of Bend, Oregon, a native of Sweden, and a resident of the northwestern states since 1911. He had no relatives in this country and was married at the time a passport was issued to him in San Francisco.

Paulson's death has not been determined, and P. J. Crowsan, Twin Falls county coroner, has an inquest set for Tuesday afternoon. The coroner's report, written in a note that was found in Paulson's coat near where the body was taken out of the water, reported an existence of suicidal intent on Paulson's part. This note turned the investigation to Portland. It was written in Swedish on the back of a letter that had been written in Norwegian by Ole Eng and addressed to Paulson in Portland.

Attempt made by local officers to locate Eng has been fruitless. Photograph comes to light. Identification of the dead man was announced by local officers to be Paulson, a native of Sweden, in a letter from the Portland police chief's office in regard to the case of Paulson, taken from the water near here last night. The letter said:

"Replying to your wires of the 20th inst. and with reference to John Paulson, deceased, now in your city, our office is advised that Paulson resided at the Hotel Medford in this city April 19, and on the 20th his friends, Ole Eng and another, returned with Paulson and left for Seattle the following day. A few days later Eng returned from Seattle and with another both Paulson and Eng left for Klamath Falls, Oregon, to seek employment. Paulson leaving on the back robe trunk at the Hotel Medford with a large charge of it against it.

"In the investigation we find that Paulson had no identification papers as he was an unidentified body in your city, and hence, Oregon, his residence so far as we are able to ascertain is shown by a passport issued by the Swedish consulate in San Francisco, California, which bears the name of Paulson as well as the signature of John Paulson, who is known as Johan Wilhelm Paulson in Sweden and later known as Paulson in this country and states that he is not married.

"We also have in our possession his declaration of intention filed in the United States district court for the district of Idaho, February 3, 1919, which shows that Paulson arrived in this country from Sweden by the Spokane National or International railway, and going to East Port, Idaho, on February 13, 1918. He declared at the time of making his declaration as Swedish, 33 years old, 5 feet tall, 165 pounds, light brown hair, blue eyes, and his birthplace and date Sweden, March 6, 1885."

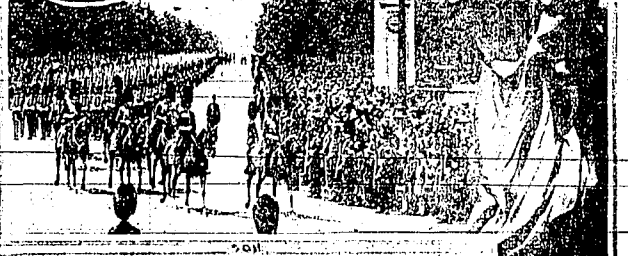

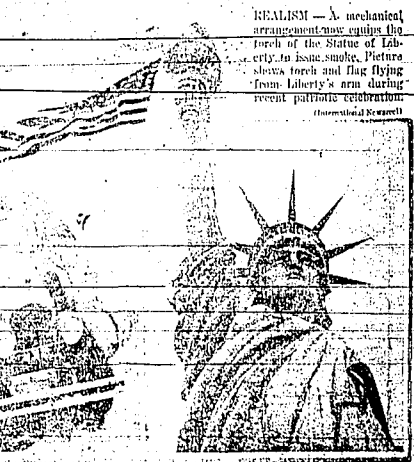
