JAPANESE DELEGATES AWAIT INSTRUCTIONS FOR ACTION AT MEET

Oriental Representatives Believe British Proposals to Discuss Capital Ships Possess Merit of Less Expense.

(By The Associated Press) GENEVA, June 27.—Suddenly taking a new angle the 17-nation naval conference was faced by a new situation tonight when the Japanese delegation with considerable calmness announced that since the British proposed to discuss capital ships appeared to possess the merit of promising diminished naval expenditure, the delegation had called Tokyo asking for new instructions.

Will Not Propose Security Treaty

Virtually the entire Japanese delegation, headed by Admiral Gato, ceremoniously filed into the hall where the newspaper men had been requested to meet them. After the distribution of a long statement on the Japanese general attitude in the conference, the Japanese delegate in a speech announced in addition to explaining the statement in the "three notes" declined to discuss a question concerning the probability of a three power security pact that so far as Japan was concerned there was no idea of proposing any security treaty.

Sympathetic in British Reply

Viscount Jellicoe's remarks were of a tender to give the British impression that the Japanese desire in a sympathetic now to the distinct idea of discussing at Geneva some fundamental features of the Washington treaty—plans which was opposed vigorously hitherto by the American delegation. Viscount Jellicoe emphasized that the Japanese are willing to discuss and study any suggestion or proposal relating to national economy and alleviation of the burden of the tax payer made at such conferences. He outlined the scope of their instructions.
