SPUD HURLER BLANKS BRUINS WITH NO HIT NO RUN GAME

Newbill Pitches Perfect Game; Robs Sell of Additional Glory When He Drops Rosenberg's Liner; Hurst Works Well.

The Idaho Falls Spuds won the opening game of the series here from the Bruins yesterday afternoon, 4 to 0, in a thrilling contest featured by Newbill's stellar hurling. He pitched what is believed to be the first no hit, no run game to be recorded in the annals of the Utah-Idaho league, and Bruin batters faced him in regular order, going down one, two, three with the single exception of the second inning when Rosenberg lined to Newbill and dropped the ball, debasing the play enough to make Roy safe at first. The next three men went down in regular order and Bruin batters died at first.

Hurst pitched his wits scattered except in the second inning when a single by Coleman, a three base hit by Thompson, and a double by Tadevich tied the visitors two runs. They scored again in the fifth when Newbill singled, Hutton doubled, and Collins scored Newbill on his long fourth sacrifice fly to right field. The fourth score was the result of a single by Hutton who was promptly sacrificed to second by Collins and scored to win the game.

Snappy Game

Both clubs played snappy ball, and the game was over in the fourth and 26 minutes, a record for the local ball. The Bruins were particularly on their feet and they again distinguished themselves by robbing Callahan of a two-base hit with a sensational catch after a long run deep into left center field.

The Bruins' double-play combination was working well again yesterday and retired the side with a double play in the sixth inning after Cronin hit safely to field. They had another opportunity in the ninth when Newbill hit to Pfahler with Callahan on first. The hit went deep back of first base and Newbill proved too fast, being safe at first on the throw from Rosenberg to Gardiner.

Fans Impressed

Local fans were impressed with the improvement the Bruins showed and, although they didn't win the game, fans were pleased with the way in which they handled their chances. When the Bruins left Salt Lake they were impressed at the warm manner with which O'Neill turned them back from the plate, but Newbill seemed to have it on the Salt Lake ace, leaving the Bruins with a profound respect for his ability.

Today's game is called for 8 o'clock and Farrell will probably pitch for the Bruins. His control was bad when he faced the Spuds at Idaho Falls, but they were unable to bunch their hits against him. With fair pitching, the Bruins playing like they are now, will give any club a run for their money and the Spuds have but one Newbill.

BORAH ISSUES CALL TO NATION FOR AID IN TASKS AT HOME

Idaho Senator More Interested in Efforts in United States Than in Aid to Nations of Europe at the Present Time.

(By The Associated Press) DENVER, June 28.—A call to the government and the nation to turn their attention and effort to reconstruction at home rather than in Europe was made here tonight by Senator Borah, republican, Idaho.

Speaking at the twenty-third annual convention of the international advertising association, the chairman of the senate foreign relations committee said he was more interested in placing the Mississippi flood to the west back in their homes, in the construction of the Great Lakes-to-the-sea waterway and the harnessing of the Colorado river than he was "in the detestful effort to aid Europe."

Referring specifically to recent over production of oil and to the Mississippi flood, Senator Borah said it was clear that the nation should turn its attention to working out an "intelligent and permanent national policy to conserve, for the use of all, the marvelous natural wealth, with which the country had been endowed."

Senator Borah declared the concentration of part of the aid to the European countries and the loaning of American billions to Europe served but little in reconstruction here.

"We are not helping the people of Europe but the war makers of Europe," he declared. "The history of Europe during the past 30 days has in its every element of strife which preceded the war."

The premier of Italy in a public speech declares that he is on the way to creating an army of 500,000 men, to the building of a great navy and to the reconstruction of an air force second to none in the world.

The break between Great Britain and Russia, the assassination of the Russian minister in Poland, the execution in Russia have made Europe mentally and spiritually an armed camp. Last Sunday in the premier of France at Lunenburg declared a public address stepped in Britain

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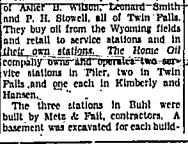

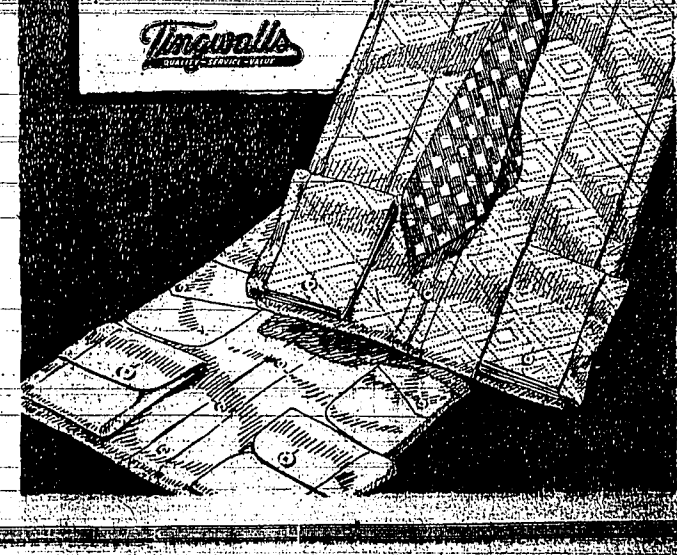

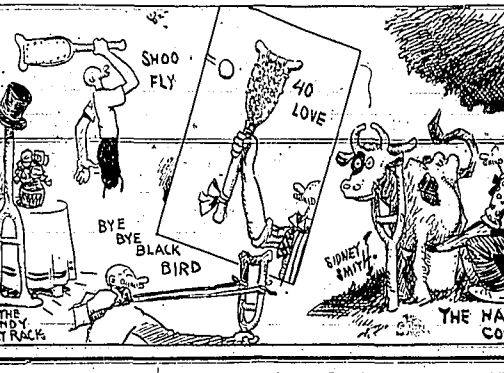
