**WATERFALLS OWNER RETURNS FOR VISIT**

F. J. Adams of Omaha, Holder of Title to Shoshone Falls, Tells Hopes for Its Use.

F. J. Adams of Omaha, owner of Shoshone Falls under title transferred in 1883 by G. E. Wainwright of Twin Falls to the late Senator W. A. Clark and associates, arrived Saturday on a few days visit to Twin Falls. It is his first visit here since September, 1925, when he and Mrs. Adams spent some time in this region. Mrs. Adams is a daughter of the late L. S. Stone of Omaha, one of Senator Clark's associates in the deal for the falls.

The deed held by Mr. Adams covers 182 acres including both sides of the river at the falls and extending up stream for about a half mile. Mr. Adams stated last evening that he has no plans for improvement of the property. It is too big a proposition for one individual.

It is his hope that eventually the state or a quasi-public organization may take over the property for the benefit of the public.

This might be done, Mr. Adams suggested, by an association of individuals such as was formed 13 years ago to acquire a tract of wooded hill land on the Missouri river close to Omaha, that is being preserved by the association in its natural state and as a bird-haven—an organization which was formed for this purpose and which is the Pontiac-People Forest association, which received its charter from the state in 1913. It collected and expended \$50,000 for the tract and acquired adjoining lands by gift or purchase. Its purpose is to maintain the tract for the benefit and enjoyment of the public. The tract is about the same distance from the center of Omaha as is Shoshone Falls from Twin Falls. Mr. Adams is vice president of the Pontiac-People association.

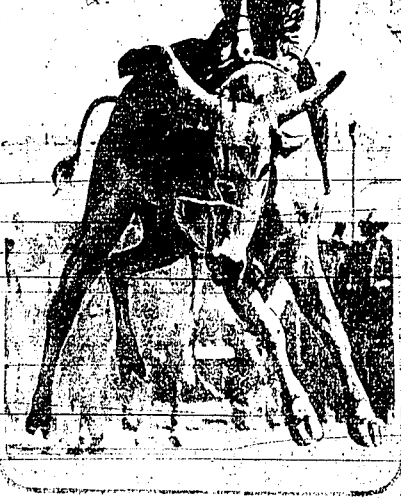

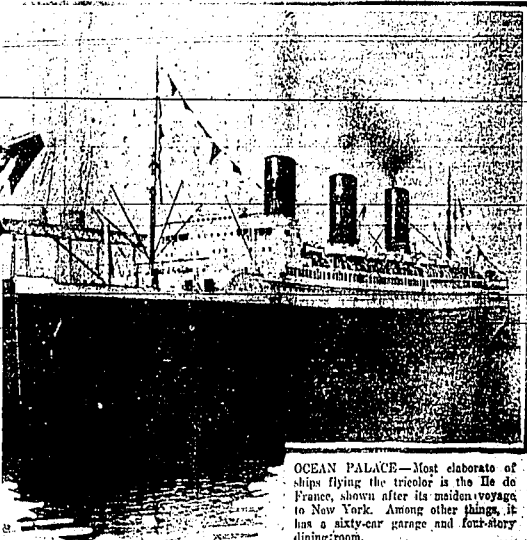

**BABSON WILL TOUR PACIFIC NORTHWEST TO GAIN NEW FACTS**

Famous Eastern Statistician Discusses Weather Conditions in Middle Western States; Is Journeying Westward.

(Special to The News)  
OMAHA, Neb., July 9.—Homer W. Babson is again in the Central West on his way to the Pacific Coast. In May, Mr. Babson toured the States from Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Missouri and all of the Southern States returning to Massachusetts the middle of June. He is starting West again on his way to the Pacific Coast. He will return through Washington, Idaho, Montana, South Dakota, and Minnesota. In this week's interview, Mr. Babson discusses from first-hand observation the weather situation throughout this great agricultural area of the United States.

**Importance of Weather**  
"Business men and investors make a great mistake in thinking that bank clearings, railroad earnings, foreign trade, and other so-called business barometers have anything to do with making business good or bad. Such statistics merely register the condition of business for the time being. The factors represented by these statistics have no more to do with making business good or bad than a thermometer has in making weather hot or cold."

"This brings up the question—'What does cause business to change up and down?' The answer is that business varies in accordance with changes in the desires of people and that climate, health and intelligence are the three greatest factors in changing and developing the desires of the people. Furthermore, climate is even a factor in the development of the health, religion, and intelligence of a nation. Hence the great importance of climate. However, in discussing climate today, I will not further comment on this great, fundamental significance of climate over a series of generations; but rather confine myself to its direct effects from year to year on the nation's prosperity. In other words, I'll discuss the weather conditions of the United States for the past six months and the effect of the same on business and investments."

"First let me say that for some years certain of the weather experts have been forecasting that 1927 or 1928 would be the coldest year that this country has witnessed for at least fifty years and perhaps one hundred. It is true that W. S. Woodcock (Brazil) did not coincide with this question; but many responsible meteorologists did. This prediction was based on the assumption that certain sun spots are affecting the sun's radiation which cools currents below normal and which ocean currents materially affect the winds which sweep over the land. 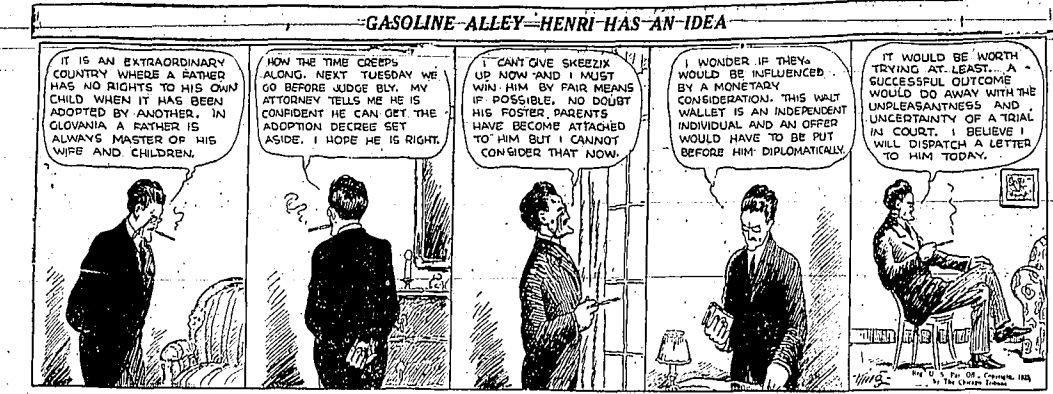

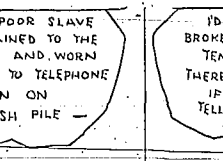

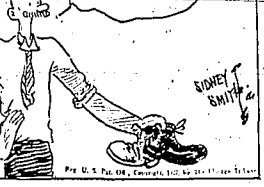

Value of Little Fishes Has Fallen So Low That Discouraged Fishermen Threaten Strike.

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 9. (By wire.) The price of sardines in France has fallen so low that the discouraged fishermen and cannery workers of Brittany, the principal source of sardines, are threatening a strike.

For more reasons than one Brittany might be called the Ireland of France, says the bulletin. The Bretons are the same in their feelings, and the same tendency, on occasion, to emotional outbursts. For centuries, they have had the same antagonism toward outside rule that has long animated the Irish.

Today Brittany has no political existence, and is not even represented on any map. It occupies the extreme west of the French 'teapot', the westernmost peninsula of France, the northern coast of which forms the southern part of the English channel.

The sardines are taken in nets to the beaches of which they are caught by their gills. It is necessary, however, to use large quantities of bait, salted cod fish. Each year 150,000 tons of sardines are taken in the Brittany waters.

Germany has had to send a large quantity of sardines to the United States in payment of her war debts. This fact was not known until recently.
