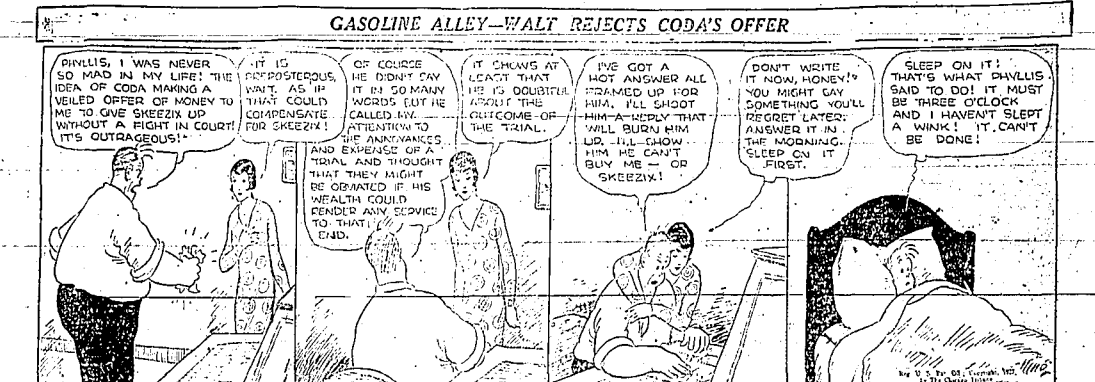

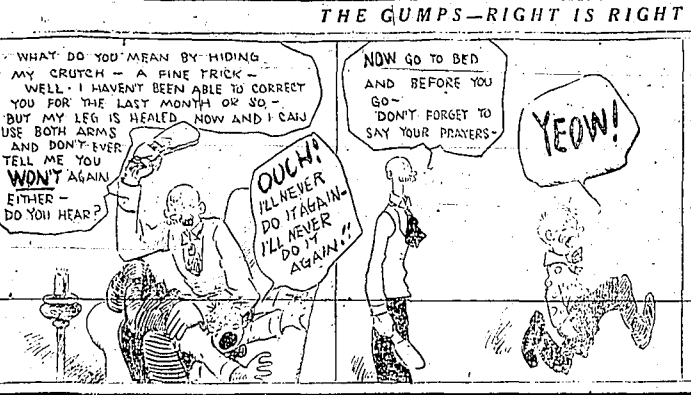

COUNCIL LAUNCHES \$17,000 PROGRAM OF STREET BETTERMENT

Adopts Resolutions, Declaring Intention to Create Seven New Districts to Bridge Gaps in Local Thoroughfares.

Twin Falls city council launched a \$17,000 street improvement program last evening when it adopted resolutions setting forth intention to create seven local improvement districts.

In each of the proposed districts more than 25 per cent of the property owners affected have signed petitions requesting the proposed improvement, and three petitions have been received by the council at intervals since early last fall.

The program provides for use of 625 cubic yards of gravel for surfacing of 700 feet of street 20 feet wide, and 3574 feet of street 30 feet wide. Cost of the gravel is estimated at \$18,457.

The council fixed next July 30 as the date for the beginning of the program.

At the present time the city is preparing the first district for the proposed improvement district under municipal law, and will issue a notice of the council's intention in this regard to be given to all property owners affected.

On Improvement List Streets to be graded under the program are:

1. Walnut street from Fourth avenue to Sixth street, 150 feet wide, total cost, \$2900.00; per linear foot, \$19.33 cents.
2. Third street north from Main avenue to Sixth street, 150 feet wide, total cost, \$2900.00; per linear foot, \$19.33 cents.
3. Fourth avenue west from Second street west to Washington street and Fourth and Sixth streets west between Third and Fourth avenues west, 274 feet wide and 500 feet 40 cent per linear foot, \$1465.40; per linear foot, \$5.35 cents.
4. Fourth street east from Fifth avenue to Sixth avenue east, 274 feet long, 30 feet wide, total cost, \$4081; per linear foot, \$14.90 cents.
5. Fifth avenue east from Third street east to Elm street, 1400 feet, from Third street to Blue Lakes boulevard, 400 feet wide and 62 feet from Blue Lakes boulevard to Elm street, 20 feet wide, total cost, \$2561.17; per linear foot, \$12.81 cents.
6. Seventh avenue east from Ash to Locust street, 272 feet, 30 feet wide, total cost \$1691; per linear foot, \$6.22 cents.
7. Ninth avenue east from Blue Lakes boulevard to Locust street, 274 feet, 30 feet wide, total cost, \$4081; per linear foot, \$14.90 cents.
