#### Moment Fast Approaching When Solution Must Be Discovered or Delegates Must Separate to Reconsider Big Problems.

GENEVA, July 13.—The important final conference of the League of Nations which has achieved nothing definite on the grave issue revolving about reparations, presumably the moment is fast approaching when either some solution must be discovered or the delegates must separate to permit further negotiations. Nevertheless, a plan of action has been evolved for their meeting tomorrow afternoon to permit an assumption of the situation so as it has gone.

#### Have Gone Over Problem

The principal debate was again over the same problem in the same atmosphere so often that today it was decided to postpone the debate until Monday, Germany. The hope is expressed that the new arrangement would improve the situation.

### OUTLOOK GOOD FOR FOOTBALL SEASON

#### Twin Falls High School Mentors Tells of Summer Work of Candidates for Team.

#### Life Problem Solved

With all these boys out of town and working in the open the coach expects that his biggest problem of early conditioning has practically been solved. The boys are all provided with footballs and other athletic paraphernalia, and put in their spare time practicing kicking and passing, in anticipation of the season which will open before long.

Plans to send Lincoln were abandoned again this year, making the 17th time

in five years that the plan has come up and been postponed. A number of parents have refused to permit their boys to take part in football because of the dirt and dust they are forced to get every evening on the field and the coach had hoped that a plan could be evolved, whereby the field could be covered before the game. The plan was intended to be carried out for a number of years, but at least four games will be played here. The schedule includes games with Pocatello, Boise, Albion Normal, Gooding, and Rupert away from home, and Burley, Piler, Bonna and Idaho Falls, at home. The Nampa game will be played here Saturday day, and it is hoped to have the Idaho Falls game here on Thanksgiving day. No game has yet been scheduled with Huhl, but a game may be arranged with their later.

NERVOUS UNDERTONE

Wheat Prices Rally at Close, Although Averaging Lower Most of Time Previous.

CHICAGO, July 13.—Wheat prices rallied at the last today, although averaging lower most of the previous week. Relative strength of the Winnipeg market tended to counterbalance uncertainty in some quarters, restoring black market possibilities over Canadian wheat.

Chicago wheat closed irregularly but we decline to be advanced, prices fell to be up, and showing to be the gain and possibly varying from 7c to 10c to a rise of 10c.

Although weather conditions north west were favorable, which would crop observers were inclined to be optimistic in regard to domestic supply, wheat market has a nervous undertone. There was a realization that there is yet to be considerable damage from black rust, especially in Kansas, and that the Canadian crop is very late, so much so as to increase sharply the dangers of early frost.

Headline Influence.—Announcement that Kansas City has 100,000 bushels of each wheat to be consigned, making 2,000,000 bushels so far this week, acted somewhat as a bear influence here. On the other hand, premiums at the Gulf of Mexico were firm with offering limited and the over September being bid for deliveries in the last half of August and the first half of August. Private estimates were current placing the crop at 1,200,000,000 bushels, optimum being rather general that the government figures on Kansas appeared a little too high.

Drought reports from parts of Iowa, Missouri and Kansas tended to rally the corn market from the decline due to better weather elsewhere. Oats reflected fear of damage by excessive heat in some sections.

Provisions were governed largely by action of the corn market, as well as the course of log values.

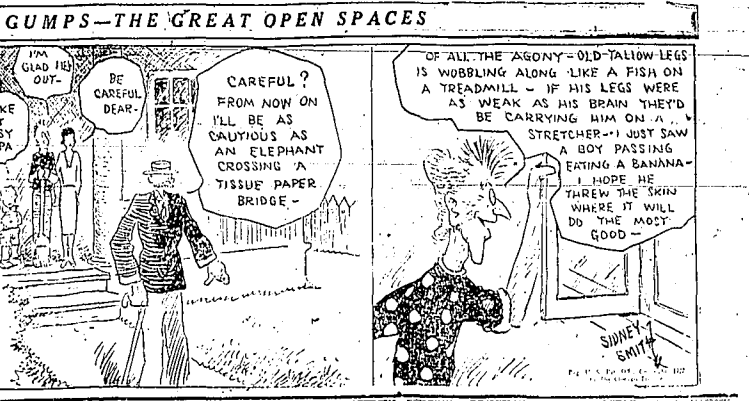
