AMERICAN POLICIES COME FOR BITTER ATTACK AT MEETING

Monroe Doctrine and Attitude of United States Subjects of Stormy Debate at Labor Conference; Green Defends Stand

WASHINGTON, July 22.—Further bitter attacks on the Latin-American policies of the United States in general and the Monroe doctrine in particular developed in today's meeting of the fifth-pan-American labor congress and culminated in a "defense" of the Monroe doctrine by the president, chairman of the American delegation.

Quinta Monro Debate Mr. Green's speech served to quiet a stormy debate, during which Ricardo A. Martinez of Venezuela, denouncing the Monroe doctrine as a "policy of fear" and "a policy of aggression," charged that Panama had been "stolen from Colombia."

Defends Doctrine Rising to his feet in defense of the doctrine, Chairman Green described it as "the heart of the United States and American policy of the United States of America and is unanimously approved and accepted by the people of the United States."

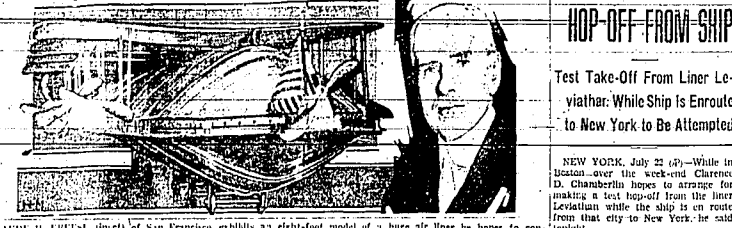

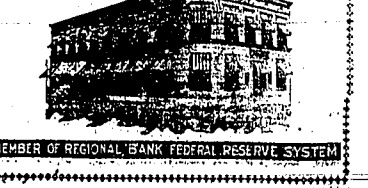

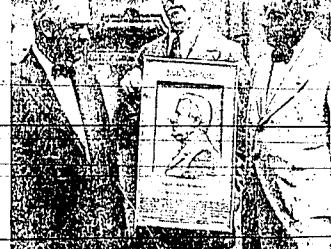

DAMAGE BY RUST IS SIGNAL FOR BUYING

Rising Prices in Wheat Market Encounters Heavy Selling at Times; Corn Tendency Higher

CHICAGO, July 22 (AP)—The persistent damage by black rust, especially in Canada, unless weather conditions improve, brought about buying and higher prices in the wheat market today. Closing quotations for wheat were firm, 2 1/2 to 1 1/2 cent unchanged to 1/2 cent better, and provisions 5 to 10 cents higher.

Encounter Heavy Selling. Rising prices in the wheat market encountered heavy selling at times, but the black rust reports were given a break, and the market was characterized and covered a heavy history that has formed the rule of late. A break of black rust coming from southern Minnesota on the Canadian border, and the weather in Dakota into Canada. Only the weather of the last few days, the report said, can determine the situation.

Wheat to Offer Influence. Wheat to offer influence on the market, delivery on July contracts failed to 1/2 cent. The influence of black rust, and other bullish factors, such as a report of 100,000 bushels of wheat being the largest amount to date in wheat, were also influential factors. There were also bullish factors that Europe this season would make little if any more wheat than the first crop of last year. Besides, the situation threatened to become grave.

Provisions Lacked Support. Cooler weather unfavorable for corn growth gave independent strength to the corn market. There was also talk that supplies of corn available to shippers in territory east of Chicago are all cleaned up. Offerings of wheat tended to check price gains in the oats market.
