FLIER ESCAPES WITH LIFE AFTER STAGING SPECTACULAR BATTLE

Carlton C. Champion, Jr., Naval Aviator Struggles With Death Above National Capital; Record May Be Shattered

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, July 25—Seeking to shatter the airplane altitude record set by Carlotta E. Chapman, Jr. of the navy, had a spectacular battle for his life high above Washington today as he brought his plane to a disheartened and stinging engine.

Champion, who holds the altitude record for airplanes, reported to the judges that his airplane was in perfect, but a preliminary reading of the machine's damaged barograph at the end of standard 10 officials there to say that the highest mark they had found indicated an altitude of 39,000 feet. It was emphasized, however, that this reading was by no means final and that a definite announcement must be withheld for several days.

Freeman fields record. The recognized world record for airplane altitude is held by a French aviator, Captain, who climbed to 40,200 feet last August.

Taking off from the Anacostia naval station near here in the early morning, Champion had climbed with his plane for 40 minutes when two of the cylinder heads of his Wasp air-cooled motor blew out. Apparently one of the flying pieces knocked the oxygen tube from Champion's mouth as he said that he was unconscious at the moment he fell to the plane then it is unable to say, but when he regained consciousness he was lying on his back with the oxygen tube just above him. He placed it in his mouth and then got his plane under control.

Engine catches fire. Meantime, the engine caught on fire, but a violent side aft followed by a fire was successful in putting the fire out. At that time the altimeter indicated a height of 20,000 feet. The engine, continuing to operate, was caught on fire three additional times before the plane, a Wright Apache, finished a flight of 20 minutes on a course near the Anacostia station.

An examination of the machine, Champion showed that the engine leaders had pistons and connecting rods were missing. One of the two pistons was damaged by being hit by flying parts of the engine while the other was so badly damaged that an aviator said it probably would be worthless.

Champion's landing was described by the dispatches as "a most magnificent feat with no injury to either pilot or plane."

NEW YORK OIL MAN CRITICIZES MEXICANS

Southern Republic Bent on Consolidating American Property, Says Director of Association.

DURHAM, N. H., July 25 (AP)—Stevens of New York, director of the association of producers of petroleum in Mexico, today said that the new government is bent on consolidating American property.

Stevens discussed the problem of "understanding the Mexican situation," in an address before the conference on Latin-American relations of the United States and the University of New Hampshire.

"It is the facts of the Mexican situation," he said, "that the United States has been flooded with pro-Mexican government propaganda, and that it is necessary or deliberate distortion is the outstanding characteristic."

Asserting that the government of Mexico is not a government by the people, but by persons who manage themselves into control of the army, and citing instances to show that the Mexican courts are not independent of the government, Mr. Stevens warned Americans not to try to understand Mexico in terms of the United States.

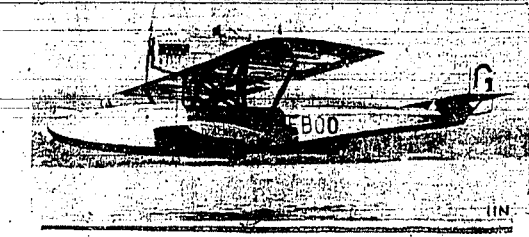
