HE SEEKS HISTORIC DATA ABOUT KETCHUM

E. N. Ebbe Desires to Know How Famous Old Wood River Camp Obtained Its Name.

In the interests of Idaho history, E. N. Ebbe, manager of Ketchum's Camp Hotel, is seeking to learn something more of Dave Ketchum, after whom the town was named and how it happened to be named for him.

Veteran Parker recalled Mr. Ebbe has recently written letters to a number of the pioneer residents of that region and among the answers he received is one from Charles G. Adams of Boise, who writes in part: "I was personally acquainted with Dave Ketchum, having first met him 47 years ago at Ketchum. I think I was on Dead Man's Flat. The last time I saw him I was on upper Wood River, opposite what is known as 'Hans' John's ranch. I do not recall having seen him since that time. On hearing he stated he was a successful Arizona prospector, I have never heard from him after his leaving that section."

Mr. Ketchum was a man of limited education and though shrewd in a way never succeeded in amassing much in the way of wealth.

From Redding, Shasta county, California, James Lee Homan, a prominent real estate agent in that district, contributes some interesting data on his history in the "entireties" of "Ketchum," which he writes: "I can give you but little information about Dave Ketchum, though he was known to me in the early part of Idaho during the latter '40s. There, he was spoken of as one of the outstanding characters of the country on the Snake river."

"I was not through much in contact with him except in a business way, but my impression of him was that of being a tall, slim, wiry man with long whiskers, as was the style among most of the men there. He had a kindly disposition, but without not to take liberties with."

"About the middle of May, 1880, was my first meeting with Dave. This was the year of the rush to get into Wood river and the Snake river valley. Salmon river. I went in with the outfit of Wilson and Belden. They came in from Blackfoot with a train of wagons loaded with merchandise to block a store at Sawtooth. Also tools for the Pligrim mine which 'Colonel' Edwin Green had bought the year previous."

"The road ended at Bellevue at that time, and there, in the city with all the usual trimmings of a boom town, with excited people arriving at the hotel and the general hubbub of preparing to go into the mountains. After about a week's wait, Dave Ketchum came in with his pack train and moved us as far as the store was allowed, and left about half way up the mountain between Galena and Salmon river. Dave had the job of about two or three weeks later, a path having been shoveled through about a mile of timber."

"I was Experienced Packer "I met Dave several times but know nothing about his history. An of the impression that he came from the vicinity of Boise. He was recognized as a mountaineer and experienced pack train man so he must have been engaged in that business some time previous. I would say that he was about 40 at that time."

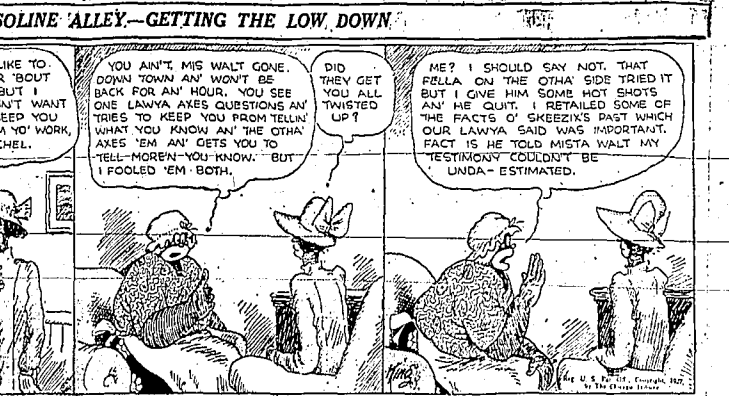
"There was no Halley at that time, and, I believe, Dave's cabin was about 10 miles inland at Ketchum. In 1880-82 there was a cabin or two at what was known as Galena, several miles up Wood river from Ketchum. I do not know what happened. In 1882 a wagon road was constructed, extending into Sawtooth, and goods were brought in on wagons. Pack trains were then out of business along points reached by the road."

"Dave may have left for newly discovered fields, but my impression is that he was still on Wood river in 1882 when I came out in November."

A paragraph about Ketchum in French's history of Idaho says: "The townsite was laid out on government land and under the old congressional act known as the 'ten dollar lot.' It provided for the plating of towns and allowing to each prospector a route to two lots at a minimum price of 40 cents. The Ketchum lots were larger and sold at 75 cents each."

"In 1884 the town had a population of 2000. It soon had three churches, a public school building, three banks, about 100 business places, a weekly and daily newspapers. It was the terminus of the branch road running out from Shoshone. After the removal of the county seat from Rocks Bar came up, Ketchum was considered the logical point and the place where to locate the plumb. Halley was not considered at that time, but the Oregon Short Line, active in the district, started a silent movement and Halley won the county seat by a large majority. Nothing is stated in the history about the man for whom Ketchum was named or how the town happened to be named for him and Mr. Ebbe announces he intends to continue his quest."

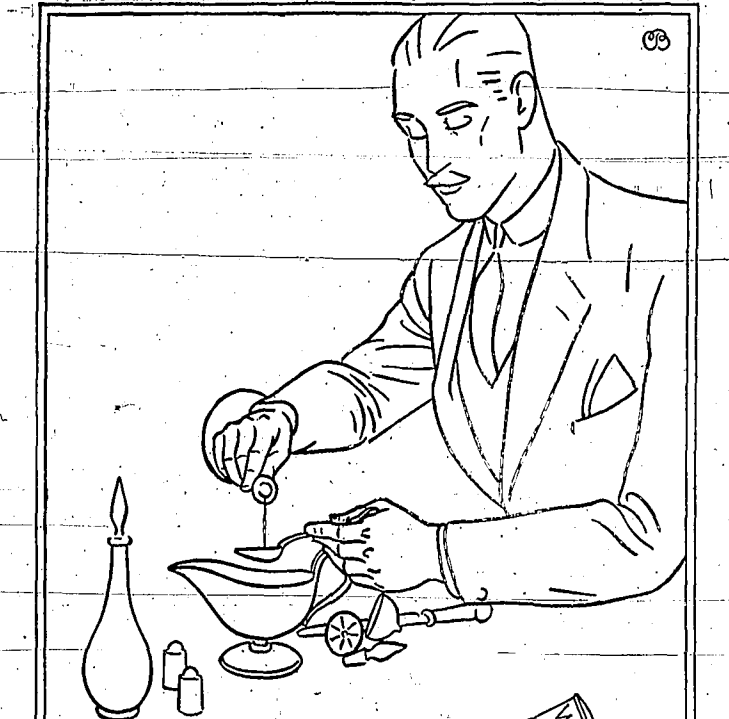

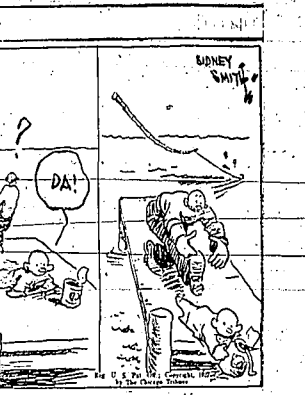
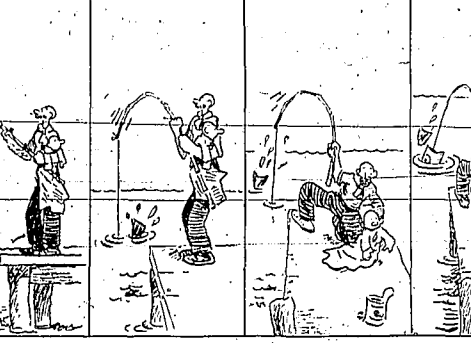
