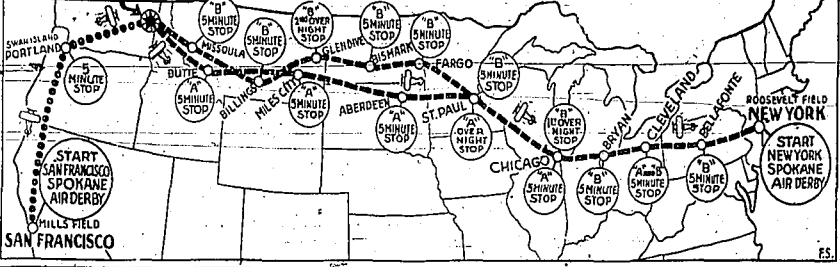

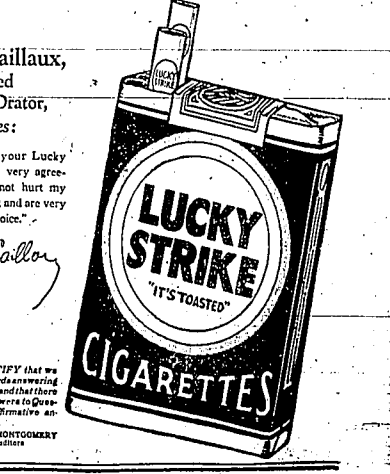

Visitors Express Surprise at Class of Cows and Sires Owned in County; Tour May Result in Spring Show

A spring Jersey cattle show at Twin Falls county to which the whole state will be invited is likely to be the outcome of a Jersey tour taken here Monday by Jersey breeders of the district and a number of visitors from outside points.

prices are advancing. There are not as many dairy cows per capita in the United States as there was a few years ago. The public is demanding more quality milk and Jersey cows are popular in the west because of their ability to produce more milk per acre than the other breeds. Los Angeles and the bay states of California are coming to the northwest to buy their cows. There is plenty of money in the dairy business if the right methods are used.

Herbert C. Myers of Boise, president of the Idaho State Jersey Cattle club, next introduced "Agriculturally," he said, "the Twin Falls herd is the finest district in the world and the crops it has raised this trip are a revelation to me. I am surprised, however, to find that only two herds that we have visited thus far are in the testing association. It seems such an association in itself. The venture is sponsored by a small group of Dallas business men in cooperation with The Dallas News and The Dallas Journal, and the accompanying publicity will be given by the newspaper of the city of Dallas.
