COMBINED REAPER AND THRESHER USED IN WHEAT FIELDS

New Eastern Type Combine Costing Approximately \$1000 Reduces Grain Loss to Great Extent; Capacity Greater.

NEW EASTERN TYPE IS REDUCING LOSSES

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13.—When harvested "crispness" vitiates the process of retaining and threshing, an expert to make a definite and practical appearance in the east next year. H. R. Tully, federal farm manager, said today, predicts ultimate use of the new eastern type combine in Pennsylvania, the Shenandoah valley, Delaware and Maryland. His view is based on successful tests conducted at Blacksburg, Virginia, this season, the first to be used in the east since its introduction of the first Pacific coast states eight years ago.

Ten Foot Bar "The new eastern type," Tully says, "likely will concentrate on a ten-foot cutting bar and utilize the power take-off principle, by which most of the motive energy for the grain separator is taken directly from the tractor. The entire machine is mounted on a tractor whose drawbar rating is 15 horsepower or less."

It is an improvement on farm tractors. Tully figures that if as much as 100 acres of wheat is to be harvested, it is not a good idea to use a tractor and combine. It is better to use a tractor with a binder and later a "threshing rig" to complete the operation.

"Regular topography of eastern fields," he says, "is no serious handicap. The new combine are equipped with leveling devices, which level the reel, platform and separator to level, steep hillsides. The only drawback is the fact that soft wheat of the east contains high percentages of moisture, not infrequently as much as 20 percent. A 10 or 12 percent moisture is all over that subjects stored grain to dangerous heating."

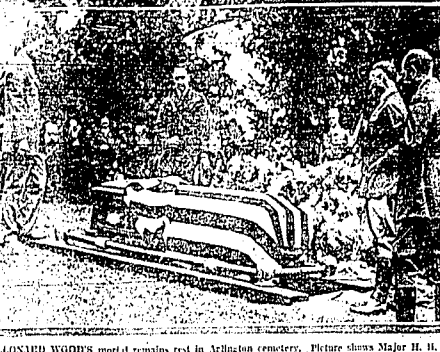
Drying Process "At Blacksburg," he continues, "it was found necessary, after harvesting with a combine, to spread the wheat on a barn floor to dry. The east has no practical method of drying its grain, either on the farm or at the elevator. We are developing automatic processes to replace that natural interim between binder reaping and the stationary threshing which heretofore has given soft wheat that is dry."

"The best use of such produce is at least one so important. It grows a hard wheat that usually is dry enough to market at the time of the combine. In 1926 there were 20 combines in Illinois. This year there were approximately 25, and Indiana is reported to have used about 50."

IOWA CO-EDS LEARN HOMEWORKING WAYS

Today's Housewife Must Fight a Single-Handed Battle, Says Dean of Great School.

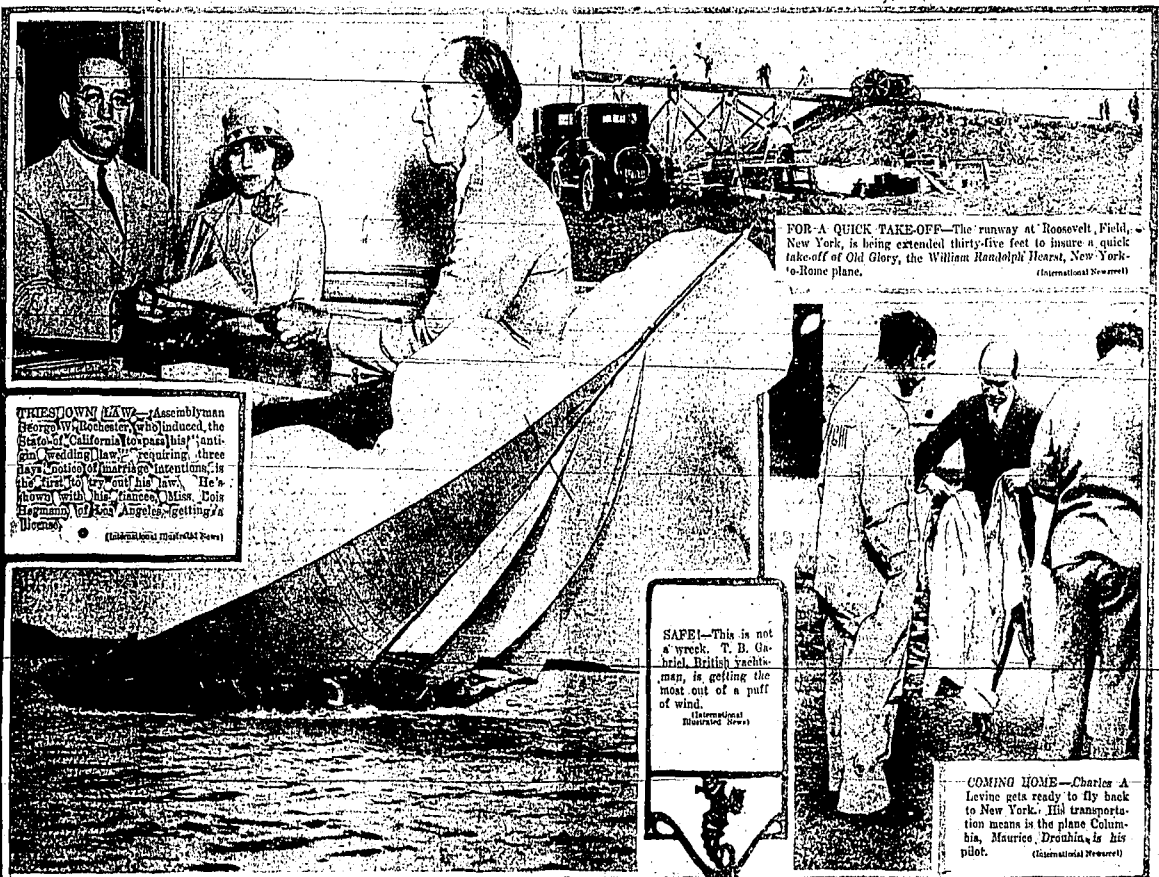

#### More Than 100 Young Men Will Try Luck in Game of Aviation; 200 Enroll as Cadets; Many After Appointments.

PITTSBURGH, Aug. 13 (AP)—More than 100 young men answered aviation army air corps posts throughout the country will try their luck in the great game of aviation.

Two hundred of them are enrolled as cadets to begin a year of training at the Army Air Corps primary flying school at March field, Riverside, California, and Brown field, San Antonio, Texas, or in the balloon and airship school at Scott field, Illinois.

The men returned August 8, the pick of many hundreds who applied for appointments. They come as cadets as it is possible for the air corps officer to judge by mail, to the good requirements of the service and the laws under which it is being expanded in carrying out provisions of the four-year aviation program.

The schools have been in operation several years and have never lacked for recruits, but the number of applicants has been exceptionally large recently. This probably has been due to aviation popularity aroused by the flights of Lindbergh, Chamberlain, Byrd, Matthard and Heisenberger.

Chosen of 100 each begin at the aviation school three times a year, July 1, November 1 and March 1, so applicants who pass the initial examination, but are crowded out, may have another chance. ### CUSTER PICTURE LOST TO CAVALRY SINCE 1893

WASHINGTON, Aug. 13 (AP)—Art and the War Department have a common mystery: What has become of the original of the celebrated painting, "Custer's Last Stand" of "Custer's Last Fight"? Even the correct title is a minor mystery in itself.

The department has been searching for the painting since 1923. It was purchased by the Abbot-Downing Brewing association of St. Louis, copyrighted in 1893, and presented to the Seventh Cavalry's Regiment, U. S. Cavalry. The canvas disappeared in 1903, and seven years of intermittent correspondence and offers of money have failed to disclose what became of it.

Some of the reports indicate that it was painted by H. Steingard. He was responsible for at least one picture of the battle of Little Big Horn, and a number of other artists likewise took that stirring fight as the subject for dramatic paintings. A lithographic copy of the Seventh Cavalry painting which, in 1920, was in the possession of Mrs. R. H. Sheldon, widow of an officer of the Twelfth Cavalry, indicates, however, that the artist was Cassidy Adams.

The picture was hung first in the officers' club of the Seventh Cavalry at Fort Grant, Arizona. Just what happened to it when the Seventh went to Cuba in 1923 has not been determined. Some veterans insist it was taken to Cincinnati Park, Georgia, and others contend it was left at Fort Grant in the post chapel, which later was destroyed by fire. Still another report is that it was forwarded to Fort Riley, Kansas, but no one seems to have any recollection of having seen it there.
