

**SEED VERIFICATION
TO PROTECT GROWERS**

Seed Companies May Issue Certificates of Origin With Each Package of Seed.

BOISE, Aug. 24 (AP)—Under the federal department of agriculture, plan for verification of seed origin, growers and seed companies will be protected alike, John H. Wilson, manager of agricultural commodities today when he returns here from Bozeman, Montana, where the verification plan was evolved.

Seed companies may issue certificates of verification of origin with each package of alfalfa in a sack or when the company keeps its seed in bulk and it is otherwise desired to issue the certificate. The certificates are to be furnished to the grower, and evidence furnished to the district.

This system will not only protect the buyer but will also protect the growers in high altitude areas from blending with inferior seed. The system is explained as follows: The seed blender will build up the package of Idaho seed products.

Although the grower should understand and a company may assume blending, the verification will force companies to fall in line.

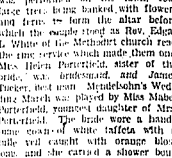

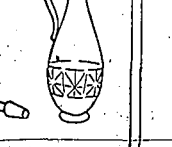

Students Returning to State University to See Much Improvement Under Way

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow, Aug. 24.—(Special To The News) —The fall term opens at the University of Idaho the week of September 12, the week before the opening of school, they will see underway the greatest building and improvement program in the history of the institution. 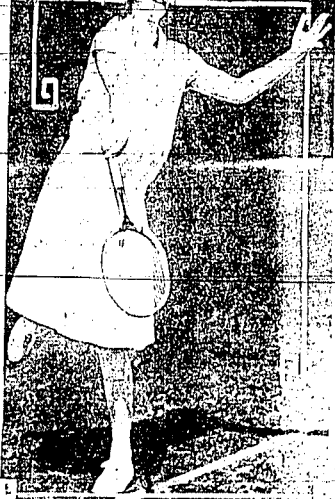

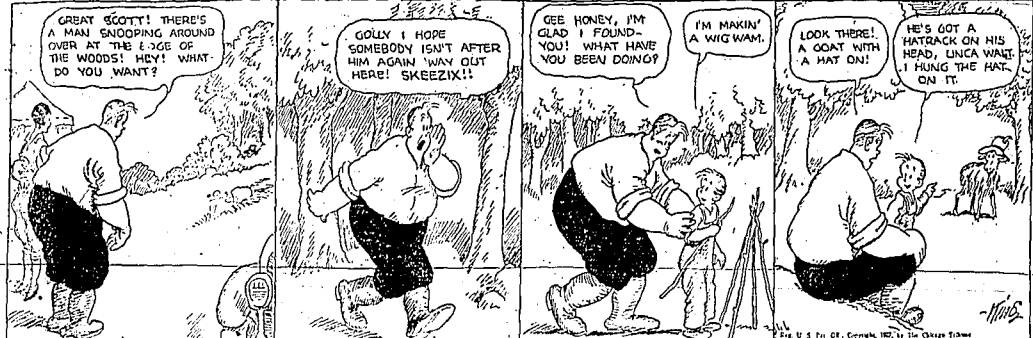

State and Federal Inspectors Inform Growers Regulations Must Be Complied With.

The state and federal regulations relative to seasonal residue will be strictly enforced, apple and pear growers were informed Wednesday by Harry Smith, chief inspector of the Idaho department of agriculture and R. T. Elliott, of Seattle, representative of the federal bureau, who are here visiting orchard growers.

The permissible seasonal residue for domestic use is 925 per cent and for export 20 per cent. Grapes are treated in Oregon— Idaho apples last year than was given to the fruit of any other state. It is said, and the federal and state authorities insist that this high standard be maintained and improved.

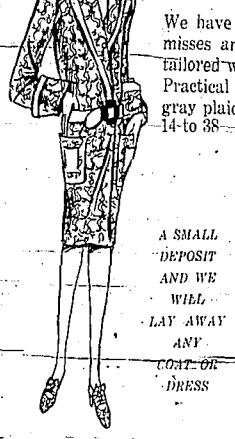
